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### 1<sup>st</sup> International Confab on Nigeria – Sudan Relations:

#### *Come up with Suggestions that'll Strengthen Our Relations – Emir Sanusi Charges Participants*

The Emir of Kano, Muhammad Sanusi II, has called on the participants to the three day International Conference on Nigeria-Sudan Relations to come up with workable suggestions that would be used to further cement and broaden the existing relationship between the two countries.

The Emir was delivering a keynote address at the opening ceremony of the 1<sup>st</sup> International Conference on Nigeria-Sudan Relations on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> June, 2015 at the Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, BUK New Campus. The conference was jointly organized by Bayero University, Kano, University of Dalanj and The Omdurman Islamic University, Khartoum, Sudan.

He said the relationship between Nigeria and Sudan date back to so many decades and went beyond the spread of Islamic religion to includes; economic, commerce and tourism, adding the contribution of Sudan to Nigeria in the area of Islamic/education and religion was glaring in the establishment and running of the School for Arabic Studies. 'This school did not produce Islamic Scholars alone; it also produces Shari 'a Court Judges,' he added.

The Emir said any effort geared towards further cementing the Nigeria-Sudan relations like this conference, being promoted by BUK, should be supported and encouraged, adding, 'I was a student of International University of Africa, Sudan, where I intend to spend only one year to learn Arabic, but because of the hospitality of the people of Sudan to Nigerians, I ended up spending five years to study in that country comfortably,' he explained.

He said the glaring solution to the current insecurity in the country lies on the urgent need for the people of Nigeria, Sudan, Libya, Chad and Niger to come together and work as one entity in order to fight 'this common enemy.' The Emir wished participants a successful conference.

In his address, Kano State Governor, Dr. Abdullahi Umar Ganduje represented by his deputy, Professor Hafizu Abubakar, MFR, congratulated BUK for co-hosting the International conference which he described as timely.

He said Sudan and Nigeria had a long history of brotherhood and stated that a lot of Sudanese work on the propagation and promotion of Islamic education/religion abound, adding that this kind of conference that would seek to further cement the existing relations between the two countries is always a welcome development and highly commendable.

Governor Ganduje used the occasion to congratulate the Emir of Kano, Muhammad Sanusi II on the occasion of his first anniversary on the throne of his ancestors.

Earlier in his welcome address the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, *mni*, MFR represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academics), Professor Sagir Abbas gave the background on how the conference came to be.

He explained that sometimes in April last year, the two Vice-Chancellors of University of Dalanj and Omdurman Islamic University, Khartoum visited BUK where an MoU for collaborations were signed. He said to reciprocate the visit, a BUK team was also in Sudan where meetings were held with the management of the two Universities and a resolution was reached to make good the terms and conditions of the MoU already signed. He said one of the key

resolutions was to convene an International Conference to which BUK offered to host. ‘Alhamdulillah, today we are witnessing a dream come true.’

The Vice-Chancellor stated that collaborations, partnerships and linkages have always been an integral tradition of BUK, saying that ‘through such collaborations, we often share knowledge, exchange experiences and gain acquaintance with international best practices in both academic endeavours and the administration and management of academic institutes.’

Professor Rasheed said the need for partnership between universities has all the more been reinforced by the phenomenon of globalization, adding that ‘while it accentuates competition, it conversely also ordains interdependence and cooperation. And that the implication of this is that universities must strive harder not only to achieve excellence or distinction in terms of quality of teaching, research and scholarship, but also to keep themselves above board to maintain reputation or remain relevant,’ he remarked.

He said it is hoped that at the end of the conference, very concrete, realistic, veritable visionary, practical and workable resolutions would be made which could guide public policy and action and generate viable, broad based and development oriented community action.

The occasion was chaired by Sudanese Ambassador to Nigeria, His Excellency, Isma’il Muhammad.

