#### The statement stated that:

- \*: Faculty Examinations Officers should notify all the students accused of involvement in examination misconduct (in writing) that they should stay behind/return to defend themselves as soon as each case arises.
- \*\*: This is the latest date for this activity. Departments should encourage examiners to submit their results before this date whenever possible, and Level Coordinators to start compiling the results as soon as some examiners submit their raw marks.
- \*\*\*: Arrangements will be made for the prompt payment of External Examiners' claims. Departments are advised to complete the claims so that the examiners sign them immediately on arrival. In line with the new e-payment policy, the payments will be made



directly into the External Examiners' accounts. A copy of the **modified claim form** is available at the Directorate of Examinations, Admissions and Records (DEAR).

The statement urged Deans to notify all Heads of Departments, Faculty Examination Officers and Level Coordinators concerned to ensure its implementation. "Note that we need to adhere strictly to the timetable to ensure that the 2014/2015 Session commences on March 16, 2015 as earlier decided by the Senate," the statement added.

## Citadels of Learning Internationally - Prof. Jega

former Vice-Chancellor Bayero The of University now Chairman of the and Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC), Professor Muhammad Attahiru Jega, says, "BUK has really come of age and is capable of competing favorably with some the best citadels of learning not only within the continent of Africa, but also internationally."

Professor Jega was speaking shortly after he commissioned some projects both in the New and Old Campuses of the University on Monday, 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2015.

He said the level of development on ground in terms of infrastructure and academic exploits had convinced and made him conclude that "BUK has really come of age and is in a position not only to rub shoulders with some of the finest universities within the continent of Africa but also compete with the best internationally."

The INEC boss said all these unprecedented developments were attributable to the commitment, sincerity and dedication of its current leadership led by Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, mni, MFR.

Professor Jega said each time he had the opportunity of visiting BUK, he would see a different and an improved environment, saying that "this time around after visiting the new and old campuses, I am almost confused and at a

## We are Committed to Ensuring **Hitch-Free Elections in 2015** - INEC Chairman

The Chairman of Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC), Professor Attahiru Jega, has said that the commission has succeeded in the distribution of over 75 percent of the Permanent Voter Cards (PVC) to the registered members across the country, as part of the efforts to ensure a hitch-free conduct of 2015 general elections.

Professor Jega who was speaking on Monday, January, 2015 at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium during a two- day Conference, titled INEC and the 2015 General Elections: Expectations. **Prospects** and Challenges organized by Bayero University, assured that the commission had decentralized the distribution of the remaining cards from local governments to conversation on the forthcoming 2015 general ward levels.

The chairman said INEC is doing everything possible to give every eligible voter his PVC within the stipulated time before the election, saying, however, the commission would not allow collection of the voter cards by proxy. He said that politicians attempting to forge the PVCs should know that "cloned cards cannot work in the INEC reader machines," as the commission had taken all measures to tackle problems experienced during the 2011 general elections.

He urged politicians to change their attitude so as to support the conduct of hitch-free elections. He expressed concern that seeking political office by 'hook or crook' is an attitude that will endanger democracy.

The former Chief Justice of the Federation, Justice Muhammad Lawal Uwais, who was the chairman of the occasion lamented that the behavior of some politicians doesn't help, as they seek to cut corners through rigging and committing various electoral offences.

Justice Uwais warned that a repeat of post-2011 electoral violence would not be tolerated, pointing out that lives and property were lost after the announcement of the 2011 presidential election result. He commended INEC and other stakeholders who are holding conferences to stave off violence during the forthcoming elections.

Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, in his welcome address said the university was proud of the INEC chairman for achieving a lot in the commission, as a former Vice Chancellor of the university.

He said the two-day conference, during which the INEC Chairman presented a keynote address, was intended to enrich the ongoing

conversation on the forthcoming 2015 general elections by refocusing the discussion to the core issues of the necessity and requirements for free, fair and credible elections.

Professor Rasheed said Bayero university organized the conference in keeping with its good traditions of organizing scholarly discourse on topical national and international issues, saying that in 2011, just before the general elections, the INEC Chairman delivered a post-convocation lecture at the Bayero University titled Challenges and Prospects of Credible Elections in Nigeria, where issues on the elections were discussed and clarified.

The Vice Chancellor assured that Bayero University identifies with the supports and commitments of INEC to organize free, fair and credible general elections in the country, such as its commitment to enfranchise all eligible voters, including the Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) of the North-East.

## PENSION UNIT: Calling Staff Due for Retirement Between January and December 2016 Under the Contributory Pension Scheme

In line with the provision of section 15 of the Pension Reform Act 2014 and as part of the implementation process of the issuance of Federal Government Retreat Bond, the National Pension Commission Plans to organize a verification and enrolment exercise for employees in the service of the Federal Government of Nigeria that are due retirement between January and December 2016 by virtue of attaining the age of 65 years (for Non-Professors and Non-teaching staff) and 70 years for Professors.

A statement signed by Malam Muhammad Bello Garba, Senior Assistant Registrar, Pensions, said staff who will attain the age of 65 years and 70

years (for Professors) between January and December 2016 are requested to forward their notice of retirement to the Registrar between Monday, January 12<sup>th</sup> and Friday, 13<sup>th</sup> February, 2015. Staff who wish to retire voluntarily can also forward their notice of voluntary retirement to the Registrar within the period. Staff who voluntarily/mandatorily retired or whose appointment were terminated and are yet to be verified and enrolled for payment of retirement benefits can also come to the Pension Unit for necessary arrangement, the statement concluded.
