"BUK Will Soon Become a World Class Citadel of Learning"

The Vice President (Deputy Vice Chancellor) of Tanta University, Egypt, Professor Mohammed Ahmed Dabaon, said going by the quantum of infrastructural and facilities development now going on at both campuses of Bayero University, he was optimistic that in the next five years the University will become a world class international citadel of learning.

Professor Dabaon who led two other senior academics on a facility visit at both campuses of the University on Tuesday said they were highly impressed with what they saw on the ground, saying that, "It is my belief that in the next two or three years when we will have cause to visit BUK again, we hope to see a different University."

He said the majority of the facilities on the ground in BUK are of international standard. This, he added, made him conclude that "in the next five years

the University will surely join the league of international universities."

The Tanta University Vice President said the visit was also part of the efforts on their part to strengthen the existing relationship with BUK, assuring that Tanta University was ready and willing to assist and cooperate with BUK to boost teaching, learning and research.

He said they were in Kano specifically to inspect facilities at the proposed Northwest University Teaching Hospital preparatory to the commencement of its MBBS programme.

Professor Dabaon thanked the BUK management led by its Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed *mni*, MFR for the confidence they have on Tanta University.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, represented by Professor Hafizu the Abubakar. Director, Centre for Biotechnology Research, took the visitors round some facilities and on-going projects at the two Campuses and told them that management was not surprised by the comments of Professor Dabaon on BUK, saying that the current Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, did lay such a foundation and described him as the "father of modern BUK".

Those on the facility tour along with Professor Hafizu Abubakar were the Bursar; the Librarian, the Dean, Faculty of Agriculture; the Director, General Administration; the Director, Establishment Matters and the Director, Vice Chancellor's Office, who represented the Registrar and other senior academics.

TANTAUNIV.DONATES1,000ASSORTED THESES TO BUK

Tanta University of Egypt is giving Bayero University over 1000 copies of Postgraduate theses on Science, Technology, Arabic and Islamic Studies, in the first stage of a donation scheme that will cover many other disciplines, Dr. Ibrahim Mohammed Head of Department of Islamic Studies has announced.

Speaking at a welcome dinner organized for three visiting staff of Tanta University by BUK, on Sunday 8th December, 2013, at the Tahir Guest Place, Dr. Mohammed commended this cultural exchange and academic collaboration between the two universities, recalling that ancient Kanem-Bornu had also come to the aid of Egypt when Al-Azhar University was closed for 100 years due to political turmoil. Kanem Bornu built an alternative institution at the town of Fustat for the benefit of its students and the Egyptian intellegensia, until normalcy was restored and Al-Azhar reopened, he recalled.

Also speaking at the occasion, the Director of the Center for Biotechnology Research and Chairman of the Northwest University Implementation Committee, Prof. Hafiz Abubakar, said that the quality control at Egyptian Universities, as exemplified by Tanta University, and the level of investment in the education sector in that country were worthy of emulation by Nigeria.

Prof. Hafizu described the \aleph 200 billion ASUU is demanding to be injected into the country's University system over several years as insufficient to build one of the several campuses of Tanta University, around which they were conducted during their visit to the country. He also described the meticulous attention to detail of their quality assurance programme as worthy of emulation, along with the adherence to rules and regulations and respect for authority, no matter at what level such authority is vested.

In his remarks earlier, the Vice Chancellor Prof. Abubakar Adamu Rasheed mni, MFR had described the warm reception they were accorded during their visit and commended the way the administration of Tanta University was structured with three Deputy Vice Chancellors (titled Vice Presidents), one each for Student Affairs and Undergraduate Education; Postgraduate Students and Research: and Environment and Community. He noted that they tied every research to solving the problems of their communities and did not indulge in abstract research with no relevance to advancing their nation forward.

Responding on behalf of the three visiting dons, Prof. Mohammed Ahmed Abdelmohsen Dabaon, the Vice President, Tanta University, Community and Environment explained his deep appreciation to BUK for the reception and for Northwest University for inviting them to advise on the plans for a planned teaching hospital along Dawakin Kudu Road. He explained that the exorbitant cost of American and European consultants challenged Egyptian intellectuals to strive to become self-reliant in knowledge creation and application. The two other scholars with him were Prof. Mohammed Hussain Mahmoud, a Re-enforced Concrete Structures Specialist and Architect Dr. Hosny Ahmed Dewer, Department of Architecture, Faculty of Engineering, Tanta University.

The visiting scholars were scheduled to tour Northwest University, BUK and the Jigawa State University (JSU), Kafin Hausa. Amongst the guests at the dinner were the Vice Chancellor of the Northwest University, Prof. Dato Ahmed Razali Agus, and its Registrar, Alhaji Farouk Yanganau; Jigawa the Chairman of the State Implementation Committee, Prof Haruna Wakili, who is also the Jigawa State Commissioner for Education, Science and Technology; the Registrar of the JSU, Malam M. D. Nasiru; and Barrister A. S. Umar, the Director of the VC's Office, representing the Registrar of BUK; Deans and Directors of Faculties and Centres.
