



Alumni Association Calls For Support to its National Convention

The death has occurred of an External Member of the Council, Associate Professor Josephine Amaka Okpoko.

In a letter to the Chairman of Council, the husband of the deceased, Professor A. I. Okpoko of the Department of Archaeology and Tourism, University of Nigeria, Nsukka, said Prof. (Mrs) Josephine Okpoko, died on 25th August, 2013 and would be buried on 27th September, 2013 at her home-town, Okpu-Ifite village, Agulu in Anaocha Local Government Area, Anambra State.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, *mni*, MFR has on behalf of the University community, extended his sympathy to the family of the deceased. He has also appointed a 3-member team, headed by the DVC (Administration) to represent the University at the burial.

Professor Rasheed said the University believes in the importance of the association and as stakeholders “you have a lot to



contribute in shaping all the activities of the institution.”

A communiqué issued at the end of the meeting commended the University Management for its support and cooperation towards making the Association achieve its desired goals.

A three-member committee charged with the responsibility of drawing up guidelines for the election was constituted at the meeting.
