micro economy through a loan scheme in the Agricultural sector christened: Tertiary Institutions Poultry Revival Scheme (TIPRES).

The objective of the new scheme is to improve production of poultry products in Nigeria.

Speaking during a courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor, on Thursday, 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2022, the Kano Branch Controller of CBN, Malam Babangida Jimoh, said the country was facing serious challenges in poultry farming and that something should be done to address the menace.

He said some of the challenges the country is facing in poultry production include: depleting the nation's foreign reserve as a result of importation. He also mentioned the importation of substandard poultry products into the country with its attendant health consequences on the citizenry.

It was in order to address these menace that the apex bank introduced the scheme with a view to strengthening poultry production and conserving the nation's foreign reserve.

Malam Jimoh disclosed that tertiary institutions were

> Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas commended the Central Bank for intervening in various projects in the Nigerian universities, especially Bayero University which had benefited tremendously from many CBN interventions for over two decades. He said CBN and Bayero University had a long standing relation that provides strength and efficiency in running our university.

> Professor Abbas said Nigerian Universities were facing a lot of financial challenges, saying that with this loan scheme many benefitting universities would boost their internal revenue generation, which would ultimately change Nigerian universities from consumption based to revenue generation institutions.



### **ACEPHAP Collaborates with University Hospital Coventry, United Kingdom**

Discussions have been concluded for possible collaborations between the African Centre of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP), Bayero University and University Hospital Coventry, United Kingdom.

Capacity Building Training in the area of mental and public health will be the focal point of the collaborations.

Speaking at a meeting held at the conference hall of ACEPHAP in Kano between the officials of the Centre led by its Director, Professor Hadiza Shehu Galadanci and the representative of the University Hospital Coventry, UK, Professor Abdullahi Shehu, on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2022, the two institutions have agreed to focus on training of health personnel on short courses as a means of boosting their capacity to deliver.

In her brief presentation, the Director of ACEPHAP, Professor Hadiza Galadanci recalled that when she visited University Hospital Coventry, UK, few years back, she had a useful discussion with Professor Abdullahi on possible areas of collaboration with the University Hospital, adding that at the time of their meeting in the United Kingdom, the centre was relatively new.

She however, said today's meeting was a follow-up to the UK meeting, adding that 'it is highly historic and marks the beginning of good things to happen between the Centre and the University.'

She disclosed that Professor Abdullahi a citizen of Nigeria had assured her during their meeting in UK of his desire to come home and assist the country's health system, adding that 'this collaboration has offered him his desired opportunity to share with Nigerian medical personnel the knowledge he gained while conducting teaching and research in the United Kingdom.'

Professor Galadanci made a brief slide presentation of the activities/achievements of the Centre since its inception to include the followings: winning of World Bank Africa Centre of Excellence Grant of \$6million, E-MOTIVE Research Project Grants from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to conduct E-MOTIVE Trial in collaboration with University of Birmingham, United Kingdom which is being implemented in five countries of Nigeria, Kenya, Tanzania, South Africa, and Sri Lanka. It also won Nigeria's Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFUND) grant on Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA). She also mentioned IVON trial grant won from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation in collaboration with Lagos University Teaching Hospital, Nigeria. Professor Galadanci listed COGENOME Study obtained from 54Gene Corporation as the fourth grant it won. It is to conduct a gene wide study on spirometry values among people with COPD using a case control study design.

She also stated that the centre had entered into collaborations with national and international universities, adding that just recently the centre entered into collaborations with seven universities in Kenya. She concluded that the centre would be willing to work with the University Hospital in the areas of mental health, public health and neurology and any other areas of beneficial to both institutions.

The Director also spoke of the plans of the centre to introduce digital training to strengthen its capacity to train its postgraduate students even during the holidays. Responding, Professor Abdullahi Shehu commended the achievements recorded by the centre and assured the Center of the commitment of University Hospital Coventry to the terms of the collaborations.

He promised to come with a team of medical experts to conduct the training.

The training programme will focus on the training of Resident doctors in Psychiatry, Neurology and Family Medicine as well as Medical Officers from the state hospitals.

According to Prof. Zango, the project tagged "Promoting Accountability and Anti-Corruption through Behavior Change Approaches, 2021-2024" which is funded by MacArthur Foundation has targeted Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Faith-Based Organizations (FBOs), Community-Based Organizations (CBOs), the media, students' associations and relevant government agencies among others.

"We adopt three strategies – skill building, collaboration and gender equality and social inclusion to feature as pathways to achieve strategic goal of the project which was crafted by the Foundation as 'Reduced Corruption through Nigerian-led efforts that strengthen accountability, transparency and participation within span of 10 to 15 years," he said.

He said through the project, the Center has trained over 40 CSOs, FBOs, CBOs, youths and women groups to improve their operations with transparency and accountability.

"Our school-based programs to produce more young anticorruption activists are gaining ascendancy because 11 additional students' interfaith anti-corruption clubs were created by INAC-Kano in some selected secondary schools plus the existing 21 active ones in Bauchi, Benue, Kano and Niger States.

Earlier, the Project Coordinator, Prof. Moses T. Aluaigba said that MacArthur chose the Center due to its transparency and accountability in a project funded by USAID in the past.

He said that the current project targets, is aimed at promoting behaviour change of people with a view to promoting accountability and anti-corruption. He said the project was launched in 2021 and would continue up to 2024.

He hinted that the Center would collaborate with media organizations, Nigerian Bar Association, Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) with a view to coming up with strategies that would help in tackling vote buying.
