BUK's New Research Discovery Raises Hope of Commercial Production of Date Palm in Nigeria

The recent discovery of sex identification of date palm action to produce 100,000 seedlings to Jigawa State for seedlings by researchers from CDA has raised hope of distribution to farmers across the state. commercial production of the commodity in the country with farmers expressing confidence that Nigeria would soon become exporter of this nutritious product, thereby



boosting the country's Growth Domestic Product (GDP),

Recall that the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) of Bayero University, Kano recently conducted a research where it discovered the sex of date palm seedlings.

Before the discovery, farmers in Nigeria had been seriously suffering from differentiating between male and female seedlings which had stalled its mass production. Many farmers had lost hope because it was after years of planting that they would realize that they were all males which could not bear fruits.

However, with the recent discovery, farmers have heaved a sigh of relief that subsistence farming would soon pave the way for commercial production, especially in Jigawa and other parts of the North where there is competitive advantage.

Already, following the development, the Governor of Jigawa State, Alhaji Badaru Abubakar, came to the centre for an interaction where he signed a memorandum of

During an interaction with the farmers, community leaders and traditional rulers held at the Dutse Emirate in Jigawa

State recently, the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) expatiated more on how the research discovery came into fruition as a result of several laboratory tests and analyses at the centre's famous Tissue Culture Laboratory, the best of its kind in Africa.

The Deputy Director Research, Dr. Kabiru Mustapha Umar, who led the delegation, said CDA would continue to partner with farmers and community leaders to address some of the challenges facing them with a view to contributing optimally in terms of boosting food security. He said CDA had been getting massive support from the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas.

Dr Sani Lawan, who presented a paper at the Dutse Emirate, said farming of date palm in Nigeria was at subsistence level, noting that Jigawa State was blessed to grow twice a year during dry and wet seasons.

He added that Nigeria imports 67, 880 tons of date palm every year which cost N170 billion, noting that if the farming was done in Nigeria and the money got into the hands of our farmers, it would significantly boost income generation and improve the farming of date palm in the country.

The Emir of Dutse, who was represented by the District Head of Balagu, Alhaji Shehu Datti, said farmers of date palm in Nigeria were excited when the news was brokered and Jigawa State being the hub of date palm would maximally utilize the opportunity in order to boost its farming, thereby becoming the net exporter.

BUK, 5 Others Get N37m TETFu esearch Grant on Inter-faith Dialogue

Bayero University, Kano along with five other technology in promoting religious tolerance. universities from across the six geo-political zones has been allocated a special grant by the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) to carry out a research work on interfaith dialogue aimed at promoting national integration.

The project, which is aimed at promoting national integration amongst the undergraduate students of tertiary institutions, was funded under the agency's National Research Fund (NRF) programme.

Speaking during a courtesy call on the Vice Chancellor on Thursday, 1st December, 2022, the Principal Investigator of the Research Team, Professor Afis Oladosu from University of Ibadan, mentioned the participating universities as Bayero University, Kano; University of Ibadan; University of Port Harcourt; Imo State University; University of Abuja and Gombe State University.

According to him, thirteen researchers from the aforementioned institutions were selected with six out of them as co-principal investigators representing each of the universities.

He disclosed that TETFund had set aside a whopping N37 million for the project which

would be executed within two years. The title of the research work is "Using Interfaith Dialogue as Tool for National Integration."

Professor Oladosu noted that the team had identified lack of peaceful coexistence amongst various religious adherents as a serious problem facing the country, especially among the undergraduate students.

"We observed that despite the various programmes initiated in the society towards the promotion of national cohesion, regrettably, many of our youths, especially the undergraduate students, have been excluded and, therefore, we feel there is the need to carry them along,' he declared.

The Principal Investigator told the Vice Chancellor that Professor Abbas expressed readiness to render any part of the programme outlined to be executed included conduct of regular workshops, seminars, library research, survey as well as deployment of digital of full support so as to succeed in this endeavour."

Equally, 300 students would be given a special training on interfaith tolerance with each of the six universities providing 50 students on the basis of 50-50 from each religion of Islam and Christianity. This would make them serve as peace ambassadors even after their graduation.

He said in addition to informing the Vice Chancellor about the progress made in the project so far, the visit was

Recently there have been numerous inquiries by BUK Alumni desirous of accessing their original graduation certificates, directed to this Directorate and through student emissaries. In response, it is hoped the following 3-Steps Guide would ease the task:

DOCUMENTS TO BRING

BUK Alumni members will need to bring along the following:

- · Original Copy of Statement of Result
- Student ID Card

STEP 1: BUK MICROFINANCE BANK - FEES PAYMENT

The Bank is located between Faculty of Education and FEES Complexes, off the Ring Road; follow the sign posted side-road that runs adjacent to the International Conference Centre (under construction), New Site Campus

- Pay the appropriate **Certificate Fee** obtain a Remita payment receipt
 - *Earlier than 2021*: Please see Appendix One (pg 3 of this notice for details of the fee to be paid depending on the year of graduation).
 - 2021: UG N12,000; PGD N18,000; Masters/PhD N20,000 (add N500 Remita/Bank charges for each category)
- Pay the appropriate Alumni Membership Fees obtain a Remita payment receipt (2 copies) – UG N2,000, PGD N5,000; Masters/PhD N10,000 (add N500 Remita/Bank charges for each category). The fees cover the cost of issuance of Alumnus ID card.
- Where an Alumnus has two certificates to collect at the same time, they should pay the Alumni fee for the higher certificate.

The University ONLY requires payment of the above TWO fees and NO OTHER. Please obtain Remita receipt for fees paid immediately.

Alumni are strongly advised NOT to make un-receipted payments to any other person under any pretext, at any of the two next steps in obtaining their certificate.

STEP 2: ADVANCEMENT/ALUMNI RELATIONS OFFICE – ID CARD

Located behind the Musa Abdullahi Auditorium, next to Attahiru Jega Theatre, New Site Campus

- Submit **a copy** of the Alumni Fees Remita payment receipt
- Show appropriate **ID card** to authenticate your identity (eg. National ID).
- Fill in the **Graduation Register** name, qualification obtained, present address, registration number, alumni

fee paid, GSM number.

You would be given an Alumnus ID card - fill in your personal details, (later add a passport size photo and laminate). There is no separate payment for this ID card, it is already covered by the Alumni membership fee paid in step 1, at the BUK Microfinance Bank.

STEPS 3: REGISTRAR'S OFFICE, CERTIFICATE ISSUING UNIT

Located on the Fourth Floor, Abubakar Rasheed Senate Building, New Site Campus (turn left on exit from lift and ask for directions)

- Submit (a) Original copy of Statement of Result (b) Student ID Card
- Submit original of appropriate teller and Certificate Fee Remita payment receipt
- Submit **a copy** of the Alumni Fees Remita payment receipt
- Show the newly obtained Alumni membership ID card
- · Sign for the Original of your Certificate

NO REPRESENTATION, OWNERS ONLY TO SIGN FOR CERTIFICATE

Certificate owners should personally obtain their certificates.
