### **Yayale Ahmed is New BUK Pro-Chancellor**

**A** one-time Secretary to the Government of Federation (SGF) and former Minister of Defence, Mahmud Yayale Ahmed, was on Wednesday, 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2014 introduced as new Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the 12<sup>th</sup> Governing Council of Bayero University, Kano. He succeeds Ahmed Adamu Mu'azu, who is currently the PDP Chairman. It will be recalled that the 12<sup>th</sup> Council Chairman was appointed by President Goodluck Ebele Jonathan on 3<sup>rd</sup> April, 2013 before his subsequent appointment as PDP Chairman.

In his inaugural speech at the University's Senate Chamber before the Principal Officers, Council Members, Deans and Directors, the new Pro-Chancellor expressed his joy at his appointment and promised to do his utmost best to serve the University and the nation.

The new Pro-Chancellor said that Bayero University remained the University

to beat in Nigeria, whose records on visitations, accreditations and ability to tolerate and manage ASUU had singled it out from its contemporaries in the country. He said most institutions could not accommodate what BUK had to contend with because over the years it was able to harness radicalism positively while articulating strategic plans to accomplish its mission.

Yayale Ahmed said BUK had gone a long way in building its name through quality administration and research.

He said he respected the University on three issues: training and retraining of its staff which promoted the university's performance in the provision of quality education; quality research and scholarly output, which were the weapons to tackle the problems of any society, as well as strict adherence to strategic plans.

He urged BUK to continue conducting quality researches for it to become a Center of Excellence in research, so that the results of such researches could boost the nation's economy.

The Pro-Chancellor, who was the former SGF and Ajiya of Katagum congratulated the management for strict adherence to the strategic plan in the area of infrastructural development. He expressed gratitude for the honor done to him, assuring that both he and the university would put head together to benefit from one another.

He said "I would like to say that I did not come to show you anything, I am here to be guided in doing my job, I would not hesitate to serve as a messenger between you and the government, between you and the community and between you and the international donors and even between you and your family.

"I would remain guided by the wisdom of your Senate, which brings issues to Council, I will diplomatically remind you that I am the representative of the owners, but I will endeavour to retain what I achieved in life, and I will never compromise my integrity".

He expressed gratitude that Bayero University had honored him twice, the first was in 2001 when he was conferred with an honorary Doctoral Degree and the second was his appointment as Pro-Chancellor and Chairman Governing Council of the university.

The Pro-Chancellor who said he was comfortable amongst academics, added: "I was impressed with the support and

cooperation being rendered to the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed by the entire management of the university, this was the indication of good governance and leadership quality of the Vice Chancellor."

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed *nni*, MFR, while welcoming the new Pro-Chancellor said they were happy when he accepted to serve the university because they knew that he would add greater value to the institution being technocrat, bureaucrat and experienced civil servant.

He took the Pro-Chancellor through a power point presentations of the development recorded in the university right from when it was established in 1960 as Ahmadu Bello College to the present monumental developments.

Professor Rasheed told the Pro-Chancellor that the university hoped to tackle the challenges of municipal services, such as electricity and water with the 400 million naira coming from the 'NEEDS ASSESSMENT FUND.'

He further said that 30 new degree programmes along with many centers, faculties and colleges were established and that the number of staff was doubled all in an effort to ensure quality. He said the efforts of the last few years had transformed BUK to be among the best universities in the country, and that the mission was to make the institution among the best graded in the world.

The Vice Chancellor said the present management is transforming the university to be a distinct research university, that's why it stopped all sub degree programmes and it had started streamlining undergraduate programmes to give room for more post graduate degrees.

In his remark, the Deputy Vice Chancellor Academic, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said the vast experiences of the Pro-Chancellor would assist the university to chart its cause, saying that the acceptance of Yayale Ahmed to serve BUK was a great honor to the University community.

The President ASUU, Dr. Nasiru Isa Fagge said with the vast experiences of the Pro Chancellor BUK would soon be placed in the comity of universities adjudged as the best in the world, assuring that all hands will be on deck to support the Pro-Chancellor in recording voluminous achievements by the end of his tenure.

### **Former DG NTA Cherishes BUK, Prof. Abdallah**

Former Director General of the N.T.A. and Makama of Babura, Alhaji Muhammadu Ibrahim has praised Bayero University for its promotion of research and scholarly contributions to the world of learning, saying that the production of esteemed scholars such as Professor Abdalla Uba Adamu, who made history as holder to two professorships in Media and Cultural Communication as well as in Science Education is a great pride to the country.

Alhaji Muhammadu Ibrahim, speaking as Chairman of the International Conference on "Transglobal Media, Knowledge Transfer

and African Identities" organized by the Department of Mass Communication in collaboration with the Freedom Radio and African Identities, in honor of Professor Abdalla Uba Adamu, on Wednesday, 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2014 at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, said the honor was deserved.

He said both Mass Communication Department and Education should continue to benefit from the legacies of Professor Abdallah, because he has the ability and capacity to mentor scholars in undergraduate and higher degrees, urging the Professor to carry the two departments along.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, represented by a former Vice Chancellor of the University, Professor Dandatti Abdulkadir, said Department of Mass Communication, Bayero University was among the departments with reputable lecturers, hence the plan to upgrade the department into one of the best African Centers of Media and Communication studies.

