BUK To Hold Post-UTME August 8th & 9th

The 2014/2015 academic session Post-UTME Screening exercise is scheduled to hold on Friday, 8th August and Saturday, 9th August, 2014.

A statement signed by the Director, Examinations, Admissions and Records, Hajiya Fatima Binta Mohammed, said only candidates who chose Bayero University as their first choice in the 2014 UTME conducted by JAMB and scored 180 and above are eligible for the screening exercise.

The Method of Application is as follows:

Step 1: At the homepage of the Bayero University website, www.buk.ed.ng click 2014 POST-UTME REGISTRATION.

Step 2: Login using your UTME Number and UTME aggregate (total score), then upload your passport sized photograph. Note that the photograph uploaded will be the only ID for all admitted candidates throughout their stay in Bayero University, Kano.

Step 3: Fill-in the Applicant's Particulars Form.

Step 4: Print your personalized payment invoice to make the payment of \$\frac{\mathbb{N}}{2}\$,500.00 (\$\frac{\mathbb{N}}{2}\$,000 being cost of screening and \$\frac{\mathbb{N}}{5}00\$ being Bank and Administrative charges) at any branch of the following Banks Nationwide:

- i) UBA
- ii) SKYE bank
- iii) Guaranty Trust Bank
- iv) First Bank

Step 5: After making the payment, return to the website, www.buk.edu.ng login again. Your payment will be validated after which you can print your personalized examination card. Preview and confirm your information before printing your Examination Card. Note that applications cannot print their exam cards until their payment is processed and verified.

Note: No Applicant will be allowed to sit for the Post-UTME test without valid Examination Card.

Online PUTME Registration will start on Wednesday, 16th July, 2014 and end by midnight of Wednesday, 6th August, 2014.

Post UTME Screening is as follows:

The screening exercise will take place on Friday, 8th and Saturday, 9th August, 2014.
