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NUC Verification Teams Visit BUK to Evaluate 8 New Programmes

esource Verification Teams from National Universities Commission (NUC) visited Bayero University, Kano last week to evaluate eight newly introduced academic programmes.

The programmes are: BSc Forensic Science; BSc Meteorology, B.Eng Automotive Engineering; BSc Taxation and BSc Environmental Health Sciences. Other are B.Ed Early Childhood Education; Doctor of Veterinary Medicine and B.Ed Primary Education.

Speaking on behalf of the 8 teams, the leader of Primary Education team, Professor Muhammad M. Jagaba, commended Bayero University for having eight new programmes being assessed at once, calling other universities in Nigeria to emulate the giant stride. He said it would improve access and give young Nigerians choices on many disciplines.

Professor Jagaba, who was from Usman Danfodio University, Sokoto, stated that the teams came to add value to what BUK is doing and would strive hard to

proffer far-reaching recommendations that would strengthen the commencement of the eight new programmes.

According to him, the teams were happy to be associated with this epoch-making event and that history would never forget them as those who verified the new programmes.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, in his remarks, said the University always welcomes verification teams as they would help the system to improve beyond what was earlier established.

He explained that the University would accept all the observations and recommendations and was ready to implement them as soon as possible.

"The beauty of University system is that we assess ourselves and members accept what has been observed. Almost everybody here will one day come back either as external examiner or member of accreditation team," said the Vice Chancellor.

BUK Holds Hausa Quiz Competition, As FCE Emerges 1st

Federal College of Education (FCE), Kano emerged first in a Hausa Language quiz conducted by Hausa Students Organization of Nigeria and Global Hausa People's Voice on 10th December, 2020. The occasion, which was sponsored by Kano State's Deputy Governor, Dr. Nasir Yusuf Gawuna, was held at Bayero University's Convocation Arena.

At the end of the competition, FCE Kano, Bayero University, Kano and Aminu Kano College of Islamic and

Legal Studies, took the first, second and third positions, respectively. The three participating tertiary institutions received prizes of N500,000, N300,000 and N200,000 according to their positions at the end of the quiz. Other participating institutions were given N100,000 each.

Speaking at the occasion, Kano State Deputy Governor, Dr. Gawuna expressed the readiness of Kano State to collaborate with any school or organization when it comes to advancing the Hausa Language in the world. "For this reason, I sincerely and heartily welcome this kind of event and any other possible event aimed at advancing the Hausa Language. Indeed, this language has its unique impact on the peoples of the world", Dr. Gawuna remarked.

Also speaking at the quiz, the Director of the University's Centre for Research in Nigerian Language, Folklore and Translation (CRNLF and T), Professor Aliyu Mu'azu, revealed that the Hausa Language is a language that is impacting on the world. He, however, lamented that the Hausa People were not doing enough towards advancing the language. Professor Mu'azu cited instances of situations in which the Hausa People will not prefer to speak the native language, but will love to speak other languages instead.

According to Prof Mu'azu, it is this neglect of their native language by Hausa people that prompted his centre to translate textbooks on Chemistry and Physics into Hausa language. According to him, the rationale behind the translation was to encourage our youths to learn and teach the subjects with ease. He said they had realized that the earlier language of instruction (English) was the source of students' difficulty in comprehension, not the knowledge to be acquired.

In his address, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, represented by Professor Hafiz Miko Yakasai, called on governments in the country to always provide schools, institutions and organizations with what they need to boost the learning and teaching of Hausa

Language. According to Prof Abbas, absence of such learning and teaching materials in schools is a stumbling block to the upliftment and advancement of the Hausa Language.

Prof Abbas added that Bayero University was ready to join hands together with Kano State Government in capacity building for the state's primary and secondary school teachers. He said such training will expose the trainees to modern techniques of teaching students the Hausa language with all ease.

He called on the state governments to sit up and consider accepting the subject textbooks translated into Hausa.

