In furtherance of its town and gown relationship, the Kano State Ministry for Local Government has donated three state-of-the-art solar powered boreholes to the University.

The project, which was executed under the framework of three local governments of Ungogo, Gwale and Tarauni, was handed over to the University by the Honourable Commissioner for Local Government, Hon. Murtala Sule Garo, who was represented by the Director, local government supervision, Alh. Salisu Dan'azumi Tahir at a ceremony on Friday, 21st January, 2022.

Prof. Abbas said the donation of the boreholes would go a long way to assist the University in the supply of portable water in the campus.