The Chairman Organizing Committee of the Conference, Professor Sa'idu Ahmad Babura, said the conference was conceived to give recognition for the first time to a scholar in Nigeria with professorial discipline in education, crossing to conduct research in Media Studies, and bagged another professorial title, saying that Professor Abdallah was recognized nationally and internationally.

Professor Babura also commended Freedom Radio and African Identities for effort in the actualization of the conference, saying that the private radio station had given an

alternative voice to Nigerians and it changed the face of broadcasting industry in Nigeria for better.

The representative of African Identity and owner of Moving Image Communications, Alhaji Abdulkarim Mohammed charged the youth, who were the majority audience in the conference to embrace the doctrine of African Identities to be able to make the country great.

The General Manager of Freedom Radio, Alhaji Umar Sa'idu Tudunwada, represented by a senior Editor in the station, Alhaji Ado Sa'idu Warawa commended Bayero University, saying that since 2003 when Freedom Radio was established it had to promote journalism in the northern states of Nigeria. He said the station amongst others promoted folk-culture and communication, citing instance with a one hour program 'Adabin Rayuwa' being produced by Professor Abdulkadir Dangambo of Bayero University.

The Head of Mass Communication Department, Associate Professor Balarabe Maikaba, said Professor Abdallah has been a mentor in the department, whose wealth of experience benefits the university a lot. He said Professor Adamu was graduating students of high degrees; the latest was Dr. Bashir Ali, who finished his doctoral degree Tuesday, 16<sup>th</sup> September, 2014.

## **UHS Conducts Lecture on Ebola Virus Disease**

The University Health Services Department has conducted a one-day public lecture on Ebola Virus Disease under the auspice of the

Committee on Ebola Virus, as part of University's efforts to contribute to the prevention and control of the dreaded scourge in Nigeria.

In his paper on "Ebola Fever," Dr. Munir Suleiman traced the history of Ebola virus to 1976 when it was first discovered in Ebola River at Zaire now Democratic Republic of Congo, saying that the virus was found out to be more severe in 2014 when it resurfaced.

Dr. Suleiman said that at some point in the past the virus came and disappeared, explaining that it was as a result of the role played by fruit bats and animals (natural reservoirs) that stored the virus for many years. He added that as a result of human interaction with animals through eating their meat that the virus is transmitted back to the people.

Dr. Suleiman further said the virus can be contracted through secretion from infected individuals e.g. blood, saliva, mucous, vomit, semen, sweat and is transmitted at hospital during treatment.

He said to control the spread of the virus there is the need to isolate the infected persons and people should at all times wash their hands regularly and ensure proper sterilization of sharp items.

Malam Salisu Abubakar FWACN, who presented the second paper titled; "Prevention and Control of Ebola Virus Disease," said the virus is transmitted from animals to humans and from human to humans, saying individuals who recovered could still transmit the virus if adequate care is not taken.

Malam Abubakar advised people to avoid contact with bats and monkeys, eating bush meat, physical contact with the infected persons and should wash hands regularly with soap and water.

He further advocated the need to avoid funeral of the dead victims and corpse should appropriately be sealed in a body bag and all contaminated items belonging to the deceased should be incinerated.

The Chief Epidemiologist of Kano, Dr. Tijjani Hassan, said since President Goodluck Jonathan declared national emergency on Ebola Virus, Kano State Government has been making frantic efforts to take proactive measures against the disease, even though the case is yet to be recorded in the state.

The outgoing Director of Health Services, Dr. M. S. Ado was the Chairman of the occasion, while the Chairperson of the University Ebola Virus Committee, Dr. Hadiza Suleiman delivered vote of thanks.

The lecture took place on Thursday, 11<sup>th</sup> September, 2014 at the Theatre One Old Campus.

### **Dr. Abdullahi Hamza Yaro Appointed HOD Pharmacology**

Dr. Abdullahi Hamza Yaro has been appointed as the Head of Department of Pharmacology for two years with effect from 15<sup>th</sup> September, 2014.

According to a letter of appointment signed by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Abubakar Rasheed *mni*, MFR, dated 11<sup>th</sup> September, 2014, advised the HOD to “give sound

academic and administrative leadership to the department.”

### **Islamic Law Dept Host Lecture on Classical Islamic Jurisprudence**

The Department of Islamic Law, Bayero University, Kano hosted a lecture on Classical Islamic Jurisprudence delivered by a prominent law scholar, Prof. Abdulqadir Zubair, at the Faculty of Law theatre, Old Campus on 10<sup>th</sup> September, 2014.

According to the Head of the Department, Dr. Mamman Lawan, the topic of the lecture was “*The Relevance of Classical Islamic Jurisprudence to the Contemporary Era.*”

The scholar highlighted the contributions of early Muslim jurists to general Islamic jurisprudence and underscored their relevance in facing modern day challenges on specific issues that, on the face of it, defy legal solutions. The scholar stressed that the past in the form of classical Islamic scholarship is relevant not only to the present but also to future generations of Muslim communities wherever they may be.

Professor Zubair who is currently a Professor of Islamic Law at the Faculty of Law University of Ilorin was Head of Department of Islamic Law, Bayero University, Kano between 1996 and 2000.

The lecture was chaired by Professor Mustapha of the Department of Islamic Studies and Shari’a, Bayero University, Kano and it was attended by important personalities such as Barrister Muzammil Sani Hanga, Head of Department of Islamic Studies and Shari’a, Dr. Ibrahim Maibushira, the Dean and staff of the Faculty of Law and students.
