Senate to Review the duration of Spillover to Five Semesters

The Senate of Bayero Bayero University has set up a five-man committee to look into the possibility of reviewing the duration of spillover period of five year programmes.

"Upon consideration of a recommendation of SBC to

Senate to look into possibility of reviewing the spill over period in the University from four (4) semesters to five (5) semesters for the five year programmes, Senate approved the formation of a five- man Committee to look into the possibility of adopting 5 semesters for five year programmes in the University," said a statement issued by the Director, DEAR, Hajiya Amina Umar Abdullahi.

The Committee, which was under the chairmanship of the Director of Academic Planning Unit, Professor Bala Sidi Aliyu, has Professor Salisu Danazumi, Prof. Usman Shuaibu, Prof. Ahmad B. Mohammed and Dr. Abdul Iguda as members.

The Committee is expected to finish its assignment and submit report at the next Senate meeting, said the statement.

In a related development, the Senate, in consideration of a report submitted by its Standing Committee on Examinations, Administration and Reporting, upheld its earlier decision of withdrawing three students for lack of merit in their appeal. The students are: Yahaya Adamu Muhammad (SMS/09/GEO/00315; Laido Saudi Muhammad (AIS/12/HIS/00021 and Maimunat



Ibrahim Abdulsalam (AIS/12/ENG/00043). The Senate has also approved the reinstatement of two other candidates to enable them continue with their studies: They are Abdulrazaq Aliyu Gaya (SMS/12/GEO/00012) and Naziru Umar (EDU/10/BAE/01873.

The Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello on Monday, 3rd February, 2020 inaugurated the Industry/ Sectoral Advisory Board of the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) with Hajiya Karimatu Ibrahim Babangida, a Director in the Federal Department of Agriculture, as chairperson of the board.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academics, Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, charged the board members to use their wealth of experience to bear in the Centre's activities and to make it more relevant to the local and regional environments.

He expressed optimism that the contribution of the board would make positive impact on Bayero University and the CDA.

Speaking on behalf of the board members, the Chairperson, Hajiya Karimatu Babangida, expressed her appreciation of the management of Bayero University and CDA for appointing them to steer the affairs of the board.

According to her, climate change has affected agricultural activities negatively especially in the dryland areas, noting that the areas could turn this challenge into opportunities and become food baskets of the world.

The Chairperson stated that another area which the board would give priority was entrepreneurship in agriculture, in which students will be well prepared for industries before their graduation so that the existing gap will be bridged.

She emphasized that the board would do everything

within its powers to guide the CDA to achieve its mandate.

Speaking earlier, the Director, CDA, Professor Jibrin M. Jibrin, said inaugurating the board was part of the World Bank's requirement that the activities of the Africa Centres of Excellence (ACEs) must be aligned with the industries.

The Director noted that since the establishment of CDA in 2012, the University Management had the wisdom of designing a strategy of linking the activities of the Centre with industries. He said the CDA was lucky to have such technocrats to be at the helm of its industry board.

Malaysian Firm Donates Boreholes to BUK's Neighboring Communities

A Malaysian firm, Diversatech Fertilizer, has, through the intervention of the management of Bayero University, Kano, donated mechanized boreholes to two communities in the neighborhood of the University.



The multi-million naira water projects which were situated at Lengel Dididi and Doka villages in Tofa Local Government Area were aimed at alleviating the sufferings of the members of the communities in respect of provision of potable water.

Commissioning the projects, on Friday, 31st January, 2020, the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), Professor Adamu Idris Tanko, explained that the project was a philanthropic gesture from one of foreign friends of the University.

Professor Tanko pointed out that the firm, Diversatech, was based in Malaysia and that it had contacted the management of the University for its desire to send a donation for the drilling of the boreholes for use by the needy communities.

"So, when the Firm contacted us telling us their mission, we didn't hesitate to scout around our host communities to look for those in need, and after due consultations, we came to the conclusion that the people of Lengel Dididi and Doka were in dare need of potable water, hence our decision to cite the projects here," said the DVC.

He advised the benefitting communities to ensure proper utilization and maintenance of the facilities with a view to serving the purpose for which they were provided.

The project comprises one million litre overhead water reservoir, a power generator and discharging water taps. The University donated some amount for the servicing and fueling of the generators.

Responding, the Village Head of Lengel, who spoke through *Wakilin Dagaci*, Alhaji Kabiru Idris, expressed delight at the gesture and commended the management of Bayero University, Kano, for considering them to benefit from the project.

