

Nigerian Certified Engineers to Get International Status

...Says COREN President

The Council for the Regulation of Engineering in Nigeria (COREN) is pursuing a new policy that will strengthen the process of accredition and certification of engineering graduates in Nigerian tertiary institutions so as to be in conformity with the international Engineering Alliance (IEA), Standards.

President of COREN, Engr. Aliyu A. Rabi'u who stated this during a reception organized in his honour by the Management of Bayero University on Wednesday, 18th September, 2019 at the Senate Chamber, said, already the body had begun a discussion with a global engineering

body that will make COREN accredited engineering programs have a similar status with its counterparts at international level.

According to him, the idea is to make it easy for our engineers, so that they will not be subjected to any international accreditation wherever they find themselves in the world. "Once we accredit a programme in any institution, it suffices anywhere in the world."

He said based on the Washington Accord reached during the global meeting of the International Engineering Alliance (IEA) in which countries from Europe and America among others being the countries signatories to the Accord, have agreed on the institutionalization of certain mechanisms which will give an international recognition of registered engineers from the member countries. Part of the procedure is to have an independent accreditation body.

Earlier speaking, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said when they heard of the election of Engr. Aliyu Rabi'u as COREN President, the Management felt that as an Alumnus of BUK, the University was obliged to host a befitting reception in his honour.

According to him, the COREN President had made the University proud in view of his sterling contributions to engineering profession in particular and national development in general. "You are a true and good ambassador of this University and we wish you a successful tenure and be a good ambassador of your a*lmamata*."

He also advised COREN in its determination for quality assurance and standards to liaise with other regulatory bodies, particularly the National Universities Commission (NUC) in the aspect of accreditation of programs so as to have synergy and efficiency.

Meanwhile, the COREN President advised Nigerian Universities to concentrate on programmes relevant to their environment especially in the area of science, technology and innovation which he said were the triple pillars of growth and development of any society.



He said he was overwhelmed by the infrastructural development of the university in the last twenty years, which, according to him were the manifestation of good and quality leadership over the time. "On my arrival, we went round the University and were taken to the Solar energy project. In fact, I was amazed by the project with and other ones I had seen. I am really proud to be associated with BUK," he declared.

He reaffirmed his commitment to ensuring standards and quality in the engineering program across the nations's tertiary institutions.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor said engineering is a noble profession which plays significant role in the development of a nation. He thanked the COREN President for the visit.

Commonwealth of Learning Confers Fellowship on Prof Abdalla Uba, VC NOUN By Lamara Garba

The Commonwealth of Learning (COL) has conferred its prestigious Honorary Fellow on the Vice Chancellor of the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN), Professor Abdalla Uba Adamu.

The ceremony took place on Thursday, 12th September, 2019 during the 9th edition of the Pan-Commonwealth Forum (PCF9), which took place at the Murray Rugby Stadium, Edinburg, Scotland. The theme for this year's conference is "Innovation for Quality Education and Lifelong Education."

The conference, which kicked off on Monday, 9th September, 2019 had Prof Adamu as well as Prof. Nageshwar Rao of the Indira Ghandi National Open University (IGNOU), India and Dr. Caroline Seelig, CEO of Open Polytechnic of New Zealand as the only three Vice Chancellors, who constituted the panel on the theme of the Forum. The panel was chaired by Sir John Daniel, a former President of the COL.

Professor Adamu along with Professor Mandla Makhanya, the Vice Chancellor, University of South Africa were the only two Africans out of the eight notable leaders of educational innovation in distance education across the world who were conferred with the prestigious Fellowship during the meeting.

The Fellowship was bestowed on him by the President and CEO of the Canada-based COL, Professor Asha

Kanwar, who said the award recognized outstanding contributions by an individual to distance education in areas, such as leadership and service and published works, including course wares and lectures as well as presentations and mentorship.

Abdalla Uba Adamu, was the first Northerner to have obtained a double Professorship in Education Science and Media Studies. He lectured at the Department of Media and Information Studies in the Faculty of Communication, Bayero University, Kano before his appointment as Vice Chancellor of NOUN sometime in 2016.

He promised to contribute towards the achievement of such projects.

In his message at the occasion, the Minister of Education, Mallam Adamu Adamu, said that Bayero University had over the decades strived and excelled in the study, conservation and promotion of Hausa literature and culture, in particular, and that of Nigeria

and Africa, in general.

On the conference, Malam Adamu said this was highly welcomed partly because Narambada was his most favourite Hausa Singer of all times. Dr. Adeola, who is a researcher in the Chinese Academy of Science, said the idea of the visit was to discuss on the areas of collaboration in the centre's thematic areas, staff and student exchange and
