An erudite legal practitioner, Nasir Abdu Dangiri, Senior Advocate of Nigeria, (SAN), said that the life of a lawyer is that of service to humanity, hard work and diligence, rooted in respect and seniority. He advised them to always preserve the notes given to them by their lecturers, because they will come handy when the need for them arises.

While addressing students at a one-day mentorship programme organized by the Faculty of Law, Bayero University, Kano on Tuesday 11th February, 2020 at Moot Court of the Faculty, Nasir Abdu Dangiri, advised the law students to cultivate the habit of going to the library to read law reports from the beginning

to the end so as to be versatile in their chosen career.

The mentoring program was meant to encourage the aspiring lawyers and navigate them through the nitty - gritty aspects of law practice in Nigeria and the courses at the Nigerian Law School.

He also advised them to always appear neat. According to him, judges don't listen to dirty looking lawyers. He also disclosed that most shabby looking lawyers are disorganized and lack confidence.

The Senior Advocate of Nigeria urged the students to be proactive and up to date and also admonished them to be careful when handling cases because clients rely on the judgements of lawyers.

Malam Nasir Dangiri while answering a question from a student who wanted to know why Maritime Law is not practiced in the North unlike in the South, he said the peculiarities of a region determine the cases that

arise in that particular region, adding that Atlantic Ocean can only be found in the Southern part of Nigeria hence, the reason for the Maritime Law practice there.

Earlier, the Dean of the Faculty of Law, Professor Usman Shuaib, in his remarks, thanked Malam Nasir Dangiri for finding time out of his busy schedule to come and give the lecture. He advised the students to get their facts right before appearing in court and to be composed and not to get intimidated.

Professor Shuaib disclosed that the review of the Law



curriculum is ongoing so as to get the best out of students. He also hinted that the body of Senior Advocates of Nigeria is making efforts to institutionalize bursary awards to the best law students who pass through Law School.

AFMC Holds 3rd Sensitization Lectures for University Cleaners

Porters and Cleaners are not only important segment of the University, but are also indispensible in the smooth operation of academic and administrative activities. This was disclosed by the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahua Bello.

The Vice Chancellor who was represented the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academics, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko was speaking at the Sensitization Lectures for Supervisors, Porters and Cleaners organized by the Academic Facilities Maintenance Committee (AFMC) which took place at the Convocation Arena on Thursday 6th February, 2020.

He commended the Committee for organizing the lectures which he said was aimed at sensitizing and reminding the supervisors, porters and cleaners the task ahead of them, saying that the Management was happy with such initiative, and hoped that the participants would make use of the opportunity to imbibe the culture of attitudinal change and do their assignments conscientiously.

Professor Tanko also disclosed that Management in her magnanimous gestures had not long ago

absorbed/converted some of the porters and cleaners who have been working in the University for so many years as casual workers into permanent and pensionable staff, adding that this magnanimous disposition should have been reciprocated with dedication to duty, and not otherwise.

He charged the participants to open their ears and listen attentively to all the advice given by previous speakers and the ones to come from subsequent speakers, assuring that 'if you work with such advice and carry out your assigned duties with the fear of Allah, the rewards would be two folds for you, one here on earth and the other in the hereafter, which is the most important.'

The DVC hoped that the Committee would continue to hold this kind of lecture, and also called on other committees to emulate the good work of the Academic Facilities Maintenance Committee (AFMC).

Earlier, the Chairman of the Committee, Professor Ahmad Murtala, explained the reason why the Committee organized the lecture. He recalled that

on two different occasions, in 2017 and 2018, the Committee held similar sensitization lectures during which it drew the attention of the University porters and cleaners to some observed lapses that have to do with how they carry out their duties.

He admonished them to consider their jobs as a huge thrust and burden on them, saying that the only way out was for them not only to do the work, but also to do it efficiently and in line with the contractual agreement.

The Chairman also reminded the porters and cleaners that the onus of keeping the University environment clean and tidy rests squarely on them, and that 'one day, all of us will be held accountable for our deeds before our creator. If for nothing, this alone should make us stand firm and do our work to the best of our ability,' He assured the porters and cleaners that the Committee would do everything humanly possible to convince the Management to

provide them with working facilities and hoped that they would reciprocate the gesture by doing their job very well.

Professor Murtala also spoke of the efforts the Committee was doing to maintain, replace and rebuild broken down facilities at lecture theatres, classrooms, rest rooms as well as the construction of reading and relaxation areas for both male and female students across the two Campuses of the University.

Others who also spoke are Sub-Dean Facilities of faculties of Education (SCE), Dr. Abdulkadir U. Ismail, Dangote Business School, Dr. Muhammad Baffa Sani and Engineer Salisu Abdulhamid of Directorate of Laboratory Management.

In their comments, some of the cleaners thanked the Management and the Committee for organizing the lectures and hoped that the exercise would be a continuous event.

University Health Services Public Enlightenment/Advisory on Lassa Fever



- 1. Lassa Fever is an acute viral haemorrhagic fever (VHF) caused by the lassa virus. The natural reservoir for the virus is multimammate rat. Other rodents have also been identified to carry the virus.
- 2. Lassa Fever occurs throughout the year but more cases are recorded during the dry season i.e. November through May.
- 3. Lassa Fever is spread through:
- Direct contact with urine, faces, saliva or blood of infected rats.
- Contact with objects, household items and surfaces or eating food, contaminated with urine, faeces, saliva or blood of infected rats.
- Person to Person transmission by contact with blood, urine, faeces, vomitus, semen, vaginal secretions, breast milk or other body fluids of an infected person.
- 4. Sign and Symptoms of Lassa Fever: Lassa Fever presents initially like any other febrile illness such as malaria but accompanied with unexplainable bleeding from ears, eyes, nose, mouth and other body openings.

The time between an infection and appearance of symptoms of the disease is 2 to 21 days. Early treatment and diagnosis increase the chances of survival.

- 5. People most at risk are:
- People of all age groups who come in contact with the urine, faeces, saliva or blood of rats.
- People living in rat-infested environments, which increases their chances of coming in contact with rats.
- People who consume potentially contaminated food stuff especially those left open over-night or dried outside in the open.
- People who handle or process rodents for consumption.
- People who do not observe hand hygiene when appropriate.
- Relatives who take care of sick person with Lassa Fever at home.
- 6. How to prevent yourself from Lassa Fever
- Maintain personal hygiene by, among others, frequent hand washing with soap and water or use of hand sanitizers.
- Store food in containers with lids and discard any food remnants.
- Keep your home and surrounding clean and tidy to discourage rats and other rodents from entering.
- Ensure proper sanitation by, among others, proper waste disposal.
- Cook all food thoroughly.
- Wash fruits thoroughly, vegetables and other food items before consumption.
