Kano State Govt. Offers to Fund Agric Researches in BUK

ano State Government has assured Bayero University Kano that it was ready and committed to fund agricultural researches and promote the application of innovative technologies and utilisation of research outcomes.

The State Commissioner for Agriculture, Alhaji Nasir Yusuf Gawuna, gave the assurance on Monday, 10th July, 2017, while addressing the participants at the opening ceremony of three International Training Workshops organized by the Centre for Dryland Agriculture, (CDA). The International Training Workshops were on *Modeling Organic and Green Agriculture* in collaboration with the Faculty of Agriculture, BUK and Organic Agricultural Project Tertiary Institutions in Nigeria (OAPTIN); The Applications of Remote Sensing and the Geographical Information Systems in Agriculture in partnership with ICRISAT and the Statistics and Data Analysis for capacity building. The Workshops were scheduled to run from the 10th to the 22nd of July, 2017.

Alhaji Gawuna said that promotion of agricultural development was the topmost priority of Kano State Government. He noted that the Federal Government had accorded the sector the needed attention in view of its

significant contribution in the Nigerian economy.

"We are ready to partner with the Centre for Dryland Agriculture and other stakeholders to fund agricultural researches to address the daunting challenges of unemployment, poverty and food insecurity," the Commissioner assured.

According to him, the State Government had invested much to improve the sector, especially in view of the current economic challenges facing the country.

"Kano State Government is ever willing to fund researches and promote the application of innovations in all aspects of agriculture in order to facilitate the improvement of productivity and to address the challenges of food insecurity," the Commissioner said. He explained that the State Government was committed to partnering with the CDA and other stakeholders in conducting research, training and the dissemination of research findings.

Alhaji Gawuna appreciated the role of the Centre for Dryland Agriculture, for its foresight in conducting researches and organizing international seminars and workshops aimed at addressing challenges of food insecurity not only in Nigeria but also in Africa.

20th Professorial Inaugural Lecture: Return to Nature for Your Medications - Prof. S.Y. Mudi By Sabitu M. Jinjiri

Bayero University academic, Prof. Suleiman products." Yusuf Mudi, has called for return to drugs derived from natural products, such as plants, in treating multifarious diseases. This is so because there is "no doubt that plants are among the most perfect natural laboratories for the synthesis of various molecules ranging from simple skeleton to highly complex chemical structures...."

The Professor, who is an organic chemist with specialization in natural products drug discovery, was delivering Bayero University's 20th Professorial Inaugural Lecture at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium on Thursday, 7th July, 2017.

According to him, one of the purposes of the lecture was

"to give the general public an idea on the importance of utilizing natural products from plants for treatment of ailments." Another purpose of the lecture was to "give an inspiration on how natural products chemistry can be utilized in developing herbal remedies and related to put more grease to their elbows so as to beat time.

He equally believed that natural products were still effective in terms of "providing their fair share of new clinical candidates and drugs" at the expense of hitches and competition from other drug discovery methods.

In connection with researches carried out by the professor in conjunction with his colleagues and students between 2008 and 2016, some pure compounds isolated from certain plants were shown to have efficacy in treating malaria and to have promising activity against food borne pathogens, ulcers, pneumonia and other respiratory tract infections.

On cancer treatment, Professor Mudi disclosed that "plants and plant-derived products" had proved to be

> both safe and useful in managing and treating cancers and revealed that, to date, they had isolated thirteen compounds with promising anti-cancer activity.

> The also called on Bayero University to provide synergy between traditional herbalists and scientific researchers so as to deal with the risks involving the method of consuming herbal remedies for treatment.

> Earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, informed the lecture attendants that the 20th Professorial Inaugural Lecture had been organized by one of the newest faculties in the

CDA Organises Three International Training Workshops

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) has organised three international training workshops that are concurrently taking place at the Centre, which commenced on Monday 10th July, 2017.

Two of the workshops, *The 2nd International Advanced* Training Programme on Organic and Green Agriculture, organised in partnership with the Faculty of Agriculture, BUK in collaboration with the Organic Agricultural Project Tertiary Institutions in Nigeria (OAPTIN) and The Application of Remote Sensing and Geographical Information System in Agriculture, being held in partnership with the International Crops International resource persons at one of the CDA conferences



Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT) are expected to end on 15th July, 2017, while the *International Capacity Building Training on Statistics and Data Analysis* organised by the centre will last till 22nd July, 2017.

Declaring the Workshops open, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration), Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, challenged the participants to make good use of the trainings to impact positively on research, training and agricultural development. He expressed optimism that the problems of rising population, food insecurity, poverty and political insecurity in the West and Central African countries would be surmountable if the diverse stakeholders, especially in the field of agriculture, worked to address the challenges of low productivity and non-sustainable use of resources.

He argued that with high calibre human resource and investments in research, training and outreach, Nigeria and other countries of West and Central Africa would

attain food security and sustainable economic development. He further charged the CDA to continue working with stakeholders to attain this goal.

Earlier in his opening remarks, the Director of CDA, Prof Jibrin M. Jibrin, represented by the Deputy Director, Training, Professor S. G Mohammed, said resource persons were drawn from diverse backgrounds and countries including India, Kenya and Ghana.

According to the Director, the trainings were organised to achieve the goal of the CDA at developing high capacity human resources for agricultural development in the dryland countries of West and Central Africa. He observed that the resource persons were seasoned professionals in their fields expected to transfer skills that were most needed by the participants for quality research, innovations, outreach and publications.

The participants were drawn from Universities, Colleges of Agriculture, research institutes, Ministries, departments and higher institutions of learning, as well as faculties and departments in BUK.

Professor Sharubutu explained that going through the thematic areas and stakeholders involved, there is no specific area that organic agriculture is mentioned. However, stakeholders in organic agriculture can key into

Be On Alert, Urges Director of Security

ecent trend in the University Campuses has indicated a disturbing pattern of theft in offices, residential quarters and vehicles. Some of these notorious activities occur without breaking or forceful b. During prayer times, at least one or two supporting entry. Others that involve burglary are executed with the active connivance of some members of the University Community residing in the Campuses by virtue of family relationship ties, casual employment, etc. Some of the culprits involved aimed at prayer times (Fair, Zuhr, Asr) when people are away from offices/residences. In most instances, the criminals resort to the use of master-keys and other gadgets to gain access into residences, offices and vehicles. Similarly, access keys to Offices, Laboratories and Theatres are retained by several persons who compromised the need for effective control, thus enabling ill-intentioned persons to breach the integrity of the structure and render it vulnerable to all forms of security breach.

A letter signed by Muhammad Babba Dan-Agundi, Captain (NN) Rtd, Director Security said generally, the problems of security breach cannot be solved by security personnel alone. Thus, it is important that other wellmeaning members of the University community join hands in countering the menace of burglary, vandalism, larceny, impersonation, arson, colluding with criminals and several other vices in the Campus premises. In view of the foregoing, the following security tips are recommended for adoption:

a. Staff/Student Identification checks should be intensified by all concerned, especially when

- encountering strange faces. Don't take chances whenever you are in doubt about a person's identity in any circumstance.
- staff should be designated to watch over access control and offices.
- c. Avoid several duplications of Main Entrance keys to residences, Departments and offices. Also limit the persons entitled to hold same.
- d. Avoid using non certified artisans to carryout replacement jobs, especially on access control doors.
- Proper vetting of house-helps and office supporting staff should be adopted prior to employing their services. Under-aged employment should be avoided.
