BUK Spends N87.812 Million Naira in Conferences & Study Fellowships in Six Months - VC

he Vice Chancellor Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said, between February to July 2017, Bayero University spent N87.812million naira to sponsor its Teaching and Non-teaching staff to attend conferences. For 193 members of the Teaching staff N81,827,620 was spent, while N5,984,380 was expended on 45 Non-teaching staff. Within the same period, 80 teaching and 95 non-teaching staff were sponsored for study fellowships.

Nigeria's Prospect in Stem Cell Therapy is Bright If ... Prof. Abba Zubair By: Lamara Garba

igeria and, indeed, developing nations could do much better in Stem Cell therapy in managing and curing ailments, such as sickle cell, stroke, heart diseases and musculoskeletal conditions if only it can tap and properly exploit the wasted blood such as cord blood and bone marrow, a renowned medical scientist based in the United States, Professor Abba Zubair Chedi, has revealed.

He said following growing increase in human organs failure, across the world, medical scientists in advanced economies have discovered a therapy aimed at addressing the lingering predicament by evolving the use of stem cell to repair and regenerate tissues and organs in human body.

Speaking at the 43rd Annual General Meeting/Scientific Conference of the Nigerian Society of Haematology and Blood Transfusion (NSHBT) held at Bristol Palace

Hotel, Kano on Tuesday, 22st August, 2017, in a paper titled "*Stem Cell Transplant in Nigeria: Prospects and Challenges*," Professor Abba Chedi, a 2013 NASA award winner and a leading expert in Stem Cell in Space, disclosed that according to UN Survey by the year 2050, the population of people in Africa aged 65 and older would nearly double. As a result, the incidence of age related diseases, such as dementia, neurodegenerative diseases, stroke and cancer would continue to increase.

The guest speaker, who is also the Medical Director of one of the largest private clinics on Transfusion and Stem Cell Transplant, Mayo Clinic, Jacksonville, Florida, United States of America, noted that currently the only effective method to treat such diseases and/or failed organs was to replace it through organ transplant and there were no enough organs to take care of patients on the waiting list, hence, the discoveries of using stem cells to repair and regenerate tissues and organs. "Given

the necessary political will, commitment and experts in the field, Nigeria, in particular, will do well in Stem Cell therapy, particularly if the country could utilize the unquantifiable cord blood during deliveries and bone marrow, which we ignorantly waste."

Earlier, the President of the Nigerian Society of Haematology and Blood Transfusion, Professor A. S Akanmu, told the gathering that the society was established about 45 years ago However, this was the first time it converged in Kano in all these years. He disclosed that participants were drawn from the United States of America, Canada, India, Germany, Egypt, Turkey, Ghana, New Zealand and United Kingdom, among other countries.

The Emir of Kano, Malam Muhammad Sanusi II, in his remarks said education was the key to unlocking the prosperity of any society or nation. "Only education can transform the society as well as transform the individual." "Development," he further said "is not


about building roads or bridges but, we need to invest in education and everything will sail through."

He passionately appealed to Nigerians in diasporas to equally remember their home and give their contributions towards building the society through the establishment of research centres and the promotion of knowledge. Specifically, he appealed to Professor Abba to support Bayero University and Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital in establishing a Stem Cell centre in order to start the programme here in Kano. The conference was attended by the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), Professor Sagir Abbas. Kano Governor was represented by the Executive Secretary of the State Action Committee Against HIV/AIDS, the Chief Medical Director of Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital, Professor Muhammad Zakari Aminu and the Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Professor Sani Usman Alhassan.
