33rd Convocation Lecture: Don Proffers Solutions to Economic Recession By Nura Garba

There is good news that Nigeria will soon exit the economic recession that has seriously hampered socio-economic activities in the nation and affected almost every segment of the society.

A Professor of Economics and Director General, West African Institute for Financial and Economic Management, Lagos, Akpan H. Ekpo, has proffered solutions that would lead the country to the path of economic recovery and positive transformations.

Speaking at the 33rd Convocation Lecture of BUK on Friday, 17th March, 2017, at the Convocation Arena, in his paper titled: **The Nigerian Economy: Current Recession and Beyond**, Professor Ekpo described poor governance, lack of diversification of economy, low agricultural output, weak foreign direct investment and high inflation rate as some of the factors that caused the economic recession.

Prof. Ekpo who traced the Nigeria's economic situation to the registration of democratic rule in 1999 averred that the country depended largely in the revenue

There is good news that Nigeria will soon exit the generated from crude oil. This, he said, had negatively economic recession that has seriously hampered socio-affected other economic sectors.

He suggested that education and economic diversification should be used as the keys to addressing the economic recession. He added that in any country's development matrix, education, economic diversification and self-reliance are the key significant variables.

Prof. Ekpo stressed that how the leadership, policy makers and technocrats maximize these crucial variables would determine the country's speed towards not just economic development but also towards the commitment to poverty reduction.

He advocated the need for counter-cyclical spending and investment, higher spending on agriculture and manufacturing, facilitation of teaching skills and acquisition for enhanced entrepreneurship as some of the strategic factors that would lead the country to exit economic recession.

Responding on behalf of the traders, Alhaji Abdulkadir Bala Madigawa from Muhammadu Abubakar Rimi Market (Sabon Gari Market), expressed profound appreciation to the University for this laudable initiative. He said, certainly the programme is a noble cause, which

COREN Accredits Mechatronics, Chemical & Petroleum Engineering Programmes

The visitation panel, which was at the university from 12th to 16th February, conferred Full Accreditation Status

> on Mechatronics Engineering while Chemical Engineering and Petroleum Engineering passed Pre-Accreditation Status.

> According to the Registrar of COREN, Engineer W. Kamila Maliki, FNSE, mni the effective date of the accreditation is 16th February, 2017. He pointed out that Full Accreditation is valid for five years (that is mechatronic programme), while passed Pre-Accreditation Status is valid for two years (for Petrochemical and Chemical Engineering). So the validity period for Mechatronics programme commenced from February 2017 to February 2022, while for Chemical and Petroleum Engineering is from February 2017 to February 2019.

> He said there would be random visits to the University within the period to check on the state of facilities and that accreditation might

be withdrawn if there is clear evidence of falling standards.


