55 BUK Female Students Get MacArthur Scholarship Grants

A total of fifty-five female students pursuing degree programmes in the Faculty of Communication of Bayero University, Kano have received scholarship grant of fifty thousand naira (N50,000.00) each under the MacArthur Scholarship Grant secured by the Faculty.

In a letter signed by Professor Umaru A. Pate, the Chairman of the Faculty MacArthur Scholarship Grant Implementation Committee, a total of two million seven hundred and fifty thousand naira (N2,750,000,00) was paid to the students. He indicated that the beneficiaries were selected based on their academic performance and peculiar financial needs, as stipulated by the letter of the grant.

It could be recalled that during the tenure of Professor Umaru A. Pate as the pioneer Dean of the Faculty of Communication, the Department of Mass

Communication was given a grant worth \$750,000 by the MacArthur Foundation to be executed in three years on training the personnel of the Department in the area of investigative journalism, including public lecture, conferences and seminars and a component of female scholarship of 30 students every academic session from 2016/2017 session for a period of three years.

The scholarship awards are for the academic sessions 2016/2017 and 2017/2018, which are the Year One and Year Two of the scholarship period and that the last batch of the beneficiaries would emerge after the first semester examination of the 2018/2019 academic session. A total of 30 undergraduate students were awarded the scholarship in 2016/2017 while in the 2017/2018 session the scheme also included some female postgraduate students. **Below is the full list of the beneficiaries.**

BUK Set to Host PASET-RSIF PhD, Research Programs

Bayero University, Kano is set to become one of the universities to host the PASET Pan African Regional Scholarship and Innovation Fund (RSIF) PhD programmes and in research and innovation in the applied sciences, engineering and technology (ASET).

The Partnership for Skills in Applied Sciences, Engineering and Technology (PASET) is an initiative by African governments to address fundamental gaps in skills and knowledge necessary for long term, sustained economic growth in Sub-Saharan Africa (SSA). PASET established Regional Scholarship and Innovation Fund (RSIF) to contribute towards the training of a critical mass of PhD and post-doctoral candidates and support research and innovation in some priority thematic areas: ICTs, including big data and artificial intelligence; food security and agribusiness; minerals, mining and materials engineering and energy, including renewable and climate change.

RSIF Host universities are universities or research institutes/centres based in Sub-Saharan Africa that offer a PhD in any of the priority PASET thematic

areas. They host the PhD scholars and also receive research grants and grants for innovation projects in the selected thematic area.

The objective of RSIF is to train high quality PhD and post-doctoral fellows to address the human resource gap of highly qualified specialists in the fields of applied sciences, engineering and technology and contribute to improving research and innovation capacities in those fields.

Bayero University's proposal has been selected for further evaluation through onsite visits to validate the findings of the first stage of the review process through discussions with the university leadership, faculty, students and partners.

In a letter addressed to the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, by the Manager, RSIF Regional Coordination Unit, Dr. Moses Osiru, said out of the 144 applications from the universities across sub-Saharan Africa received by the Regional Coordination Unit (RCU) of the RSIF, 80 were found eligible for the competition to be African Host Universities (AHU).

The 80 applications were taken through a rigorous technical evaluation process involving reviews by three independent technical reviewers each and selection meetings to identify the most competitive proposals in each of the five PASET priority thematic areas.

Centre for Dryland Agriculture's supported PhD programmes in Natural Resource Management and

Climate Change will be visited by a team of RSIF. The team will also interact with key academic staff, finance and administration and assess procurement and documentation methods.

The team, which is scheduled to visit Bayero University's CDA later this month will also interact with partners, postgraduate students and tour existing education and research facilities.

NUPENCO is a Win-Win Achievement – VC

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, has disclosed that the establishment of the National University Pension Company (NUPENCO) has many advantages to Nigerian Universities, describing it as a win-win situation. He said “with NUPENCO, things would be easy to resolve as

problems of pension administration. He, therefore, advised the company to come up with a better means of sensitizing the University Community.

In his earlier address, the NUPENCO Zonal Coordinator, Aliyu Atiku, said NUPENCO was a brainchild of Nigerian Universities. He expressed gratitude to BUK for providing an office for the Zonal Office of the NUPENCO at the Old Campus.

He also said that part of their motives of the visit to the University was to request for a comprehensive list of staff and ask those who were yet to register to obtain consent or RSA forms.

In his remarks, the former ASUU National President, Dr Nasir Isa Fagge provided reasons why university workers opted for the establishment of their own separate Pension Fund Administrator (PFAs) known as the National University Pension Company (NUPENCO). “This arose from doubts by the academic staff of universities

on the capability of the existing PFA's to manage their pension funds effectively and, too, bearing in mind that the survival of every pensioner is strictly tied to whatever happens to the pension fund,” he disclosed. According to him, NUPENCO was part of the salient issues contained in the 2009 ASUU-Federal Government Agreement. He said after several years of agitation by university workers to have a separate body that would manage their pension contributions, NUPENCO was established as a PFA that would manage the pension contributions of university workers.

Speaking on Tuesday, 2nd April, 2019 in his office while receiving the newly elected EXCOS, Prof Bello said the University Management had been having a cordial relationship with all the unions operating in the university, both for staff and students, which was the secret behind all the progress the University had witnessed in recent years.

Professor Bello called on the attention of the President and his Exco on a matter concerning registration-that over 90% of the students registered within the stipulated time assigned by the Management, including an additional one week, but yet 10% of the students didn't register.
