The Centre for Dryland Agriculture, Bayero University, Kano has conducted a three-week intensive training on Hatching (spawning) of African Catfish (Clarias Gariepinus) Breeding Management Techniques aimed at alleviating poverty, creating job opportunities and providing an atmosphere conducive for employment generation through a simple application of technology.

August, 2016 and thirty eight (38) female participants from five (5) local governments of Kano Metropolitan, Gwale, Fagge, Kumbotso, Tarauni and Ungogo were in attendance.

The participants were exposed to practical aspects of site selection and pond construction and spawning and breading management of African cat fish, as well as feeding formulation.

Commissioning the vehicles on Thursday 8th September, 2016, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said the new modern vehicles would assist the University in the efforts at recycling the waste for other usage.

According to him, the vehicles were more economical in terms of serving their purposes as with the capacity to take as much as 8 tons of garbage at once, and compact it.

Professor Yahuza said it was the desire of his administration to acquire more vehicles in that region of West and Central Africa.

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture, Bayero University, Kano in collaboration with ICRISAT and other partners is organizing an international workshop titled "Future Resilient Future Systems for Semi-Arid West Africa."

The workshop will be hosted by the CDA from 27th to 29th September, 2016. It has the objectives of identifying the present and future drivers of croplivestock systems value chains, as well as appropriate technologies for future resilient croplivestock systems in the face of increasing human and livestock populations in the West and Central Africa WCA.

The workshop will provide an avenue for stakeholders to review, consolidate and chart pathways for ensuring the resilience of farming systems of the different agro-ecologies of semi-arid

It is expected that the lead and invited papers would address the functioning and or integration of the drivers of resilience and the components of effective technology packaging and delivery with the overall aim of increasing the production and productivity of the farming systems. In addition, the presentations 3) and discussions will provide an avenue for prioritizing research, extension, policy and options for funding to attain large-scale impact across the region.

National Identity Management **Commission: Notification** for **NIM Enrolment**

The National Identity Management Commission (NIMC) was mandated by Act Number 23 of 2007 to among other things establish a National Identity Management System (NIMS). The process involves enrolment of Nigerians into the National Identity Database and the issuance of a National Identity Number (NIM).

The Mandatory use of NIM will soon be set for all transactions in Nigeria requiring identity verification. In essence, the NIM will soon be used for:

- 1. Obtaining National E-ID card
- 2. Agricultural Subsidy



- 3. Travelling
- 4. Opening of Bank Account
- 5. Getting our Drivers Licence
- 6. Obtaining your Voters Card
- 7. NHIS
- 8. Tax Payment and so on.

Miscellaneous Problems in English Usage (5) With Sheriff Ahmed

• "The third floor comprises of the director's office and that of the two deputy directors."

The problem with the sentence has to do with 'comprises of'. It should be noted that the preposition 'of' collocates with 'comprise' only if it is preceded by a *linking verb*, as in examples (a) and (b) below:

- a. The committee **is comprised of** three academic and three administrative staff.
- b. The state houses of assembly are comprised of only one chamber.
- c. The third floor **comprises** the office of the director and that of the two deputy directors.

In example (c) the preposition 'of' is dropped because 'comprise' is not preceded by a linking verb. Note that 'comprise' and 'consist of' are concerned with a whole having a number of parts. They are used in the active voice, with the whole as their subject and the parts as their object:

- d. The house comprises three bedrooms, a bathroom, a kitchen and a living room.
- e. The meal **consisted** of several small dishes that everybody dipped into and shared.

If some rather than all the parts are mentioned, 'include' may be used instead:

f. The house includes a kitchen and a living room on the first floor.

'Compose' and 'constitute' are concerned with parts making up a whole. 'Compose' is normally used in the passive, and 'constitute' in the active:

- g. The team **is composed of** several experts in the field.
- h. The following commodities **constitute** the average household diet.
- He said he was greatful to the President for the opportunity afforded him to serve his motherland.

The word 'greatful' is strange in the English lexicon. The intended word is *grateful*. Note that 'great' is an adjective; it does not require '-ful'.

Correct: He said he was grateful to the President...
