BUK Expels 31, Rusticates 3 & Exonerates 6

The Senate at its 335th meeting held on Wednesday, 4th November, 2015 upon consideration of recommendation from the Senate Committee on Examination and Leakages has approved the expulsion of 31 students for being involved in examinations misconduct.

It equally approved the rustication of 3 students for two semesters, exonerated 6 and directed that warning letters be served on 12 other students.

The decision of the Senate, which was cautioned in a statement signed by the University Examination Officer, Hajiya Amina Umar Abdullahi, explained that a case of examination misconduct could not be established against the 6 exonerated students, adding that the 12 other students to be served with warning letters were found to be involved in examinations misconduct but fell on category 19.7(cii).

According to the statement, the cases involving Ibrahim Tukur (SC/13/BCH/00835) and Mahmoud Saminu (EDU/13/ADE/00427) were deferred, pending further investigations.

The Senate, the statement added, directed that henceforth all students suspected of examination misconduct must be allowed to finish their examinations.
