



BUK, 17 others Get NCC's Intervention on Broadband Infrastructure for Unlimited Internet Connectivity

*...Pantami Releases 100 Computers, Accessories

Bayero University, Kano has been selected as one of the beneficiary tertiary institutions across the country for the provision of broadband infrastructure that would guarantee unlimited and uninterrupted access to internet connectivity.

It would be recalled that the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas had paid a visit to the Minister of Communications and Digital Economy a few months ago requesting the provision of broadband infrastructure and computers, which the Minister obliged.

The Minister of Communications and Digital Economy, Professor Isa Ali Ibrahim Pantami, who spoke at the launching of the programme in Abuja on Thursday, 24th November, 2022, said the project was in fulfilment of one of the pillars of the National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy (NDEPS 2020-2030) initiated by his ministry.

The Minister explained that the initiative was aimed at boosting the economic drive of the administration in various sectors.

According to him, the project would be implemented by the Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC).

The Minister also said the project was to accelerate broadband penetration in Nigeria and advance the course of digital economy projections for the nation.

Prof. Pantami noted that digital connectivity and expanding access to information played key roles towards boosting the economy.

Prof. Pantami reiterated that digital connectivity, access and skills were critical to human and economic development.

Presenting the letter of award to the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas, the Communications Minister said, "We wish to inform you that Bayero University, Kano has been earmarked as one of the beneficiaries of the broadband infrastructure project."

According to him, the project was under the Digital Literacy Skills in which the Federal Government intended to provide broadband infrastructure in selected tertiary and higher institutions of learning.

Consequently, he said, "Your support is required to enable its implementation."

Under the first phase of the project, a total of 18 universities and other tertiary institutions spread among the six geo-political zones were selected to benefit, including Bayero University, Kano; University Of Lagos; Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria; College of Education (Special), Ibadan, and Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife.

Others were the University of Nigeria, Nsukka; Federal University Of Technology, Owerri, and Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka.

The rest were University of Calabar, University of Benin, University of Port Harcourt, Umaru Musa Yar'Adua University, Katsina, Borno State University and ATBU, Bauchi.

Also to benefit are Gombe State University, Federal University of Technology, Minna, University of Ilorin and University of Abuja.

In a related development, the Minister of Communications and Digital Economy, Prof. Isa Ali Ibrahim Pantami, announced the allocation of 100 brand new computers and their accessories to Bayero University, Kano as part of promised made during the Vice Chancellor's request earlier in the year when he visited him in his office.

The Minister affirm that the provision of the facilities was part of the effort to support educational development.

He said the provision of the facilities was part of a deliberate policy aimed at digitizing the education sector, especially at tertiary level in line with the global best practices so as to ensure quality in teaching, research and learning.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, expressed appreciation to the Minister and said the project would go a long way towards assisting the university in its policy of migrating to online teaching. "Honourable Minister, sir, we are sincerely grateful for selecting our university to be amongst the first beneficiaries of this laudable initiative. We assure you that

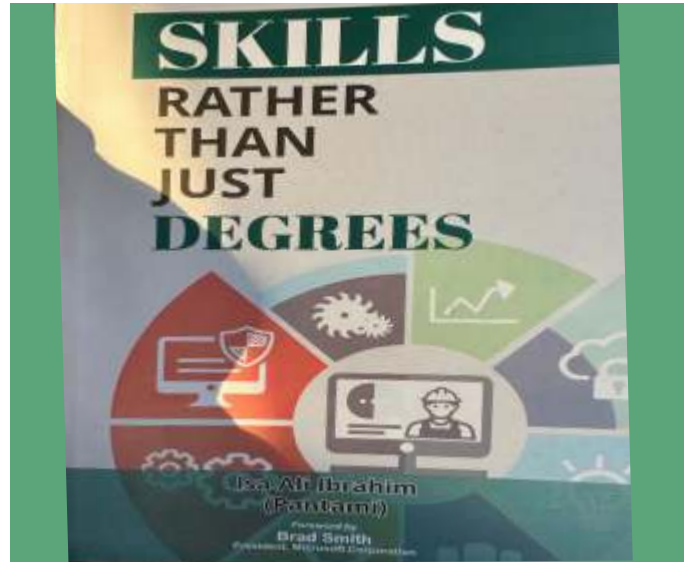

The Minister of Communications and Digital Economy, Professor Isa Ali Ibrahim Pantami, has unveiled another book on skills acquisition.

