he Nigeria Police remains the most misunderstood and criticized security agency in the country, the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed *mni*, MFR, has observed.

He was speaking when he received the Assistant Inspector General of Police in charge of Zone One, Alhaji Mohammed Tambari Yabo, in his office on Monday, 3rd February, 2014.

The Vice Chancellor stated that Nigerians harbor the erroneous belief that the responsibility of policing the society and providing the much needed security rest on the shoulders of only the police, adding that 'this is a wrong belief. It is the duty of all and sundry to join hands with the police to address the menace of insecurity in the land.'

Professor Rasheed stated that Bayero University was very much conscious of the responsibilities of the police and that was why the management would do everything humanly possible to work together with the

force to tackle issues of security both on and off campus, as it affected staff and students.

The Vice Chancellor took time to explain to the AIG what the management was doing to transform the University both in terms of infrastructural expansion and introduction the of new academic programmes. He called on members of the police force to take advantage of the newly introduced parttime degree programmes of the University in order to improve their knowledge and boost their career prospects.

Professor Rasheed extended an invitation to the AIG to participate in its public lecture series and, if possible, deliver a lecture to the students on policing and police activities. He congratulated the new AIG and promised to give him all the cooperation he needed to enable him to succeed.

In his address, AIG Mohammed Tambari Yabo thanked the management of BUK under the leadership of Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed for the warm



reception accorded him and said that he was in the University to seek for their support and cooperation in the on-going efforts to address the issues of insecurity.

He said the police would like to work closely with the Security Division of BUK to checkmate security challenges.

AIG Tambari Yabo accepted the invitation of the Vice Chancellor and agreed to deliver lecture to students in future as part of the public lecture series.

According to the Director, Examinations, Admission and Records, Hajiya Fatima B. Mohammed, HOD's are expected to inform the Level Coordinators of the candidates concerned of the decisions of the Senate before a formal letter from the Directorate is issued to them.

Zakkah: An Instrument of Social Security

Zakkah (the compulsory percentage given from the wealth of the well-off to the specified poor) has been described as an important instrument of social security, which resembles the modern-day social security plan for the improvement of the welfare of the citizenry.

The observation was made by both presenters, speaking on the topic: Zakkah on Employment Income in Muslim Majority States of Nigeria during a seminar organized by the International Institute of Islamic Banking and Finance (IIIBF), Bayero University, Kano.

Professor Kabiru Isa Dandago, who was the first speaker, called for fiscal policy measures for Zakkah on employment income, which he said would serve as a spring board to maintain peace and order as well as bring rapid development in Muslim majority states of Nigeria.

He said members of the academic community have their talent as endowment from which they earn their livelihood and should therefore endeavour to offer Zakkah on that income.

On her part, Safiyya Abubakar Abba, a Postgraduate Fellow of the Institute, who based most of her arguments on the Holy Qur'an and Hadith, observed that researches in Muslim majority jurisdictions like Malaysia, especially in states like Walaya, Selangor, Sarawak, Kedah and in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, have shown that employment income contributes a significant part of the total Zakkah collected.

She said Zakkah is primarily meant to alleviate poverty, as five of its eight prescribed recipients belong to those who have in one way or another fallen into the



pits of poverty, and augment government expenditure by giving disposal income to the poor.

Professor Auwalu Yadudu Hamisu in his comment called for situational analysis and a study of the political climate to guard against constitutional misunderstanding.

He was of the opinion that Zakkah on Employment Income tends to do better if it is administered privately.

In his contribution, Dr. Garba Bala Bello of the Department of Business Administration opined that there was the need for the involvement of the state in the collection of Zakkah, citing Sokoto and Zamfara states, which have gone along that path.

The seminar called on Muslim majority states to consider coming up with some incentives in the form of income tax relief to encourage Zakkah payment. There was a call for educational institutions and media houses to educate income earners on their responsibility to pay Zakkah from their employment income with a view to tackling poverty, as it is done in some countries.

The occasion was chaired by Professor Shehu Usman Aliyu Rano, the Director, International Institute of Islamic Banking and Finance (IIIBF).

Iran Ready To Sponsor Teaching Persian in BUK

The Islamic Republic of Iran says it is ready to sponsor the teaching of Persian in Bayero University as a way of establishing viable academic collaborations between the University and its counterparts in Iran. Former Vice President of Iran and a lecturer in Tehran University, Dr. Sayyid Ahmad, who was accompanied to the University for a courtesy call on the Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies (FAIS) by the Consular of Iran to Nigeria, Sayed Bagher Sayed, on Tuesday, said his country was more than ready to send Professors from Universities in Iran to BUK and provide all the necessary arrangements to ensure that the teaching of Persian commenced with immediate effect.

Also speaking, the Consular, Sayed Bagher Sayed, said to actualize the relationship between BUK and Universities in Iran, a joint international conference should be conducted to discuss and explore more avenues for sustainable academic linkage. He said Deans of the Universities would also sit and finetune the arrangements needed to ensure that a memorandum of understanding is signed.

He said people from the Persian country would always visit BUK, especially if they come to Nigeria, as they would be overwhelmed with this development.

The Consular added that the Iranian Embassy would facilitate this collaboration and expressed the optimism that the relationship would be mutually beneficial.

Speaking, the Dean, Faculty of Arts and Islamic Studies, Professor Hafizu Miko Yakasai, welcomed the former Iranian Vice President, and said the visit was an honour done to the entire University community.

Prof. Miko recalled that Bayero University has had a long standing collaboration with Azad University in Tehran, which teaches Hausa at undergraduate and Masters Degree levels, saying the University would highly appreciate it to revive the already existing linkage.
