## BUK Nigeria's Incubator of Investigative Journalists

Bayero University's Faculty of Communication has been described as the Nigeria's hub for the production of the much-needed investigative journalists in the country.

This was made known by the Publisher of the Nigeria's leading investigative journalism online medium, the Premium Times, Mr. Dapo Olurunyomi, at the 10th Global Investigative Journalism Conference held between 16th and 19th November, 2017 at the University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, South Africa.

He said Bayero University, Kano and the Lagos State University were the only academic institutions of higher learning in Nigeria that had programmes on Investigative Journalism embedded in their curricula at undergraduate and/or postgraduate levels.

Mr. Dapo said Bayero University's Investigative Journalism programme was the golden standard for investigative reporting in Nigeria. "It was by far the most ambitious in terms of its preparedness, commitment and resources dedicated to it".

The University, through the Faculty of Communication, was adequately represented at the Conference by four lecturers in the Department of Mass Communication. The delegation was led by the Deputy Dean of the Faculty, who is also the Head of the Mass Communication Department, Dr. Suleiman Mainasara Yar'adua.

Other members of the team included the Deputy Dean Student Affairs and a Senior Lecturer at the Department, Dr. Hajara Umar Sanda, the Faculty of Communication's Sub-Dean Facilities, Dr. Mainasara

Yakubu Kurfi and Umar Jibrilu Gwandu.

In their welcome address, the Executive Director of the Global Investigative Journalism Network, David Kaplan, and Caxton Professor of Journalism, University of Witwatersrand in Johannesburg, South Africa said at a time the world was divulged with "challenging autocrats, purveyors of fake news and expanding criminal class, investigative journalists are on the job in a hundred countries...It is a fine example of how determined and courageous reporters could call to account the most powerful individuals and institutions.

"The Conference, in fact, is designed to encourage you to network, collaborate and learn new skills. It was put together by journalists, with emphasis on training and sharing... We are particularly pleased that the 10th global gathering has come in Africa for the first time. We have packed the programme, ranging from basics to cutting-edge technology, as well as some terrific special events said David Kaplan," he said.

The Global Investigative Journalism Conference is the world's largest international gathering, which is held every two years. It started in Copenhagen in 2001. This year's conference was attended by over 1,200 investigative journalists, newspaper editors, professionals from media-related institutes, journalism scholars and communication researchers from 130 different countries.

The conference attracted supports from 18 donors, 32 co-sponsors, and 280 speakers. Sessions included Academic, General Interest, Multi-media/broadcast, Non-profit and New Models, Data Journalism, Business/Finance, Safety & Security, Networking, and Special Events, among others.
