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Stakeholders Want Formation of Banking Policies Based on Islamic Conformity

The Federal Government has been urged to come up with economic policies and programmes that will harness and fast-track full benefits of Islamic banking in Nigeria. This is the position of stakeholders at a one-day Islamic Finance Sharia Forum organised by the International Institute of Islamic Banking and Finance (IIIBF), Bayero University, Kano, in collaboration with Jaiz Foundation, Nigeria.

The Conference, which was held on Tuesday 9th July, 2019 at the Centre for Islamic Civilization and Interfaith Dialogue (CICID), Bayero University, Kano aimed at sensitizing members of public on area bordering Islamic banking in Nigeria.

Declaring the conference open, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration), Professor In his presentation titled "Some Shari'ah Issues in the Application of *Murabaha* by Islamic Financial Institutions", the Director, CICID, Dr. Bashir Aliyu Umar discussed extensively on the role played by Islamic banking in promoting what he called 'real economic development'. He said Islamic banking operates on asset-based system which, he said, promotes financial inclusion, open employment opportunities, easy spread of acquisition of capital among people, increased production and increased purchasing power of the people.

Professor Sulaiman Abdullahi Karwai from the Department of Management, Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, in his paper, described issues surrounding bank interest 'riba' as major causes crippling third world

Haruna Wakili, said the essence of establishing centres like IIIBF and CICID was to collaborate with external bodies and the general public in finding solutions to the challenges facing the society. He hoped that the discussions would come out with practical solutions to problems facing Islamic finances in Nigeria.

In her welcome address, the Director, International Institute of Islamic Banking and Finance (IIIBF), Professor Binta Tijjani Jibril, stated that the idea of the forum was to bring together learned persons, practitioners and professionals in the field of Islamic finance to discuss various issues related to Islamic finance in order to create awareness and understanding of the concept of Islamic finance, its benefits and the challenges facing it. She added that the discussion also aimed at penetrating into the inherent benefits of Islamic Banking system, which the people of Nigeria stand to benefit.

BUK Hosts First ISESCO National Workshop on Challenges of Teaching Arabic Language at University-Level

In a bid to promote the status of Arabic language in non-Arabic speaking countries and its teaching, the Islamic Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (ISESCO) in collaboration with Bayero University Kano, and the Federal Ministry of Education, has organised a "National Workshop on the Challenges of Teaching Arabic language at University-level in Nigeria.

The workshop, which took place in the Department of Arabic from 8th to 11th July, 2019, was part of ISESCO's efforts to develop Arabic educational programmes and to activate its role in education, culture and development in non-Arabic-speaking environments aimed at promoting education, science and culture.

ISESCO is a body under the auspices of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) of which is Nigeria a member.

The workshop was aimed at achieving a set of practical results, notably: exchanging experiences and transferring expertise in the field of teaching of Arabic to non-Arabic speakers in Nigerian universities; developing participants' knowledge and building their capacities in the scientific planning and methodological preparation of their courses, the assessment of student performance, and the correction of deficiencies.

According to the Secretary General of the National Commission for ISESCO in Nigeria, Malam. Ibrahim

Muhammad Bashir, the workshop was organised to develop participants' educational competencies in the teaching of the Arabic-related subjects so as to open a new prospect for participants to capitalize on modern tools to develop their educational and pedagogical



performance and to facilitate extracurricular self-learning activities.

While declaring the Workshop open, the Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Education and acting Minister of Education, Architect Sonny. S. I. Echono, represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Administration), Professor Haruna Wakili said the workshop was timely and critical to the development of Arabic Language in Nigeria.

Professor Haruna Wakili, who also doubled as the representative of the Vice-Chancellor of BUK, assured that the management of the University would give all necessary logistics and other support for development

in the teaching of Arabic. He expressed his delight over choosing BUK to host the workshop.

The Head, Department of Arabic, Professor Muhammad Rabi'u Sa'ad, stated that more than twenty-

five educational officials and Arabic teachers from various universities of the Nigeria attended the workshop. He said the workshop involved speeches and teacher training presentations that were delivered on five main topics, namely "Educational Challenges and Methodological, Knowledge and Cultural Problems Facing People Working in the Teaching of Arabic to Non-Arabic Speakers in Nigerian Universities"; "Planning Arabic language Lessons for non-Arabic speakers;" "Impact of Modern Pedagogical Tools on Developing Teacher Performance and Academic Outputs and on Facilitating Extracurricular Self-learning Activities" and "Development of the Four Language Skills of Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing;" and "Assessment of the Level of Achievement in Arabic for Non-Arabic Speakers."

Be Innovative to Remain Relevant Nigerian Varsities Charged

Nigerian Universities should wake up from their slumber and be active in research and innovation in order to situate themselves within the 21st century generation, the Registrar, Ritman University, Ekot Ekpene, Mr.T. M. E. Dogun, has advised.

Mr. Dogun who was also the former Registrar, Benson Idahosa University said this while presenting his lead paper titled "Repositioning our Universities in Challenging Times: The Role of Professional Administrators, at a 4-Day ANUPA Training Workshop for Senior University Professional Administrators at the Merit Award House, Abuja, on Tuesday, 9th July, 2019.

He expressed concern on the recommendation by the Prof. Peter Okebukola's Committee for the repositioning of the Nigerian Universities presented to the National Universities Commission (NUC) suggesting relegation of non-teaching staff, saying this is retrogressive. He further, reaffirmed the importance of professional administrators in the development of universities.

A combined delegation from the University of Sheffield in the United Kingdom and Babcock University, Ogun State, Nigeria have visited Bayero University as part of the effort to strengthen partnership with BUK's Africa Centre of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP).

The team of senior researchers were received by the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, on Monday, 1st July, 2018 at the Council Chamber.

The leader of the delegation, Professor Dilly Anumba from the University of Sheffield, said the visit was to solidify collaboration among universities of countries involving ACEPHAP, including Nigeria, UK, Visiting Researchers from the University of Sheffield (UK) and Bangladesh and South Africa.

He said the aim was to reduce the burden of premature births and maternal mortality rates in Africa. This, according to him, could be achieved through strengthening the capacity and capability of localizing researchers.

Professor Dilly lauded Bayero University for initially

establishing the Centre for Advanced Medical Research and Training (CAMRAT), which has now been upgraded to Africa Centre of Excellence for

On the achievement of ACEPHAP, he said the University had always been keen in improving the capacity of its staff in writing proposals and conducting researches, which would attract more grants.

Earlier, in her opening remarks, the Director, Africa Centre of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP), Professor Hadiza Galadanci, said her centre recently secured funding from the World Bank aimed at strengthening interdisciplinary approaches to promote population health through training and research for evidence-informed policy development in West and Central Africa.
