

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas has re-echoed the enormous contributions of the youth in building the nation, reiterating that they are the future of tomorrow.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas said at the national conference organized by the Center for Economic, Social and Population Research (CESPOR), with the theme: **"The future is youth"** on Tuesday 18th January, 2021 at the Convocation Arena.

He advised the students not to be willing tools in the hands of politicians to jeopardize their future especially now that the 2023 elections are approaching.

"Bayero University is committed to the welfare of students and will continue to create more youth oriented programs to make them more productive," he said.

The Vice Chancellor called on the Ministry of Youth and Sports Development to partner with CESPOR on the youth conference so as to formulate a blue print that will address the challenges the youth are facing. He commended the Ministry for hosting one of the most successful national youth conferences in 2022.

Minister of Youth and Sports Development Mr. Sunday Dare, who was represented by the Chief of Staff in the Ministry, Alhaji Abba Yola, in his key note address, said the theme of the conference was apt and timely because the president believed in investing on the youth and making them more productive.

He said Nigerian youths are making the Nation proud in the area of sports because the Ministry has provided ample

opportunities for them to have first-hand knowledge on Sports.

The Chairman, Economic and Financial Crime Commission (EFCC) Mallam Abdulrasheed Bawa, in his lead paper presentation, said the youth have so much energy in them that will constitute nuisance if not properly managed because they constitute the largest population.

EFCC chairman who was represented by Head of Research, Mr. Biodun Adebanji, said lack of employment, rural urban migration, rapid population growth and poor quality educational standard are some of the factors responsible for the problems bedeviling the nation because it created youth restiveness and ready army for a lot of antisocial behavior.

He advocated the need for effective orientation of the youth by government through the National Orientation Agency and the inclusion of entrepreneurship skills at all educational levels.

Bawa advised that youth should develop themselves to be employable by thinking outside the box with problem solving skills, emotional intelligence and integrity.

The Chairman of the occasion, Prof. Ismaila Tsiga said youth have the ability to shape ideas for the country, and urged them to make use of the opportunity of the conference to realise their potentials.

Earlier, the Director, CESPOR, Dr. Nu'uman Habib, said, the conference was expected to identify and analyze the challenges confronting the Nigerian youths with a view to proffering solutions.

Faculty of Education Holds First Public Lecture on Enterpreneurship

The Faculty of Education on Saturday held its first Public Lecture with the theme: Addressing Self Employability Concerns Among Nigerian Graduates Through Entrepreneurship.

Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Academics, Professor M.S congratulated the faculty for organizing the lecture which was first of its kind and said it was apt considering the fact that the University is making frantic effortsGumel to instill entrepreneurship mindset on students through providing skills acquisition training to help them become self reliant after graduation.

Presenting a keynote address on the theme, the Director General of Small and Medium Enterprise Agency of Nigeria (SMEDAN), Alhaji Dikko Umaru Radda, said certain factors are needed for one to become an entrepreneur such as passion, determination, vision, creativity, capacity to take risks, etc, saying that there is also the need for governments at various levels to create an enabling environments for entrepreneurs to thrive.

He said SMEDAN organizes opportunity fairs with the aim of facilitating backward and forward business linkages, developing the relationship networks that often lead to business and providing access to both local and international market opportunities.

According to him, it was glaring to note that employment opportunities in Nigeria is shrinking daily and putting much pressure on the agency to provide entrepreneurship opportunities for potential business owners. He said achieving such a feat is not something the agency can do alone,, hence the use of workable public-private partnership platforms.

He advocated the need for both state and local governments to work in partnership with SMEDAN to create the environment that will allow entrepreneurs exploit the huge enterprise opportunities that exist.

Earlier in his remarks, the Dean Faculty of Education, Dr. Ali Idris, said the lecture was timely looking at the current situation in the country in which government does not offer enough job opportunities and the industries are not functioning to employ the teaming population of youth. He said this concern has led the youth and graduates to be roaming about the streets in search of jobs.

It is against this background that the faculty invited the SMEDAN DG to come and talk to the students on how to build their future through entrepreneurship.
