



Harmonized Junior Staff Scheme of Service: Seven New Cadres to be Introduced, Committee Submits Report

The Junior Staff appointments and Promotions Committee mandated by the management of the university to harmonize junior staff scheme of service has submitted its report with the suggestion for the introduction of seven New Cadres into the 2012 draft Junior Staff Scheme of Service.

The new cadres were meant to cater for serving staff of the university who were not captured in any of the existing cadres.

Receiving the report of the Committee, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello stated that the university felt that it was necessary that areas of discrepancies within the three previous documents hitherto used as guidelines for the promotion of junior staff observed by the committee during the last promotion exercise be sorted out and streamlined in favour of staff members. He said the essence was to ensure that there was fairness and objectivity in promotion especially across cadres.

The Vice Chancellor said the draft document presented by the committee shall, when approved by the Council, ease the work of the Junior Staff Committee, serve as incentives to staff members and ensure that staff were promoted as and when due. He added that management would continue to listen to any suggestion and effort that would promote staff welfare and development.

Professor Bello stated that the committee conducted its work at the appropriate time, because, according to him, at the time it was carrying out the assignment, there was no promotion exercise at hand.

He said training and retraining staff would continue to be the cardinal objectives of the management of Bayero University, adding that training and retraining had the tendency to strengthen the ability and know-how of staff to enable them to measure up to expectation in their places of primary assignment. In the light of the above 'I urge

Deans, Directors, Heads of Departments and units to encourage and support staff under their supervision to go for further training so that they do not stagnate.'

He expressed the appreciation of the University to the Committee, particularly the Chairman, Dr. Aliyu Muazu, and the Secretary, Malam A.B. Shehu, for their efforts in making the exercise a huge success.

Earlier, the Chairman of the Committee, Dr. Aliyu Muazu, pointed out that the junior staff committee had in the past observed and reported gaps in the junior staff scheme of service and regulations and that many cadres on which there were serving staff were not captured in the regulation as well as observed so many areas of discrepancies embedded in the scheme.

Highlights of the report of the Harmonized Junior Staff Scheme of Service, according to the chairman, were the introduction of seven new Cadres into the 2012 draft Junior Staff Scheme of Service to include,

Livestock Cadre, Photographer Cadre, Environmental Health Assistant Cadre, Sports Cadre and Printer Cadre. Others were Theatre and Performing Arts Cadre and Groundsman Cadre.

According to Dr. Muazu, Annual Performance Evaluation Report (APER) shall now be filled annually and graded on the scale of 5 – 1 instead of letter A- E. He also disclosed that the nomenclature of care-taker was replaced with porter on CONTISS 03, and that the required years for promotion on the 2014 draft scheme was reduced from 4 to 3 years.

He thanked the university management, particularly the Vice Chancellor, for the confidence they have in them, which he said enabled them to do a thorough job. He equally thanked other members of the committee for their support and understanding.

BUK's Centre for Qur'anic Studies Convenes 1st National *Alarammomi* Confab

The Centre for Qur'anic Studies, Bayero University, Kano on Saturday 10th December, 2016 held the first ever National Conference on *Alarammomi* in the country.

The conference with the theme: 'The Challenges of Qur'anic Memorizers in the 21st Century' brought together Qur'anic memorizers (*Alarammomi*) from across the 36 states of the federation. It was part of the efforts and initiatives of Bayero University through the Centre for Qur'anic Studies to embark on teaching and research in Qur'anic Science as well as to integrate and mainstream the *alarammomi* into the nation's educational system.

The conference was jointly organised by the Centre for Qur'anic Studies (BUK) and the Sheikh Muhammadu Rabi'u Muslim Centre.

Speaking at the opening ceremony, Kano State Governor, Dr. Abdullahi Umar Ganduje represented by his Deputy, Professor Hafiz Abubakar, said the establishment of the Centre for Qur'anic Studies aimed primarily at conducting teaching and research in Qur'anic Science as well offering conventional training to Qur'anic memorizers with a view to integrating them (*alarammomi*) into the nation's educational system was not only commendable, but should also be supported and encouraged by all stakeholders in the educational system.

He said the first conference that was being held today was one of the major breakthroughs in the on-going efforts to accord recognition to the *alarammomi*, adding that Kano State government would not relent in her determined efforts to support and encourage Qur'anic education in the state.

The Governor charged participants to listen attentively to the resource persons and also to contribute ideas with a view to making the conference lively, so that, at the end of the conference, the communiqué that would be released would be all encompassing.

Also speaking, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, went down memory lane by telling the participants why the University established the Centre for Qur'anic Studies. He said the centre was the brain child of his predecessor, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, who established it specifically to embark on teaching and research in Qur'anic Science, as well as offer training to Qur'anic memorizers (*alarammomi*) in some selected conventional courses so that, at the end of the day, they could be integrated into the nation's scheme of things.

He said the conference was part of the concerted efforts of the centre to meet its mandate. The Vice Chancellor thanked Khalifa Ishaq Rabi'u, who he described as a pillar of Qur'anic Science support in the country, for single-handedly building the permanent site of the Centre at the New Campus of the University as well as donating a multi-billion Naira edifice at Kofar Gadon Kaya to the university's Centre for Qur'anic Studies.

Earlier in his welcome address, the Chairman of the occasion, the former Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Emeritus Professor Dan Datti AbdulKadir, said today's occasion was history in the making, adding that there was no time and venue in this country where a large number of Qur'anic memorizers (*Alarammomi*) was gathered for the purpose of attending a conference, except today and by Bayero University's Centre for Qur'anic Studies.

He said Qur'anic memorizers are leaders and highly educated people in their own right who were often relegated to the background in terms of the nation's scheme of things, adding that, with this concerted effort by BUK, it was hoped that *Alarammomi* in this country were on the verge of recognition. Professor Dan Datti hoped that the conference would be made an annual exercise and appealed to them to continue to pray for peace to reign supreme in the country.

Also speaking, the Chairman of the Advisory Board of the Centre, Emeritus Professor Muhammad Sani Zahradeen, *OFR* commended the former Vice Chancellor of the University, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, for establishing the Centre for Qur'anic Studies and the incumbent Vice Chancellor, Professor Yahuza Bello, for sustaining and grooming it to maturity.

He equally thanked Khalifa Ishaq Rabi'u for all his support to Qur'anic Education in the country. He said it was a thing of pride that today *Alarammomi* from across the 36 states of federation were gathered for a conference, hoping that, in the very near future; it would

be expanded to include *Alarammomi* from across the African Continent.

In his address, Kahlifa Ishaq Rabi'u (Khadimul Qur'an), who spoke briefly, restated his commitment to continue to support the promotion of Qur'anic studies, which included its recitation and *tafsir* exegesis, and thanked BUK management for giving him the opportunity to work with them to promote the cause of Qur'anic studies.

In his address, Director of CQS, Professor Ibrahim Muhammad, thanked the Kano State Government for its concern and support for Islamiyya Qur'anic Studies, saying that this could be attested to by the government building of modern Tsangaya Islamiyya Schools in different locations of the state. He equally commended Sheikh Khlifa Ishaq Rabi'u for all his support to Bayero University in the areas of teaching Qur'anic recitation and research on Qur'anic Science.

The CQS Director also thanked the management of BUK, particularly the Vice Chancellor, whose support and understanding had been the secret behind the successes recorded by the Centre since its inception.

1st National Confab on Alarammomi: BUK Indigent Qur'anic Science Students Get Jifatu Scholarship