The launching of the book titled - Skills Rather than Just Degrees - was part of the Minister's contribution to the development of society, took place in Abuja on Thursday, 24th November, 2022.

The book focuses on the importance of skills and its potential impact in addressing the problems of unemployment and underemployment.

The foreword of the book was written by US Attorney Brad Smith, President of Microsoft Corporation, who said the book addresses critical opportunities for individuals, and pointed at the process that could unlock the potential of Africa and the world.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was one of the three eminent scholars that reviewed the book, explained that the publication would serve as

"The book has provided the idea to prepare for career success by focusing on the fundamental skills required for the changing times," said Prof. Abbas.

He noted that the tools, the workforce used today to execute jobs might be obsolete in the next few decades, but the soft and hard skills acquired which are the major focus of the book would last a lifetime.

Another reviewer, Prof. Owunari Abraham Georgewill, Vice Chancellor of University of Port-Harcourt (UNIPOINT), said the book enhances the understanding of how skills can solve challenges like unemployment and underemployment.

The unveiling of the book and broadband launch were part of efforts to implement the National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy (NDEPS) for digital Nigeria.

PRESIDENTIAL COMMITTEE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN OF ACTION FOR PREVENTING FLOOD DISASTER IN NIGERIA

Call for Submission of Memoranda

Following the recent flood that ravaged many parts of the country, President Muhammad Buhari has constituted a high-powered **Committee to Develop a Comprehensive Plan of Action for Preventing Flood Disasters in Nigeria**, under the leadership of **Engr Suleiman H. Adamu FNSE, FAEng, the Honourable Minister of Water Resources**. The Committee has 90 days to submit her report.

2. The Committee's Terms of Reference are:

- a. Assess and review existing plans and policies on the management of flood disasters in Nigeria;
- b. Identify and work with critical stakeholders in Flood Disaster Management;
- c. Identify and visit selected strategic flood-affected and prone areas;
- d. Carry out technical evaluation of the information obtained from the assessment;
- e. Liaise and work with International Organizations with expertise in flood management, where necessary; and
- f. Develop a Comprehensive action plan for preventing flood disasters in Nigeria.

3. In furtherance of the above mandate, the Committee hereby calls for Memoranda from Communities, Academia, Development Partners, Stakeholders, and all Nigerians for the development of a comprehensive Action Plan that would prevent flood disasters in Nigeria.

4. All Memoranda should clearly address the current gaps in flood disaster and prevention in Nigeria, innovative technologies, attitudinal change, infrastructure and other measures to curb floods in Nigeria and the way forward for flood in Nigeria and the way forward for flood disaster prevention.

5. Interested individuals, communities, or organizations are to submit their Memoranda to the Committee:

- In font size 14, and not more than 5,000 words, exclusive of attachments and annexures;
- In soft copy and 25 hard copies;
- Within 14 days of this advertisement, terminating on Thursday, 24th November, 2022.

CDA Conducts International Training on Use of DSSAT Model in Collaboration with WACWISA, Ghana with Participants from 13 Countries

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Bayero University, Kano in collaboration with the West Africa Centre for Water, Irrigation and Sustainable Agriculture (WACWISA), University of Development Studies, Tamale, Ghana, has conducted an international training on the use of DSSAT Model for Assessment of Climate Risks and Environmental Sustainability in Smallholder Agricultural system.

