BUK Matriculates 8,090 Students



B ayero University, Kano has matriculated eight thousand and ninety students who were given admission into the University for the current 2018/2019 academic session.

Speaking at the matriculation ceremony on Thursday, 18th April, 2019, at the Convocation arena, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, urged the students to abide by the rules and regulations of the University as contained in four (4) documents, which were *General Examinations and Academic Regulation* covering rules regarding our academic pursuit, Student's Handbook, the Code of Ethics and the BUK Dress Code.

Professor Bello, represented by Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration), Professor Haruna Wakili, said the University had SEVICOM Unit with powers to coordinate and monitor the implementation of a general service charter to ensure quality service delivery to our customers, who were mainly students, to enlighten them of their rights to good services and putting in place mechanisms for addressing complaints and grievances in case of service failure as well as possible redress to customers.

Professor Bello charged the students to be of good

character throughout their stay in the University and beyond. "Do not engage yourselves in activities such as examination misconduct and other forms of acts of indiscipline as the University Management takes engagements in these acts very serious and violators are sanctioned appropriately", said the Vice Chancellor.

Professor Bello charged the newly admitted students to work hard in their academic pursuits, as 63,291 candidates had Bayero University as their first choice but only 8,090 candidates were admitted. "Can you see how lucky you are", the Vice Chancellor said.

Professor Bello said many infrastructural facilities had been provided in the last seven years and more were being provided as they might have seen in the BUK campuses. The most recent facilities that had been added were female student's hall of residence at Old Campus constructed and donated by the late Sheik Isyaka Rabi'u; one Megawatt solar power plant on the Old Campus; a fourteen room public convenience for male students located near the Attahiru Jega Theatre, and a female students' rest room with 14 toilets as well as 30 seater Toyota Bus and a 54-seater Tata bus for students to ease the problem of commuting between the two main campuses.

Unemployment Rate Increases by 3.3% in Kano State Annually - Prof. Sagagi

The Dean of Dangote Business School, Professor Murtala Sagagi, has called on stakeholders to revive the nations' economy through job-creation; because, at present, there were four million (4,000,000) people that were jobless in Kano state. Professor Sagagi was speaking during an occasion organized and conducted by Kano Concerned Citizens Initiative (KCCI) on 20th April, 2019 at Dangote Business School.

Professor Sagagi disclosed that unemployment increased by 3.3 every year, which was a clear indication why hands must be on desk to curtail the unfortunate situation we had found ourselves in. He

added that the rate at which our population grew without any plan to control it was related to the unemployment palaver we had found ourselves in, calling on our leaders to ensure that our economy went hand in hand with population growth.

At a point during the occasion, the President of KCCI, Alhaji Bashir Othman Tofa, called all stakeholders not keep quiet and watch things going on against normalcy. He said time to be quiet against corruption and societal ills had ended. Alhaji Tofa said, "We'll continue to work with all that have this state (Kano state) at their hearts in order rescue the state from the catastrophe which has befallen her". He explained that this was not feasible without us having good and effective plans in relation to job creation for the benefit of our youth and

of our women.

A famous business-man, Alhaji Aliko Dangote, called on the Nigerian government to provide adequate and continuous electricity in the country. He pointed out that no country in the world would progress without steady supply of electricity.

Alhaji Dangote insisted that "even if government is not responsible for job creation, it should, at least, provide a conducive atmosphere by strengthening businessmen to recruit citizens".

Alhaji Dangote together with Alhaji Abdussamad Isyaka Rabi'u also promised to set aside a huge amount

of money to be used in giving vocational training to our women and to our youth, "because if we don't do this, we'll be under a nasty threat".

On his own part, the Emir of Kano, Malam Muhammad Sanusi II, said no nation would progress without education. For this reason, according to the traditional ruler, any village that had no school should have its mosque transformed into a school.

The emir also explained that marrying so many wives and bearing children with no control was the cause of many instances of poverty and begging in
Kano state and the country in general. He opined that job creation could help to remedy this societal ill.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, (Admin), Professor Haruna Wakili, said Bayero University was always ready to participate in any activity that would promote positive aspect of human endeavor as well as providing the peaceful coexistence among the citizens of the state.

The Vice Chancellor said the University Management was ready to sign MoU with any organization ready to create avenues that would effect positive changes to the current problems that our community was facing. As such, extra commitment needed to be provided to achieve the desired goal.

BUK Press Train Staff on Adobe In-Design

Bayero University Press has organized a four-day training for its staff on the use of the In-Design software. The training, which was carried out from 27^{th} - 30^{th} March, 2019 was facilitated by the Centre for Information Technology and Development (CITAD), Kano on an In-Design Adobe publishing tool created for designing books, newspapers, flyers, bulletins, magazines and booklets. The Director of the University Press, Professor Habu Mohammed, described the training as essential because it aimed at updating staff knowledge in the

highly competitive computer era to match the international standard of publishing industry and position both the editorial and design sections of the Press for better output.

In his remarks, the Editor-in-Chief, Mr. Kunle Adebanji, urged the participants to make maximum use of the knowledge gained from the training to improve their work.

The Deanery of Student Affairs has organized an orientation programme for 8,090 fresh students admitted for the 2018/2019 academic session on Wednesday 24th and Thursday 25th April, 2019 at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, New Campus and Mahmud Tukur Theater, Old Campus, respectively.

The Dean of Student affairs, Dr. Shamsudeen Umar, while speaking at the events, explained to the students that the orientation was meant to guide them on the rules and regulations that were expected to help them throughout their stay in the University.

According to him, the Deanery of Student Affairs deal

with non-core academic activities of the students, such as hostel administration, maintenance and allocation; handling of commuter buses, issuing of ID cards and NYSC mobilization, among others.

He advised the students to ensure that they were found worthy not only in academic matters but also in character, by desisting from any act such as examination misconduct, stealing and fighting, which were capable of jeopardizing their stay in the University.

In his speech, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, who was represented by the HOD Islamic

Studies, Professor Ahmad Murtala, congratulated the students and advised them to stay focused and pay attention to academic activities because all facilities, such as reading areas and buses to ease the burden of transportation, had been put in place so as to ensure their success in the University. He also informed them that about 300 indigent students were awarded scholarship of fifty thousand naira (N50,000) each.

The Vice Chancellor advised them to choose their friends wisely and acclimatize themselves with the University and the host community.

The Director, University Health Services, Dr. Maryam Waziri, advised the students to take their health issues seriously. She explained that the University clinic was responsible for both curative and preventive health provisions. She also talked about the Tertiary Institution Social Health Insurance (TISHIP) programme, which, according to her, was the Federal Government's effort in improving the standard of students' health in the Tertiary Institutions due to health crisis in the country. She said the programme was designed to provide insurance cover for students in Higher Institutions with affordable health care delivery for students at affordable rates.

The Director of Security, Rtd. Navy Captain Baba Danagundi, who also spoke at the event, said the students should be vigilant and report any suspicious movements to the security. He enjoined them to move in company and obey their instincts when it came to



security issues. He also advised them to be well behaved and not take the law into their hands, but rather report any matter that threatened their security to the appropriate quarters, which was the Security Division.

The Deputy Registrar, Student Affairs, Hajia Anisa Uwais, also read out the rules and regulations on the expected dress code for the students.

The Director, DEAR, Hajia Amina Umar, who was represented by Fatiu A. Abubakar, read out the rules and regulations guiding examinations and the do's and don'ts during examination.

The students were also lectured on grades and grading system in the University, the importance of the University library and how to use it; they were also told of the importance of guidance and counselling unit in the University.


