



## Intensify the Fight Against Corruption Without Fear or Favour, IIIT Confab Urges FG

Participants at the two – day Conference on Islam in Nigeria (COIN) have commended the efforts of the present administration's fight against corruption, and urged it to intensify the campaign without fear or favour, in both public and private sectors.

These were part of the resolutions/recommendations of the communiqué issued at the end of a two-day conference organized by the Islamic Welfare Foundation, Ilorin, in collaboration with the International Institute of Islamic Thought (IIIT) Nigeria, which took place at the Mahmud Tukur Lecture Theatre, BUK Old Campus, from 7<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2016. The communiqué was jointly signed by Professor Salisu Shehu, National Coordinator, International Institute of Islamic Thought, and Aliu Badmus, National Coordinator, Islamic Welfare Foundation.

The participants called on the Nigerian Supreme Council for Islamic Affairs (NSCIA) to collaborate with other Muslim organizations and embark on massive awareness campaigns against corruption in the country. It also urged Muslim professional organizations to take all necessary measures within their powers to protect the image of Islam and Muslims as well as advised all Muslims, both leaders and

followers at all levels, to desist from corrupt practices.

The participants equally called upon Muslims to always abide by the teachings of Islam in their daily affairs to serve as role models to others and stated that 'the fight

against corruption should start from our homes.' It said Muslim religious leaders should find more effective ways of inculcating Islamic values in the society.

The conference called on the law enforcement agencies to, in conjunction with courts, apply appropriate legal measures to exterminate corrupt practices so as to serve as deterrent to others. It also advised the country to always collaborate with other countries and organizations to strengthen its efforts to restore her image in the comity of nations.