Mambayya House Takes Anti-Corruption Crusade to Secondary School Pupils By Adamu Garba

The Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies (Mambayya House) in conjunction with Interfaith Network Against Corruption (INAC) has conducted a one-day Anti-Corruption sensitization workshop for leaders of anti-corruption clubs from selected secondary school pupils in Northern Nigeria in an effort to strengthen the capacity of students for effective management in the areas of leadership, accountability, transparency, ethics and conflict resolution.

The workshop, which held on Saturday, 12th December, 2020, tagged: **Training for Officials of Anti-Corruption Clubs in Selected Secondary Schools in Northern Nigeria** and supported by John D. and Catherine T. McArthur Foundation, was part of a 3-year MacArthur Foundation Grant awarded to Mambayya House from January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2020 to carry out a range of anti-corruption activities using faith-based platforms in Northern Nigeria.

While presenting his paper titled: Leadership Skills for Effective Club Administration, the Director of Mambayya House, Professor Ismaila Mohammed Zango, stated that the workshop was aimed at training the participants on how leadership can be used to manage the anti-corruption clubs formed in various secondary schools.

He opined that the success of any club depends on the level of cohesion and cooperation among the members, adding that, the ability of the leader to mobilize is very important. He urged the participants to make good use of the qualities discussed so as to enhance the effectiveness of clubs.

In his presentation titled: **The Effects of Corruption on Nigeria and Nigerians**, the Deputy
Director (Training), Mambayya House, Dr. Samaila
Suleiman, exposed the participants to some repulsive
images of dilapidated schools, hospitals, roads as well
as insecurity challenges to illustrate the damage
corruption has done to our national development.

He posited that the greatest threat to our national survival is corruption. He argued that "when monies meant for building schools, hospitals, roads and provision of security are stolen, the country would be exposed to all kinds of dangers; insecurity, poverty, disease, death and general lack of development."

Similarly, the Deputy Director (R & T), Dr. Kabiru

Bello, in his presentation titled: **Basic Conflict Resolution Methods for School Clubs**, posited that conflict is inevitable which can be found even in the anti-corruption clubs formed by the INAC. He, therefore, recommended that conflict resolution can practically be implemented by peer mediators in the best interest of all members so as to achieve progress in whatever aspect of the disagreement.

On his part, Catholic Bishop of Kano Diocese, Right Reverend John Namaza Niyiring, spoke on the dangerous ills of corruption from the Christian perspective.

He admonished the pupils to refrain from examination malpractice and report any wrongdoings or act of dishonesty by their classmates or siblings to their teachers and parents.

He spoke on Monday 21st December, 2020 in his office when he received members of the Bayero University Staff Primary School Old Pupils Association who paid him a courtesy visit, Professor Abbas lamented the poor The Vice Chancellor, who frowned at the way and manner the society became so adamant in the area of proper investment in the sector, pointed out that the burden was too heavy for government alone to shoulder.

"In my opinion, all these insurgency, kidnapping and other vices which are now threatening our survival as a nation were the resultant effect of the long neglect of the education sector," pointing out that unless urgent action is taken for proper investment in the sector, what we are witnessing now would be a child's play in the next 15 to 20

years to come.

Professor Abbas commended the foresight of the association and explained that in many developed nations their Colleges and Universities are being wholly funded by Alumni associations.

He promised to give all the necessary support and cooperation to the association so as to regain back the past glory of the school. It is unfortunate that our people do not have the character of paying back. We all know that without education the society is doomed.

Earlier speaking, the team leader, Professor Muhammad Sani Mijinyawa, said the association was formed with the intention to pay back to their alma-mata. He said already the association was registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission

Commission.

Professor Mijinyawa also revealed that the old pupils association would on 29th December, 2020 hold its 50th anniversary. He also said plans are underway by the association to undertake a general renovation of the

Bayero University Awarded the Higher Education Partnership for Sub-Saharan Africa (HEP SSA) 2021 Grant by the Royal Academy of Engineering, United Kingdom

A team of Bayero University researchers successfully participated in the competition for the 20/21 HEP SSA grant and secured a funding to the tune of Nineteen Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-Two Pounds (GBP 19,842.00). The project titled "Application of Anaerobic Digestion Technology for Tannery Effluent Treatment in GB Tannery Limited, Kano, Nigeria," is to be implemented over a period December 2020 to June 2021.
