Bayero University, Kano will be willing to collaborate with Civil Society Organizations to advance the cause of women in our society, Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, *mni*, MFR has said.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration), Professor Sadiq Isah Raddah spoke at the occasion of the celebration of the International Women's Day on Thursday 5th March, 2015 at the Twin Theatre of the Faculty of Science, Old Campus.

He said the doors of BUK are widely open for any collaboration that would result in the protection of not only the rights of women but also one that would be geared towards integrating them into the scheme of things to make them have a sense of belonging.

The Vice Chancellor said the women's day is worthy of celebration and that the time has come to analyze the role of women with a view to according them such unique position for the advancement of not only humanity but also the society.

He commended the British Council which made the programme possible through her projects such as Active Citizens, Justice for All and Nigeria Stability and Reconciliation Programme and also wished participants a fruitful and successful conference.

Also speaking in a keynote address, Chairperson of the occasion, Dr. Binta Tijjani Jibrin who is the Kano State Commissioner for Women Affairs thanked the organizers of the occasion and noted that given the immense political, social and economic importance of the International Women's Day, which she said was being commemorated globally on the 8th of March was meant to focus attention on the status of women and their plight, as well as celebrate their achievements and successes.

She said the theme of this year's celebration is 'Empowering Women, Empowering Humanity, picture it', which she said echoed the prophetic tradition which says; to educate a woman is to educate the nation.

The commissioner who took time to explain the achievements of the Kano state government in the area of empowering women and the girl child, stated that progress on women's right is a collective responsibility, saying that "all of us present here today are stakeholders in this task and we must join hands together to dismantle barriers and create platforms that will make additional progress possible."

He said it was not by accident that NCC was assisting BUK in its ICT development, adding that "even today we are donating about 87 copies of books on ICT to BUK to assist the institution continue to expand and improve on its ICT transformation."

Alhaji Batube explained that part of the reason why they visited BUK was for them to see the level of advancement the university recorded in the area of its ICT, saying that "we are fully satisfied with what we saw in the faculty and Centre of ICT."
