We Affiliate with BUK on Degree Programmes to Solve Admission Challenges – *Provost, Sa’adatu Rimi COE*

The Provost of Sa’adatu Rimi College of Education, Kano, Dr. Sule Musa, has commended the Management of Bayero University for unreserved efforts to assist the institution towards mounting degree programmes both in arts and sciences.

Receiving members of the visitation panel from Bayero University on Tuesday, 6th October, 2015, led by the Dean, School of Continuing Education, Professor Salisu Shehu, the Provost said the institution perceived the idea of mounting degree programmes to assist in solving the current challenges being faced by

universities on admission.

Dr. Sule Musa said the institution has done a lot in the provision of infrastructure, facilities and manpower development as part of the efforts to mount additional degree programmes, saying this would go a long way in admitting candidates from Kano State and beyond.

He said the institution has sponsored over 100 teaching staff for PhD and Masters Degree programmes both within and outside the country in order to meet up the manpower needed to run various degree programmes, saying 16 staff completed their PhDs this year from Malaysia and other universities.

Dr. Sule Musa said the institution would expand its programmes to add from those that have already mounted, commending the TETFund for the numerous interventions in the institute that facilitated the move to commence degree programmes.

Earlier, the Dean, School of Undergraduate Studies, Mallam Abdu Baso Giginyu, briefed the team that the institution was blessed with a number of laboratories including language laboratory, Chemistry, Biology, Geography, Cartography room etc with students' welfare, libraries, offices, theatres, classes, sporting facilities and clinic, as well as other infrastructural facilities on ground.

The Dean expressed delight that to date the institute did not owe Bayero University, explaining that all affiliation charges have been paid.

The Dean, School of Continuing Education, Professor Salisu Shehu, said the visit was a routine activity undertaken to all institutions affiliated with Bayero University, so as to ensure that standard of Bayero University is reflected and strictly adhered to in running their programmes, because the degree they would award is Bayero University's degree.

Professor Salisu Shehu said the University received their request to mount additional degree programmes in B.A Ed Mathematics, B.A Ed History and B.A Ed PHE, so as to add to the existing degree programmes being run by the institution.

Deputy Dean, School of Continuing Education, Dr Abdul Iguda, while briefing the Management of the institution shortly after the inspection, expressed happiness that the College has performed wonderfully towards preparation for mounting additional degree programmes. He commended their efforts to put on ground most

of the facilities that will allow them to scale through the NUC accreditation. He, however, briefed the Management on the areas they should improve upon to pass the accreditation exercise.

Other members of the visitation panel are: Head of Department of Arts and Humanities, School of Continuing Education, Dr Salisu Lawal Malumfashi, Administrative Secretary of the School, Alhaji Shehu Galadima and Mustapha Gide, representing Secretary, Senate Committee on Affiliations.

The Visitation panel had earlier visited College of Education Gumel and Federal College of Education, Katsina.

Physiotherapy Department Clinches Dean's Cup

The Physiotherapy Department has won the 2014/2015 Dean's Football Cup organized by the Dean, Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences, Professor M. K. Atiku, on behalf of the College of Health Science by beating Physiology/Anatomy 2-0.

All the nine departments in the College participated in the competition and because of shortage of players, Physiology and Anatomy merged to form one team.

The match, which was played at the Old Campus Football Field on Wednesday, 7th October, 2015 attracted a large turn-out of crowd and dignitaries including the Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Administration, Professor Sadiq Isah Radda; the Dean, Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences, Professor M. K. Atiku; the Dean, Faculty of Dentistry, Professor R. A. Adebola; the Head of Biochemistry Department, Professor Alhassan Muhammad Wudil; the Deputy Dean, Faculty of Allied Health, Idris Garba, the Head of Physiology Department, Dr.

The first half of the match ended 0-0, but the second half was full of drama, fantasy and display of talent. Two goals in quick succession by Usman Balarabe and Adam Bashir, whose superlative free-kick against the run of play put Physiotherapy in the commanding lead were all physiotherapy needed to carry the day.

Despite the Anatomy/Physiology's effort to reduce the deficit, the Physiotherapy's defence proved resolute, frustrating all efforts to concede goal. After the centre referee, Sani Abdullahi (Atameka) blew the final whistle, the Physiotherapy players and supporters went into wild jubilation, chanting different victory songs.

Presenting the trophy, the Vice Chancellor expressed happiness over the manner in which the competition was organized and commended the players for displaying sportsman character throughout the match. He said such competition would go a long way in promoting friendship among departments.

In an interview with a lecturer in the Physiotherapy Department, Dr. Nazifi Bashir Mukhtar, said the players made the department proud by clinching the prestigious Dean's Cup in the presence of Vice Chancellor. He noted that the Physiotherapy students deserved to win the cup because "physical therapy has to do with making people to be fit and if the students can win this cup, it means they are fit". He added that exercise is an essential component of physiotherapy treatment and those that are instructing people to exercise should also be fit and perform well.

Meanwhile, Shamsuddeen Adamu Abdullahi of MBBS emerged the most valuable player of the tournament; Ahmad Bashir of Radiography, who scored 3 goals, was the highest goal scorer;

Mahmud Ahmad of Physiotherapy was voted the best goalkeeper, while Physiotherapy, having won the cup emerged as the best team.

BUK Defeats KWASU, Wins 3rd Edition of Sports Exchange

Bayero University has won the 3rd edition of the Sports Exchange Programme against Kwara State University, Malete played last week in Bayero University, Kano.

The two universities had signed a memorandum of understanding five years ago for sports and academic programmes. This year's event is the 3rd edition of sports programme. The first and second editions were held in BUK and KWASU, respectively.

The two universities competed in Volleyball, Table-tennis, Badminton, Basketball, Chess and Football. BUK won gold medals in Football, Table-tennis, Badminton (male), Basketball and Volleyball, while KWASU won gold medals in Chess and Badminton (female).

Specifically, the chapters must meet the following requirements:

- Title of the paper not more than 20 words, centered and 14pt font.
- Author(s) names, designation, address, email and GSM number(s) should appear below title.
- All texts in Times New Roman and in 12 pt font.
- Line spacing is 1.5 and the pages of the paper should not exceed 25.
- Figures, tables and charts are incorporated within the body of the paper, with adequate number and titles and should not break across two pages.
- Reference is to be presented at the end of the paper and in accordance with the APA style.
- Length of paper should be 15 pages minimum and 25 pages maximum.
