



## VP Osinbajo Commissions Solar Hybrid Power Plant in BUK

Vice President, Professor Yemi Osinbajo, on Tuesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 2019, commissioned an Off-Grid Solar Hybrid Power plant in Bayero University, Kano executed by the federal governments Rural Electrification Agency under Energizing Education Programme (EEP).

The EEP project, which is the largest Solar Project in Africa, has an installed capacity of 7.1 megawatts and will result in 108,875,120Ibs of annual Carbon Dioxide savings. In addition, the project installed a total of 694 street lights across 11.41 km of roads. It has a workshop and training centre, which will provide training and renewable technology to students of BUK and equip them with invaluable knowledge and experience pertaining to the power sector.

The Vice President who recalled with nostalgia that he and other colleagues then in academia regarded BUK as a refreshing bastion of revolutionary thinking, was vividly happy to be part of the historic ceremony “taking place in this great citadel of learning.”

“It is another milestone in fulfilment of President Buhari's Next Level road map agenda to commission this solar hybrid power plant, the largest in Africa, which will provide clean, safe and reliable electricity to over 58,000 students and staff of Bayero University, Kano. This is something we, as Nigerians, will be very proud of,” he said.

Professor Osinbajo stated that the project executed by Rural Electrification Agency (REA) was strategic to the fulfilment of the federal government's commitment to the Paris Agreement, as it has strived to reduce Nigeria's carbon emission.

The Vice President appreciated all those that contributed to the execution of the project and congratulated the management, staff and students of Bayero University, Kano.

In his remarks, the Kano State Governor, Dr. Abdullahi

Umar Ganduje, said energizing education was like energizing the youth and the economy to neutralize criminal activities such as banditry, armed robbery, cattle rustling, kidnapping and other conflicts in Nigeria. He urged the university to ensure the sustainability of the project.

Speaking earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said in addition to solving the perennial power problems of the University, the project fitted squarely into its current research focus on renewable energy. He said that the University's Centre for Renewable Energy Research (CRER), had already started making an impact by securing a grant in kind from the United Kingdom's Department for International Development (DFID). “With additional investment by the University, the grant was used to establish a one-megawatt solar station on the Old Campus of the University,” he explained.

Professor Bello appealed to the federal government to come to the aid of the University “by providing us with batteries for storage at the one-megawatt solar power station”.

The respective Ministers of Education, Environment, Power, Defense and Agriculture; Malam Adamu Adamu, Dr. Mahmud Muhammad, Engineer Saleh Mamman, General Bashir Magashi and Alhaji Muhammad Sabo Nanono, who were present, showered their encomiums on the federal government commending her over the energizing education programme.

## BUK to Seek China's Assistance in Language and Agriculture

The Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano, Professor Muhammad Yahuza Bello, said the University might seek assistance from China in teaching the Chinese language and agriculture in the University.

Professor Bello disclosed this when the *Wakilin Mutanen China a Kano*, Mr Mike Zhang, paid him a courtesy visit in his office on Thursday, 15<sup>th</sup> August, 2019.

He said no doubt Bayero University would benefit a lot from China in its effort to start teaching Chinese in the University. He said, “We believe that teaching Chinese language in Nigeria, most especially in Kano, where hundreds of business men are doing their business with China, would boost Nigerian economy.”

Professor Bello said he would love to have an avenue where the Centre for Dryland agriculture would sit together and identify ways to improve research in Dryland Agriculture in the University.

In his speech earlier, Mr Zhang told the Vice Chancellor that the former was at the University to assess the level of its preparation to receive six Chinese Students, who

The Director further revealed that the forum was to sensitize stakeholders to believe that what other nations had achieved, “we equally have the potential to attain the same feat using our level to propel national development”.

Professor Gwarzo said the workshop was the second of its kind since the establishment of the Centre, assuring that it would be a regular one henceforth. It was part of their commitment to make the Centre vibrant in terms of its mandate.

Meanwhile, the Director of CBR disclosed that arrangements were in top gear to secure accreditation from the International Standard Organization (ISO), Standard Organization of Nigeria (SON) and Medical Laboratory Scientists of Nigeria with a view to get its certification, which would enable it to have a collaborative engagement with industries.

Already, he said, contacts had been made and all the procedures were being put in place for the certification from the international bodies. The certification would allow the Centre to carry out programmes on quality control and validation for manufacturing industries and other related organizations.

About 70 people from across the country participated in the workshop, mainly from Universities and other research institutes.

## CDA Organizes International Workshop on Remote Sensing

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture in collaboration with the International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT) organized a five-day workshop on the *Application of Remote Sensing in Semi-Arid Tropics (SAT) using Machine Learning Algorithms and Spectral Matching Techniques (SMTS)* from 26<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> August, 2019.

Some of the objectives of the training were to introduce participants to the potential application of GEE for remote sensing and Geographical Information System in agriculture and other thematic areas and to demonstrate a hands-on training on machine learning algorithms embedded in GEE interface for geospatial processing and image classification.

The workshop would enable the participants to gain practical knowledge of operating the machines and familiarize them with available resources for continued learning of earth engine concepts and establish GEE user group.

The training attracted participants from ICRISAT, India and Kano Office, Zonal Advanced Space Technology Application Laboratory and staff of the Department of Geography, as well as CDA.

Declaring the workshop open, the Deputy Director, Outreach and Publication of the CDA, Professor Amina Mustapha, welcomed the participants and charged them to make good use of the opportunity and learn a lot from the facilitators. She described the training as a good opportunity to gain knowledge, especially from the experienced facilitators from India.

- (iii) Single/Joint Application by the NKO(s) as Listed on the Letter of Administration
- (iv) Marriage Certificate (for spouses)
- (v) Original and Stamped Bank Statement of Account of the Deceased Pensioner from Retirement to Date and/or e-Token as applicable
- (vi) Duly Signed and Stamped NUBAN Single/Joint Bank Account Statement of the NKO(s), with Bank Logo
- (vii) BVN Registration Slip with Clear Picture (stamped and signed by the bank)
- (viii) One (1) Colored Passport Photograph of each NKO
- (ix) Valid Means of Identification (Driving License, International Passport, National I.D Card or Voters Registration Card)

### **Pensioners are also to note the following:**

- (i) All pensioners currently living outside the country will be verified whenever they visit the country provided they show proof of residency outside Nigeria. Such proof should be provided in advance via PTAD's email: [info@ptad.gov.ng](mailto:info@ptad.gov.ng)
- (ii) Mobile verification will be conducted for sick and infirm pensioners. The original documents of the pensioner must be brought to the verification venue together with proof of infirmity for authentication, before mobile verification can be scheduled.
