



Teaching and Non-teaching Staff Partners ...Says Registrar

The Registrar, Hajiya Fatima Bintu Mohammed, has said that, in administering the affairs of a University system in Nigeria, every staff member, irrespective of his schedule of duty has a defined statutory role in advancing the mission of the institution, thus the issue of “inferiority” or “superiority” between teaching and non-teaching members does not arise as they are partners complementing each other.

Delivering a paper titled “The Role of Non-Teaching staff in the Administration of the Nigerian Universities” at the maiden edition of the BUK branch of the Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU) Week on Friday 28th July, 2017 at Mahmud Tukur Theatre, she explained that both teaching and Non-teaching staff assigned to specific functions in the university structure and are jointly responsible for the realization of the aims and objective of the university system.

“One would be living in a fool's paradise to think that non-teaching staff play second fiddle to the academic staff with regard to the university system”, she explained, adding that “put differently, do not ever consider yourselves as 'inferior'. No, this is not true, this is false proposition. What is important is mutual cooperation and respect for one another in the course of carrying out our responsibilities.”

Hajiya Fatima further stated that: “You and I are non-teaching staff by choice, just as the other person is academic staff by choice.”

The Registrar while acknowledging the various

contributions of the members of all University Community towards development of a University, restated that the role of non-teaching staff in the administration of Nigerian Universities is immeasurable. Accordingly, she said the non-teaching staff were sub-divided into some categories which included administrative, non-administrative and technical staff. They are involved in other functions which enabled the university to achieve its fundamental goals of teaching, research and community service.

She equally disclosed that staff motivation has been a key to success in any organization and in this respect, the management of the university had set out some policies and programmes aimed at boosting the morale of the staff. In particular, she said manpower development has been one of her priority projects and so far, over 200 staff were sponsored to various programmes, including full time academic courses, partial sponsorship as well as conferences, workshops and seminars within and outside the country.

In the same vein, the management had approved sabbatical for senior non-teaching staff, and already three staff members have gone for a one year sabbatical in other universities.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, in his key note address, commended the resilient posture of the university's non-teaching staff, which he said had been tremendously assisting the management towards actualizing its dream of becoming a centre of excellence.

Faculty of Communication Awards 37 Scholarships

The Faculty of Communication has awarded scholarships to 37 indigent female students as part of a grand design to assist the less privileged.

Speaking at the award ceremony on Wednesday 26th July, 2017, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, commended the Faculty for its foresight and innovative thinking which resulted in securing a grant from an international organization of repute.

“I am very much sure this grant was won by the Faculty due to its sound proposal, hard work and dedication of the Dean and his team.” Indeed, the staff of the Faculty are making the university proud in postgraduate studies particularly in timely and early graduation of students.

The Vice Chancellor said the Faculty of Communication has set the pace in the provision of postgraduate resource rooms aimed at creating an enabling environment for PG students.

Professor Bello said the university has equipped reading rooms in the hostels with creature comforts and solar power to enable students to read at all times. He noted that already the new hostels in the New Campus were equipped and the rest will soon be equipped towards making the university a world class in research and learning.

The Vice Chancellor, while congratulating the beneficiaries of the scholarship, urged them to make judicious use of the funds with a view to enhancing their academic performance.

Earlier, the Dean of the Faculty, Professor Umaru A. Pate, stated that the scholarship award was part of the \$700,000 grant awarded to the Faculty by the MacArthur Foundation. The awardees include 30 female undergraduate students and 7 female postgraduate

students.

Twenty of the beneficiaries are from Mass Communication Department, 10 are from the Department of Information and Media Studies and the remaining 7 are postgraduate students of Mass Communication. The scholarship is aimed at supporting female students to pursue their dreams while enhancing their welfare and academic performance. The scholarship program will be running for the next three years.

According to the Dean, the Faculty will continue to give thesis support grants for male and female postgraduate students. This is one of the activities to be carried out by the Faculty, others include sponsoring undergraduate students for internship in different media organisations, equipping the new campus radio station with modern gadgets, and equipping of the Faculty computer laboratory as well as sponsoring of staff whose abstracts are accepted to attend conferences and trainings in any part of the world.

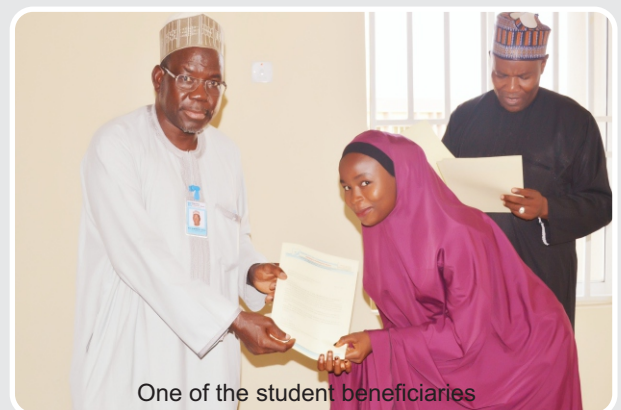
