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he National Universities Commission (NUC) is working out modalities to develop a new National Research Agenda to accelerate Nigeria's growth, the Executive Secretary of NUC, Professor Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, has disclosed.

Speaking as a special guest of honour at the opening ceremony of an international training workshop on research ethics at Bayero University's Dangote Business School on Monday, 9th December, 2019, he said the new policy aimed at repositioning research and development in Nigerian universities.

The NUC boss, who was represented by Director, Research, Innovation and CIT, Malam Muhammad Auwal Farouk further explained that the rationale was to tailor research in Nigerian universities towards the needs and problems of the nation.

"The NUC is on its way to develop a National Research Agenda aimed at repositioning research and development in Nigerian universities", said Professor Rasheed.

According to him, by the time the new policy takes effect, it will give a direction for researchers which will go a long way towards the growth and development of

our country.

The NUC Executive Secretary charged Bayero University and FUIW to join the Commission in moving research forward for the benefit of "Nigeria and the world in general".

Presenting a lead paper, Professor Musa Muhammad Borodo lamented that despite the unanimously accepted need for value and usefulness in research, however, some researches nowadays lack value and integrity.

The training workshop was jointly organized by Bayero University, Kano and Higher Education and Research Ethics Centre (HEREC) of the Federation of Universities of the Islamic World. It was themed "Ethics and Integrity in Scientific Research".

Deliberating on the qualities of good research, Prof. Borodo argued that since knowledge, which was the ultimate goal of any research, was good and noble, its pursuit through research, must be with truthfulness and diligence. The facilitating professor added that research should also be for human good and for societal development. Again, according to the facilitator, the outcomes of researches should not be

harmful.

In his welcome address at the opening ceremony, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Muhammad Yahuza Bello, declared that the University Management was glad to have one of the first FUIW workshops hosted by the University. He also hoped that the outcome of the international workshop would be of immense benefit to the University's Research Committee.

He said as part of effort to key into global standard in conducting research, the University had inaugurated four different committees on research ethics which are as follows: Animal Care and Use Research Ethics, Health Research Ethics, Science Technology and Environment Review and Social Humanity and Law Committees to be headed by Dr Abdussamad M. Abdussamad, Professor Aliyu Abdu, Professor M.D. Mukhtar and Professor Usman Shuaib respectively.

Among the dignitaries that graced the opening ceremony were the Executive Secretary, National Universities Commission, Prof. Abubakar Adamu Rasheed (represented by Mallam Muhammad Auwal Farouk), Prof. Izzeldin Ahmed Mousa, the Dean, HEREC, Naif Arab University of Security Studies, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia; Dr. Malwe A. Alshahrani, the Deputy Dean, HEREC and Prof. Gamal A. El-Dahshan, the Dean, Faculty of Education, Manoufia University, Egypt, among many others.
