41 Professorial Inaugural Lecture:

An erudite Professor of Water Resources and Environmental Engineering from the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering, Bayero University, Kano, Engr. Professor Mustapha Hassan Bichi, FNSE, JP, has identified the interventions of 'raw' Moringa in the life of man and the applications of its seeds in water and waste water treatment.

"Moringa helps in sustainable, appropriate, effective enhancement of waste water treatment process as well as in decreased reliance on importation of treatment chemicals", he revealed.

This was contained in the 41st Professorial Inaugural Lecture delivered on Thursday, 20th June, 2019 at Mahmud Tukur Theatre, titled: *Man, Environment and Water – The Moringa Oleifera (Zogale) Intervention.*

Professor Bichi revealed that a practical application of *moringa* in water treatment had been tested and was

from Challawa industrial estate in Kano in 2016.

According to him, his research further discovered that *Moringa oleifera* (Zogale) had enormous nutritional benefits to man. He identified that it was 7 times richer in vitamin C than oranges, 4 times richer in vitamin A than carrots, 4 times richer in calcium than milk, 3 times richer in potassium than bananas and 2 times richer in protein than yogurt.

He added that the medicinal use of moringa oleifera include curing antimicrobial/biocidal, circulatory/endocrine disorders, reproductive, skin disorders, detoxification, digestive disorders, inflammation, immunity and nervous system disorders.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza, in his remarks, said even though many people ordinarily knew the importance of *moringa* in human health, relating it to the environment and water was



currently in use in many countries, including Malawi, Egypt, Sudan and Malaysia.

The University don further noted that the use of *moringa oleifera* ensured the reduction of pollution load, so that the effluent could be sent back to the natural water course with minimum harm to aquatic life and the environment.

Professor Bichi said researchers found that *moringa* provided 87% - 99% removal of heavy metals – Cd, Cr, Cu, Co, Mn and Zn from tannery wastewater discharged

unprecedented and therefore deserved commendation.

Professor Yahuza, who commended on the increase in the number of professorial inaugural lectures delivered, said the number of lectures presented after 2015 was far beyond those presented before then. He charged professors in different disciplines to see the inaugural lecture as a debt owed the university system, adding that it was on occasions like that the public knew what fabric professors were made of in terms of research, teaching and service to humanity. He commended the inaugural lecturer for a job well-done.

Centre for Gender Studies Sensitizes on Human Resources for Health (HRH)

The Centre for Gender Studies in Collaboration with Women for Health organized a one-day sensitization programme on Human Resources for Health Learning Hub on Wednesday 19 June, 2019 at its Conference Room.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor M.Y. Bello, who was represented by the Director Academic Planning, Professor Bala Sidi Aliyu, commended the Centre for its initiatives, which according to him has recorded tremendous success since inception. He reiterated that health was wealth and that there was the need to use education to change the challenges being faced in the health sector.

The Vice Chancellor urged participants to take advantage of the exercise to learn what was being taught so as to impact positively on the society at large.

The National Program Manager of the Human Resources for Health, Dr. Amina M. Lawan, gave a background of the learning hub, which she said had been in existence since 2012 with 5 states, participating. They were Kano, Zamfara, Jigawa, Borno and Yobe and the main aim of the program was to increase the number of female health workers, such as Doctors, Nurses, Midwives and Community Health officers in the Northern Region.

She said it was easy to build hospitals and health centers but the human capital resources were nonexistent and there was the need to bridge the gap in the North by producing more health practitioners.

She also said three Universities were contacted for the integration of the Learning Hub into the University system; and Bayero University's response to the initiative showed it shared the same vision with the HRH learning hub in terms of making a difference in the community. The programme Manager commended the University Management and the Department of Nursing Sciences for their support, which, according to her, would go a long way in making a lot of difference.

The Deputy Director of Centre for Gender Studies, Dr. Maikano Madaki, in his presentation, said high mortality in Northern Nigeria had been linked to acute shortage of female health workers, especially in the rural areas and, as a result, the Women for Health program was introduced in 2012 to address these challenges, among others. He said the learning hub was established at the Centre for Gender Studies as a one-stop platform for learning by providing access as evidence and technical advice to support the production, recruitment and retention of health workers.

Professor Bashir Ali Elected President of Nigerian Mathematical Society

Professor Mamza also said that Bayero University was one of the few universities which had registered with


his institute and had been regularly paying its dues.

World Sickle Cell and Blood Donor Day:

BUK Staff, Students Donate Blood

About one hundred people mostly staff and students of Bayero University, Kano and Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital (AKTH), have voluntarily donated their blood as part of activities to commemorate the 2019 World Sickle Cell and Blood Donor Day.