## BUK COMMEMORATES ADO BAYERO

Bayero University in conjunction with Ado Bayero Foundation on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> June, 2015 commemorated the late Emir of Kano, Alhaji Ado Bayero with the 1<sup>st</sup> memorial lecture. The former Emir died on 6<sup>th</sup> June, 2014.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, *mni*, MFR, in his welcome address, said the late Emir had had a long standing relationship with the university with mutual benefits, saying most of the current transformations and breakthrough were recorded during his time.

Represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, (Academics), Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, the Vice Chancellor explained that “the relationship Bayero University had with the late Emir was extremely productive and supportive. Historically, the university was born in his hand as an affiliated college and it later became a full-fledged university.”

While extolling the virtues of the late Emir the Vice Chancellor described him as an exemplary traditional and temporal leader of not only Hausa land but the Sudanic Africa.

Delivering the lecture titled: *The Contributions of the late Emir Ado Bayero to the Development of Islam in Kano*, Malam Ibrahim Ado Kurawa said Ado Bayero was contented as a leader in that he had

never sought personal favors. He noted that some of the former governors acknowledged this quality. “For example Colonel Sani Bello was reported to have said that unlike other traditional leaders in other states, Ado Bayero did not ask for any plot of land after the promulgation of the Land Use Decree in 1977 which transferred all lands to state government.”

Dr. Kurawa said that throughout the life and times of Ado Bayero every one attested that he was non-partisan in his interaction with various groups and individuals and was cautious in dealing with politicians. “At both the national and international levels he was a peace ambassador”, he remarked.

The speaker explained that in the field of education, Ado Bayero contributed to the educational development of Kano and many parts of Nigeria and such contributions are very numerous and diverse because as a Muslim leader, he fulfilled his obligations.

Dr. Kurawa stressed that in his fifty-year reign, Ado Bayero became a leader of Hausa Muslims wherever they were and people looked up to him as the symbol of Hausa Islamic culture because Kano is the leading center of this cultural bloc with over 70 million speakers. He said Ado Bayero was on the list of the most influential muslims of the world published by the Royal Islamic Strategies Studies Center, Amman.

On his part, President of the foundation, Abdullahi Ado Bayero (ESQ) had earlier said that the reason for the lecture was principally to recall and extol the good leadership qualities of the late emir and also to sustain his heritages and legacies for present and future generation.

He said the foundation’s mission is centered on community development services through youth and women empowerment and capacity building; response to the needs of local community and sustenance of good qualities of the indigenes and rulers of Kano.

Alhaji Yusuf Maitama Sule (*Dan Masanin Kano*), who was the Chairman of the occasion, boasted that

no one knew Ado Bayero more than him because of their closeness and childhood background. He said the late emir had never sought for help from anybody but God and he had never seen or heard him lie throughout his lifetimes.

Professor Dahiru Yahaya, who discussed extensively on the qualities of the late Emir described him as honest, patriotic and a true Islamic personality, who shared decency and modesty.

Some of the dignitaries present at the ceremony were: Representative of Emir of Kano, *Barden Kano* and District Head of Bichi, Alhaji Idris Bayero, Sheikh Ibrahim Khalil, Ustaz Abdulgaffar Nasiru Kabara, Hajiya Ummakati Sanusi Bayero, sons and daughters and family members of the late emir, as well as a large number of students.

### **Mass Com. Dept. Upgraded to Streamline Journalism Studies** **- Prof Rasheed**

The upgrading of the department of Mass Communication to Faculty of Communication and Media Studies was part of efforts not only to streamline the study of mass communication, but also meant to encourage specialization in line with global best practices.

Malam Ladan Salihu said as an alumnus who left the university in 1981 as mass communication pioneer graduand, a lot of changes had taken place not only in the department, but also across the entire university, ‘I must commend the foresight of the Vice-Chancellor and his team for turning the university into an International one.’

The DG, who was accompanied to the VC’s office by the head of Mass Communication Department, Dr. Balarabe Maikaba, Professor Umar Pate and Professor Abdalla Uba Adamu, later in the day at the Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, had a fruitful interaction with students of mass communication department.