The training was held at the WACWISA training hall from 31st of October to 4th November, 2022. All the 5 resource

The trainees were drawn from 13 different countries and from various disciplines, ranging from agricultural engineers, irrigation engineers, crop breeders, soil scientists, agronomists, industry players and farm managers. The modules covered during the training included: Modeling Agricultural Systems for Future Climate Scenarios over Africa, Simulating Water Limited Production, Simulating Nitrogen and Phosphorus Limited Production and Evaluating Climate Risks and Sustainability in Smallholder Agricultural Production Systems.

The training was done in a very interactive system usually starting with presentations behind the theoretical bases of how DSSAT runs the various components, then a hands-on session where participants were guided to model the various scenarios. The 5-day training was quite impressive as participants demonstrated very good understanding of the system at the end of the training.

A major take-away from the training was the evidence that many young, upcoming and even veteran scientists are still interested in learning and applying the DSSAT model in their various research areas and other applications. One of the participants said at the end of the training, "Thank you for demystifying the DSSAT model". It was a very satisfying moment for the trainers and the trainees, and overall the whole exercise was a success.

Certificate Issuance: Quick 3-Steps Guide To Accessing BUK Certificate

Recently there have been numerous inquiries by BUK Alumni desirous of accessing their original graduation certificates, directed to this Directorate and through student emissaries. In response, it is hoped the following 3-Steps Guide would ease the task:

DOCUMENTS TO BRING

BUK Alumni members will need to bring along the following:

- Original Copy of Statement of Result
- Student ID Card

STEP 1: BUK MICROFINANCE BANK - FEES PAYMENT

The Bank is located between Faculty of Education and FEES Complexes, off the Ring Road; follow the sign posted side-road that runs adjacent to the International Conference Centre (under construction), New Site Campus

- Pay the appropriate **Certificate Fee** - obtain a Remita payment receipt
 - **Earlier than 2021: Please see Appendix One** (pg 3 of this notice for details of the fee to be paid depending on the year of graduation).
 - **2021:** UG N12,000; PGD N18,000; Masters/PhD N20,000 (add N500 Remita/Bank charges for each category)
- Pay the appropriate **Alumni Membership Fees** - obtain a Remita payment receipt (2 copies) – UG N2,000, PGD N5,000; Masters/PhD N10,000 (add N500 Remita/Bank charges for each category). The fees cover the cost of issuance of Alumnus ID card.
- Where an Alumnus has two certificates to collect at the same time, they should pay the Alumni fee for the higher certificate.

The University ONLY requires payment of the above TWO fees and NO OTHER. Please obtain Remita receipt for fees paid immediately.

Alumni are strongly advised NOT to make un-receipted payments to any other person under any pretext, at any of the two next steps in obtaining their certificate.

STEP 2: ADVANCEMENT/ALUMNI RELATIONS OFFICE – ID CARD

Located behind the Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, next to Attahiru Jega Theatre, New Site Campus

- Submit **a copy** of the Alumni Fees Remita payment receipt
- Show appropriate **ID card** to authenticate your identity (eg. National ID).
- Fill in the **Graduation Register**- name, qualification obtained, present address, registration number, alumni

fee paid, GSM number.

- You would be given an Alumnus ID card - fill in your personal details, (later add a passport size photo and laminate). There is no separate payment for this ID card, it is already covered by the Alumni membership fee paid in step 1, at the BUK Microfinance Bank.

STEPS 3: REGISTRAR'S OFFICE, CERTIFICATE ISSUING UNIT

Located on the Fourth Floor, Abubakar Rasheed Senate Building, New Site Campus (turn left on exit from lift and ask for directions)

- Submit (a) Original copy of Statement of Result (b) Student ID Card
- Submit original of appropriate teller and Certificate Fee Remita payment receipt
- Submit **a copy** of the Alumni Fees Remita payment receipt
- Show the newly obtained Alumni membership ID card
- Sign for the Original of your Certificate

Prof Auwal Hussain Tasks Oversea Returnees to Make Judicious Use of Resources

The Project Manager of International Organization for Migration (IOM) project in Bayero University, Professor Muhammad Auwal Hussain, has tasked returnees from overseas and the vulnerable identified in the project to judiciously utilize the resources that would be given to them in order to boost their livelihood.