The occasion which was jointly organized by the Bayero University, Kano (BUK) and Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital (AKTH) took place at the Convocation Arena at the New Campus, on Saturday, 22nd June, 2019 and was aimed at creating awareness and sensitization of the importance of blood donation.

The United Nations had declared 14th and 19th June



every year as International Sickle Cell and Blood Donor Days respectively.

Presenting a keynote address, Professor Aisha Kuliya-Gwarzo, said the day was set aside by the global health body to declare its commitment and support towards voluntary blood donation among the citizens.

The occasion was conducted under the chairmanship of the former Chief Medical Director of AKTH, Professor Abdulhamid Isah Dutse with the theme **Safe Blood for All** while Rwanda was chosen by the WHO to serve as a host country for the 2019 Global Celebration.

Professor Aisha Kuliya who expressed delight at the large turnout of staff and students for the celebration, said this had further confirmed the commitment of the Bayero University Community on saving the lives of the citizenry.

Her Paper titled **Blood Donors-Safe Blood Saves Lives** said the occasion was aimed to principally thank voluntary and unpaid donors for their life saving gifts of blood as well as to encourage others to imbibe the culture of voluntary blood donation.

She also said it intended to raise awareness to ensure all individuals and communities have access to affordable, timely supplies of safe and quality assured blood and blood products.

Presenting a paper titled *Sickling disorders: A Concise Overview*, Professor Sagir Ahmed emphasized the

need to raise awareness about SCD and to encourage the people especially the young ones on the need to do a genotype screening. He said discovering ones genotype is the fundamental aspect of addressing the SCD.

In his remarks, the Chief Medical Director of Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital (AKTH), Professor Aminu Zakari Muhammad reaffirmed the commitment of the management of the hospital towards effective service delivery as part of their professional callings as a care giver.

Other speakers who spoke at the occasion include Dr. Umma A. Ibrahim

who said that AKTH had been organizing this public sensitization for the 17th time and this year decided to expand it with a view to collaborating with the University so as to widen the coverage and awareness.

While giving a vote of thanks, Dr. A'isha Amal Galadanci expressed gratitude to the management of BUK and AKTH for their understanding and commitment towards ensuring a healthy society. She revealed that team of medical personnel from the AKTH offered free medical checkups to about 200 participants during the celebration.

Highlight of the celebration was the presentation of awards to some individuals and corporate organisations who excelled in voluntary blood donations.

GUIDELINES FOR 2019 JUNIOR STAFF PROMOTION EXERCISE

All Provosts, Deans, Directors and Head of Departments/Units

This is to request faculties, Centres, departments, and units to submit to the Junior Staff Unit, their recommendations for the 2019 Annual Promotions of Junior Staff.

- 1. The candidate(s) being presented for promotion should be confirmed staff and must be qualified academically and professionally. Such staff must have demonstrated exceptional performance meriting promotion.
- 2. (a) He/she must have served the University for at least 3 years after his/her last promotion
 - (b) He/she who has spent at least two years and six months is deemed to have spent 3 years
- 3. (a) Candidate(s) for promotion to ranks on CONTISS 03 and 04 must have at least three (3) credits in SSCE/GCE or its equivalent, except **Motor Driver.**
 - (b) Candidate(s) for promotion to CONTISS 05 must have same as (a) above plus a relevant certificate, except **Driver/Mechanics**, **Artisans**, **Medical**

Record Assistant, Medical Technicians, Messenger/Cleaner, Gardner and Grounds men.

- 4. Trade Test Certificates from the Federal Ministry of Labour and Productivity can be presented for promotion of Artisans and Drivers.
- 5. Staff on Study Fellowship or who has been granted study fellowship **can be** presented for promotion once.
- 6. Staff with a warning letter in the last 6 months should not be presented for promotion.
- 7. All re-designation cases (upgrading, change of cadre and conversion) should not be presented to the Junior Staff A & PC, instead it should be directed to the Registrar.
- 8. Departments should not re-submit cases for promotion which were earlier rejected without acquiring the needed relevant qualification.
- 9. Staff posted to a new department/unit must spend at least six months before the new unit can assess him/her for promotion. Staff affected by the recent redeployment should therefore be assessed by their former head of department.
- 10. Only November/December O/Level is acceptable for promotion after appointment.
- 11. Ten (10) copies of the attached forms should be completed and submitted in respect of each candidate.
- 12. All submissions and recommendations are to be submitted to the Junior Staff Office on or before 8th July, 2019 late submission would not be accepted.

NB: Officers presenting candidates for promotion shall be required to come and defend their submission before the Junior Staff A & PC with their departmental files and photocopies of relevant credentials on the scheduled date.
