BUK Introduces 32 New Programmes

ollowing Senate approval, Bayero University has introduced thirty two new B.Sc and B.A programmes, majority of which are to commence in the next session. Vice academic the Chancellor, **Professor** Abubakar Rasheed, mni, MFR, has said.

The Vice Chancellor said some of these programmes are B.Sc Criminology, Public Admin. International Relations, Banking & Entrepreneurship, Finance, Food Science Technology, Agro-Chemical Engineering, Petroleum Engineering and Mechatronics.

Others are: B.Sc Anatomy, Physiology, Urban & Regional Planning, Environmental Management, Building and Quantity Survey, as well as B.A Linguistics, Theatre Arts, Sharia and Islamic Banking & Finance.

Professor Rasheed disclosed this when the Principal Officers of the College of Arts, Science and Remedial Studies (CAS&RS) paid him a courtesy call on Thursday last week to streamline the cordial relationship between the two institutions.

The Vice Chancellor emphasized that in the University's continued expansion of its academic progammes and physical structures, the new Faculty of Dentistry would be commissioned soon. He added that part-time programmes in Distance Learning, Nursing and Accounting, among others, would soon commence.

Prof. Rasheed tasked the management of the college to guide their students properly in admission matters in order to choose suitable combination and avoid being rejected by Universities.

Earlier, the Principal of the College and former H.O.D Sociology at BUK, Dr. Sani L. Malumfashi, said they came to strengthen their relationship with the University and request for additional admission slots for their students, in view of the College's new policy, which allows IJMB students to graduate in one year.



Radiographers Board in BUK to Accredit Radiology Programme

Satisfied with the implementation of its recommendation on the Radiology programme during its last year's Resource Verification Exercise, the Radiographers Registration Board, comprising its Principal Officers, visited B.U.K to conduct a proper accreditation.

In a courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor on Monday 21st January, 2013, the Ag. Registrar of the Board, Mr. Okpaleke M. S., said the team came to accredit the programme and set a benchmark for conducting standard examinations for students.

While commending B.U.K. for becoming the second University in northern Nigeria to mount the programme, the Ag. Registrar noted that the proliferation of quack technicians in the country made it imperative for the Board to urge many Universities to start the programme in order to train more people that would assume professional duties.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Rasheed, *mni*, MFR was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics) Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said the University had recently recruited four qualified Radiology

staff and would train more BUK staff in Nigeria and abroad.

He expressed the University's commitment to continue to equip the staff with higher medical training abroad in order to increase the ratio between medical personnel and people.

Report of the Seminar Held by the International Institute of Islamic Banking & Finance (IIIBF) on 10th January, 2013

The seminar series of the International Institute of Islamic Banking and Finance was held on 10th January, paper titled 2013 and Hubs/Waqf as One of the al-Sadaqat of O2:276 and an Alternative to on Ribah-based lending Terms: Extrapolating from Tahir Ibn Ashur's Construing of the Ribah Opposite" was presented by Mallam Mahdi Ahmad.



The prohibition of interest has been supported by all the major religions in the world such as Islam, Christianity, Judaism and Hinduism. However, people have still been practicing the interest based system all over the world. These practices have been exploitative; hindering the economy and fostering the unequal distribution of wealth, whose negative impact has been felt mostly among the masses.

However, this paper explored another the interest-based alternative to system, which is basically Hubs/Waqf philanthropy (which means prohibiting any use or disposition of it outside that specific objective). In particular, cash is deducted as Waqf for the purpose of lending it to those designated the beneficiaries as without interest. This is justified by Our'an 2:276 and several pieces of evidence from the Sunnah. It further shows evidence from the Middle East and their *modus operandi*, such as Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Oman and the United Arab Emirates.

The discussion centered on whether it was alright to regard cash as a type of hubs/waqf.

- i. Highlights of each paper presented during the Workshop/Conference.
- ii. Major issues discussed.
- iii. Major experience or knowledge acquired.
- iv. Syndicated session/interactive session/group session:This should appear at the last paragraph and to include major things achieved or learned from the group discussion.
- v. Recommendations.
- vi. Conclusion: This should include summary of the papers presented with emphasis on:



- ✓ Knowledge acquired and its effects on official duties.
- ✓ Suggest changes in the officer's current or future job content (where necessary).
- ✓ Contribution of the knowledge acquired during the Conference or Workshop and its impact on the officer's department or unit.

Authors should refer to themselves and any previous work of theirs in the third person.



Manual of Style

Bibliographical references should be incorporated into the text using the author date system, and page numbers indicated where necessary, e.g. Rasheed (2009:68). All references should be listed alphabetically under the heading WORKS CITED at the end of the typescript, e.g., Rabi, I. (2002) *A Brief History of Love*, London: Grove Press.

In the case of a journal article, extant pages should be given: e.g. Amina, A. (2010) "Women in Kano", *Kakaki: Journal of English Studies* 2 (4) pp. 18 – 54 just as in references to chapters in books: e.g. Daura, S. (2012) "A Critical Analysis of Reading at a Lower Level" in I. Tsiga (ed.). *A Reader on Writing*, Kano: Bayero University Press, pp. 99 – 130.