Also at Doka Village, *Wakilin Mai Gari*, Alhaji Bashari Ali Doka, was full of praises to the University for the gesture. He said his community would be ready to support and cooperate with the management of the University in order to have a harmonious living.

Among the entourage during the commissioning of the project were the Registrar of the University, Hajiya Fatima Binta Mohammed, the University Librarian, Dr. Musa A. Auyo, representative of the Bursar and the Director of the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin.

SCE, DRIP Organize Workshop on Project Concept Writing

The Department of Education of the School of Continuing Education (SCE) in collaboration with the Directorate of Research Innovation and Partnership (DRIP) Bayero University has successfully organized a workshop on Writing Research Proposal to acquaint academic staff of the Department with the technicalities involved in concept writing.

While delivering the welcome address during the training which held on Thursday, 6th February, 2020 at the Board Room of School of Continuing Education, the Dean, Dr. Lawal Salihu Malumfashi stated that the workshop was in line with the recommendation of the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello who encouraged departments to train their staff on how to source research grants from donor agencies.

The Dean urged the participants to make good use of the

opportunity afforded them and translate the knowledge acquired into practice so as to explore more ways that can improve their researches.

Presenting a paper during the workshop titled *Guidelines* on the Development of Project Concept Note, the Director of DRIP, Professor Ibrahim A. Rufa'i extensively explained the stages and technicalities involved in writing research proposal that can attract intervention of donor agencies within and outside the country.

He said some researchers and scientists are able to secure grants for their research while many others are unable due to poor proposal writing which necessitated such workshop to help them develop skills on effective method of writing research proposals that will attract national, regional and international grants. Such knowledge according to him will promote the transformation of the University to a research driven institution.

He asserted that most funding agencies turn down requests for funding of research from institutions as a result of poor packaging of their research proposals.

Prof. Rufa'i revealed that the workshop was also very valuable since research grants can be a vital source of human development and revenue generation for the University as such he called on University staff to take the issue of research seriously.

The workshop which was highly interactive had a practical group work on writing fundable research proposals, experiences of beneficiaries of research grants, opportunities for researchers, requirements of international donors, research ethics for success and components of acceptable research proposals. The workshop attracted members of academics from the Department of Education and School of Continuing Education.

BUK Fitness Club Seeks Assistance of Sports Directorate, Appoints Director Usman Salihu as Patron

KEEP RODENTS AWAY FOOD PERSONAL HYGIENE HYGIENE PROPER SANITATION Wash hands regularly Cook food properly Keep house and **Block holes and** with soap under and cover food environment clean keep rodents away running water from rodents

- 1. Lassa Fever is an acute viral haemorrhagic fever (VHF) caused by the lassa virus. The natural reservoir for the virus is multimammate rat. Other rodents have also been identified to carry the virus.
- 2. Lassa Fever occurs throughout the year but more cases are recorded during the dry season i.e. November through May.
- 3. Lassa Fever is spread through:
- Direct contact with urine, faces, saliva or blood of infected rats.
- Contact with objects, household items and surfaces or eating food, contaminated with urine, faeces, saliva or blood of infected rats.
- Person to Person transmission by contact with blood, urine, faeces, vomitus, semen, vaginal secretions, breast milk or other body fluids of an infected person.
- 4. Sign and Symptoms of Lassa Fever:

Lassa Fever presents initially like any other febrile illness such as malaria but accompanied with unexplainable bleeding from ears, eyes, nose, mouth and other body openings.

The time between an infection and appearance of symptoms of the disease is 2 to 21 days. Early treatment and diagnosis increase the chances of survival.

5. People most at risk are:

- People of all age groups who come in contact with the urine, faeces, saliva or blood of rats.
- People living in rat-infested environments, which increases their chances of coming in contact with rats.
- People who consume potentially contaminated food stuff especially those left open over-night or dried outside in the open.
- People who handle or process rodents for consumption.
- People who do not observe hand hygiene when appropriate.
- Relatives who take care of sick person with Lassa Fever at home.
- 6. How to prevent yourself from Lassa Fever
- Maintain personal hygiene by, among others, frequent hand washing with soap and water or use of hand sanitizers.
- Store food in containers with lids and discard any food remnants.
- Keep your home and surrounding clean and tidy to discourage rats and other rodents from entering.
- Ensure proper sanitation by, among others, proper waste disposal.
- Cook all food thoroughly.
- Wash fruits thoroughly, vegetables and other food items before consumption.



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
