BUK Holds 7th Conference on Literature in Northern Nig.

iterary scholars and some of the shrewdest critics of African literature from different parts of Nigeria stormed Bayero University for a four – day Conference on Literature in Northern Nigeria.

In his remarks, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Rasheed, mni, MFR said the Conference was part of the collaboration signed between BUK and Kwara State University, Malette.

Prof. Rasheed explained that Universities have for years forgotten to organize a conference on literature. He said in the last two years the University had strived hard to broaden it and involved one of the newest Universities in the North, the Kwara State University, Malette.

The Vice Chancellor expressed satisfaction with the caliber of literary scholars at the conference and commended the staff of the English Department for their unalloyed commitment. Delivering a keynote address entitled, "Literature, History

and Identity: Theories and Perspectives", the Vice Chancellor of KWASU, Professor Abdul-Rasheed Na'Allah, said, "History remains a focal point in identifying the success of many countries," saying prominent writers use history as a major platform for their creativity. "In Nigeria as a whole, despite our rootedness in the oral tradition of the likes of Homer, history and literature have not been given a unique legendary status in our modern lives".

Prof. Na'Allah proposed that critics of any literature reflecting Hausa and most of the Northern Nigeria community needed to understand the dual framework to interpret literary compositions. He cited an example of "Wanda bai ji bari ba, ya ji hoho," meaning whoever wouldn't hear "stop it", would hear "serves you right." The scholar explained that there is obviously some problems in rendering the Hausa cultural theory English. "Stop it," and "serves you right," do not totally translate "bari," and "hoho," respectively.

Presenting a paper entitled "Without a Spare Tyre..." the Interstices of Literature in Northern Nigeria, Professor John Sani Illah of the



Department of Theatre and Film Arts, University of Jos, said "The Task before literature in Northern Nigeria is enormous. Even without a spare tyre, it is managing to limp along. But as history teaches us, no literature can survive without the necessary support structure."

Prominent literary scholars such as Professor Sani Abba Aliyu of ABU Zaria, Prof. Zainab Alkali, Dr. A. H Babajo and Dr. Audi Giwa graced the occasion.

The highlight of the ceremony was the exhibition of historical items by the Sokoto State History and Culture Bureau, which showcased Arabic Caligraphy and Geometrical Presentation, pictures and the history of past Sultans of Sokoto and the collected works of Nana Asma'u. Kwara State University and the Centre for Ilorin Manuscripts and Culture exhibited items like an 85year old pen container and an ink-pot being used since 1954, while the Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Research and Training, AKCDRT, Mambayya House displayed famous Malam Aminu Kano personal cap, hand pen and other book collections.

Professor Shuaib Oba AbdulRaheem, was the Executive Chairman, Federal Character Commission was the Chairman of the occasion.