Professor Hussaini, who is the Dean Faculty of Agriculture, was speaking on Tuesday, 22nd November, 2022 at Mambayya House when the Steering Committee of IOM project interacted with the identified returnees and vulnerable on the enterprises they would select for empowerment. He said judicious utilization of the resources would lead to the chain of employment as beneficiaries would be able to employ others.

In her remarks, a member of the steering committee, Professor Amina Mustapha, told the returnees that they

would be monitored after they established their enterprises for one year, noting that there would be full involvement of their respective communities as individual enterprise would not be allowed.

She said they would be linked to markets and that they would be trained on how to plan and market their businesses.

The participants were trained on cattle fattening; Fish Production; *Nika Garin Tuwo* and Organic Broiler Production.

There were goodwill messages from representatives of National Commission for Migrants and Displaced Persons, NAP TIP, NDE, SEMA, Immigration Services, heads of department of local governments and Commissioner for Youth and Sports Development, who was represented by Director Planning, Alhaji Bashir Uba.

GUIDELINES FOR 2022 JUNIOR STAFF PROMOTION

To: All Provosts, Deans, Directors and Head of Departments/Units

This is to request you to submit to the Junior Staff Unit, your recommendations for the 2022 annual promotions of Junior Staff in your Faculty, Departments/Sections/Units.

1. The candidate(s) being presented for promotion should be confirmed staff and must be qualified academically and professionally. Such staff must have demonstrated exceptional performance meriting promotion.
2. (a) He/she must have served the University for at least 3 years after his/her last promotion.
(b) **For the newly appointed he/she must be confirmed and spent at least three years by 30th September, 2022.**
3. (a) Candidate(s) for promotion to ranks on CONTISS 03 and 04 must have at least three (3) credits in SSCE/GCE or its equivalent, except **Motor Driver**.
(b) Candidate(s) for promotion to CONTISS 05 must have same as (a) above plus a relevant certificate, except **Driver/Mechanics, Artisans, Medical Records Assistant, Medical Technicians, Messenger/Cleaner, Gardner and Groundsmen**.
(c) Candidate for promotion to CONTISS 6 must have any of the following qualifications:
 - a. Two year Diploma in relevant fields;
 - b. Certificate in Public Administration/ plus three O/level credits;
 - c. Professional Diploma in Computer Studies/ plus three O/level credits;
 - d. Clerical Officer Certificate/ plus three O/level credits;
 - e. Assistant Library Officer Certificate/ plus three O/level credits;
 - f. Certificate in Science Laboratory Technology/ plus three O/level credits in science subjects;
 - g. Military Police Special Investigation Course II/ plus three O/level credits;
 - h. Except **Driver/Mechanics**.
4. Staff on study fellowship or who has been granted study fellowship **can be** presented for promotion once.
5. Staff with a **warning letter** in the last 6 months should not be presented for promotion.
6. All re-designation cases (upgrading, change of cadre and conversion) should not be presented to the Junior Staff A & PC, instead it should be directed to the Registrar.
7. Departments should not re-submit cases for promotion which were earlier rejected without acquiring the needed relevant qualification.
8. Staff posted to a new dept/unit must spend at least six months before the new unit can assess him/her for promotion. Staff affected by the recent redeployment should therefore, be assessed by their former head of department.
9. Only November/December O/level is acceptable for promotion after appointment.
10. Ten (10) copies of the attached forms should be completed and submitted in respect of each candidate.
11. All submissions and recommendations are to be submitted to the Junior Staff Office on or before **28th November, 2022**.

NB: Officers presenting candidates for promotion shall be required to come and defend their submissions before the Junior Staff A & PC with their departmental files and photocopies of relevant credentials on the scheduled date.
