BUK Revises 2012/2013 Academic Calendar: First Semester Exams Begin 20th January, 2014

Bayero University Management Committee (UMC) during a meeting held on Tuesday 23rd December, 2013, proposed an adjustment to the 2012/2013 academic session calendar to the Senate, which will consider it early in January, 2014.

Under the proposed adjustment to the calendar for the 2012/2013 session, students will be expected back at the University Campuses with effect from 1st January, 2014.

It said lectures will commence on 2nd January, 2014 and end on 18th January, 2014, while first semester examinations will begin on Monday 20th January and end on Saturday, 1st February, 2014.

The adjusted calendar also showed that, second semester lectures will begin from Monday 3rd February, to Saturday 26th April, 2014. Second semester examinations will start on Monday 28th April to Saturday 10th May, 2014, while the session break will last from Sunday 11th May to Sunday 30th June, 2014.

This revised timetable for completing the 2012/2013 session is therefore subject to Senate consideration and approval.

BUK Releases Post UTME Result For 2013/2014

Bayero University has released the results of Post Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examinations (PUTME) conducted on Monday 23rd December, 2013 for the 2013/2014 academic session, showing out of the 7,600 candidates who sat 6,240 passed.

The results were released just 24 hours after the examinations and the applicants received their individual scores via text messages sent to them by the University.

According to the Director, Directorate of Examinations, Admissions and Records (DEAR), Hajiya Fatima Binta Mohammed, the procedure for scoring candidates was based on the calculation of the weighted average of those who scored 160 out of 400 i.e. 40% in PUTME and UTME scores and candidates would be admitted after meeting the set average pass mark.

She said this development has been the practice at all other universities except BUK, but that BUK has also adopted it, as directed by the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).

Shortly after the conduct of the examinations, the Directorate of Examinations, Admissions and Records (DEAR) released a summary of 2013/2014 UTME data, which shows that twelve thousand one hundred and seven (12,107) applicants scored 180 points and above in the UTME/JAMB and out of this number, seven thousand six hundred (7,600) sat for the PUTME conducted by the University, and six thousand, two hundred and fourty (6,240) passed.

Similarly, the Directorate issued a statement of the summary of applicants for the Direct Entry admission. According to the statement, Faculty of Education has the highest number of applicants with 2,932 followed by the Faculty of Social and Management Science (FSMS) with 2,589, while the Faculty of Dentistry has the least number of applicants with only 38.

Cholera Epidemic

The Director, University Health Services has drawn the attention of the University community to a cholera epidemic currently raging in the state. A statement signed on his behalf by Dr. H. I. Kiru, said, cholera is transmitted through personal contact and through consuming contaminated food and water.



To prevent Cholera:

- Wash hands with soap and water before eating, after using the toilet and handling other human wastes.
- Wash all fruits and vegetables with a lot of water, preferably soak vegetables in salt or vinegar solution for at least thirty minutes before eating.
- Avoid eating salads from food vendors and re-heat all foods from the previous day before eating.
- Clean all water containers frequently. If you suspect water contamination boil drinking water for at least ten minutes.
 Keep water containers well covered.
- Keep all food and water away from flies.
- Dispose of all human wastes in toilets, latrines or bury underground.
- If you develop Diarrhoea and vomiting start Oral rehydration therapy (Salt and Sugar Solution) and rush to the nearest Health facility.
- If you come in contact with a person with cholera, wash your hands and feet frequently with soap and water.
- If possible disinfect floors and surfaces with beach like JIK, HYPO, Parazone or Izal, while mopping or wiping.
