# BUK VC Urges Philanthropists to Support Indigent Students

he Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas has called on wealthy individuals and corporate bodies to support the needy students under it's policy of indigent scholarship scheme.

Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who spoke on Tuesday, 8th August, 2023 when he visited Alhaji Auwalu Abdullahi Rano in his office, said increasing the registration fee for students was not the will of the University, but out of necessity.

He said the University was spending huge amount of money on electricity, outsourced security, water, fueling of generators, buying diesel, among many other things and what the government gives as overhead cost is nothing to write home about.

According to the Vice Chancellor as at now only half of the students paid their registration fee in view of the recent removal of fuel subsidy which led to the hike in the prices of goods and services.

The Vice Chancellor said he embarked on a mission of contacting philanthropists to come to the aid of indigent students, saying that the Almighty Allah would reward them generously.

He said everyone is aware of the generosity and philanthropic gestures of the AA Rano in terms of humanitarian support and education development, adding that the beneficiaries would significantly appreciate the support in their entire life.

In his part, Alhaji Auwalu Rano said it was his tradition to assist the less privilege in the society through his philanthropic programme in the rural and urban areas. He said he was happy with the proposal of the Vice Chancellor to help the indigent students, saying that was the only way to save their studies.

The CEO of AA Rano while commending the Vice Chancellor for this laudable initiative, said he would be willing to pay for the scholarship of the identified indigent students, who will be carefully selected through a screening procedure.

He said he would welcome a joint effort between his representative and that of the University to workout modalities of selecting the beneficiaries.

## Registration Fee Hike: Hundreds of BUK Students Get Indigent Scholarsh

Hundreds of students of Bayero University are to benefit university authority over the new charges, Prof Abbas with the indigent scholarship scheme from corporate explained that BUK charges the least registration fee in the bodies and other wealthy individuals to pay for their entire northern Nigeria. registration.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas disclosed this on Thursday, 10th August, 2023 when he received members of the Kano State Nigeria Union of Journalists Correspondent's Chapel in his office. He noted that many wealthy individuals have responded to solicitations made by the Management on the need to come to the aid of the needy students.

"As at last count over 500 students have gotten sponsorships from various individuals and corporate

bodies, notable among whom are the Senator representing Kano Central, Senator Rufa'i Sani Hanga, who pledged to pay for 200 students. He said Alhaji Auwalu Abdullahi Rano, a business mogul also promised to sponsor students from the three senatorial districts of Kano State.

The Vice Chancellor added that a member representing Bichi Federal Constituency, Honourable Kabiru Abubakar Kabir has been sponsoring over 100 students over the years, in addition to Honorable Alhasan Ado Doguwa, who promised to sponsor many students," said the VC.

Professor Abbas explained that the decision to increase the registration fee was necessitated by the current economic realities and high cost of running the institution.

He further explained that the University management spends over N100 million monthly on electricity, water supply, security among other municipal services to run the university and keep teaching and learning at its best, explaining that there was no deliberate plan to make life difficult or deny students access to education.

The VC disclosed that the university received about N11 million monthly from the Federal government as overhead cost, the amount which said was only received four times in the last eight months.

"Before the university came up with the current fee, we did a general analysis of the cost of everything we dispense and the final fee is the minimum to run the system. Anything below that standard will fall short of standard and that will negatively affect the academic and administrative system.

In a related development, the national body of the Nigerian Universities Engineering Students Association (NUESA) has paid registration for 39 undergraduate students in different fields of studies.

The President of the association, comrade Umar Ibrahim Farouk, stated this on Tuesday, 8th August, 2023 when they visited the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas and presented the list of the beneficiary students.

Comrade Farouk explained that the project has been on for many years in which members tasked themselves to generate money and pay for some indigent students across universities. It was this time that they paid about four million Naira to the BUK students.

In his response, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas commended the benevolence of the association and urged other bodies to emulate. He said education is the responsibility of all and that the earlier we adopt the policy of helping one another, the better for our generation and the society.

The beneficiary students are from the Faculty of Engineering, Computing, Clinical Sciences and Allies Health Sciences.

Twenty four years into the current political dispensation in He argued that it is not that political parties are deficient in Nigeria, implementation of party manifestos is glaringly more of political gimmick than reality. Prof. Kamilu Sani Fage disclosed this at the 7<sup>th</sup> Public Lecture to Mark the 73<sup>rd</sup> Anniversary of the Northern Elements Progressive Union (NEPU).

The event took place on Tuesday, 8<sup>th</sup> August, 2023 at Mubayya House, Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies, Bayero University Kano.

While presenting his paper entitled: "Implementing Political Party Manifestos in Nigeria's Fourth Republic: Fiction or Reality", Prof. Fage said that implantation of party manifesto has remained a major problem in Nigeria's political system due to politicians' attitude towards party manifestos as unimportant and only a means through which their vested interest could be protected. However, they joined parties only for nomination sake and if they failed to secure tickets, they leave for another party without any hesitation.

manifestos rather implementation has been a major concern as soon as they are voted into the positions of leadership. He emphasized that unless we hold onto 'politics of issues' which are established on principles and well-articulated party manifestos, our search for good governance will continue to be a work in futility.

He added that party manifestos are at inception were planned to fail because they are embedded with impracticable and unbelievable campaign promises that seemed to create suspicion between the politicians and the electorates.

According to the university don, to remedy the situation, he pointed out that leaders must dedicate themselves to good governance and consolidation of our democracy, multidimensional war against corruption and raising citizen's awareness to compel government to deliver on its campaign promises.

Earlier speaking, the Vice Chancellor who was represented by the DVC Research and Development, Prof. Abdullahi Sule-Kano, decried how present political parties are bereft of articulated programs. "Neither are they defined by ideologies nor are they consistent with their manifestos. The real challenge is how to bring back public purpose into party politics," said VC.

He explained that Mubayya House as an institution of the University has a mandate to continuously pay tribute to the memories of those who contributed immensely for the development of democracy and the emancipation of the oppressed masses. It is in line with this; the Centre is upgrading Malam Aminu Kano Living History Museum and implementing the NEPU History Research Project.

In their separate remarks, attendees at the event took turn to recall with nostalgia the struggles in the formation of NEPU as the first political party in northern Nigeria and how its founding members fought for human rights and stood firmly against any form of injustice even in the face intimidation.

While delivering vote of thanks, the Director Mubayya House, Prof. Habu Muhammad Fage, expressed gratitude

to the Speakers, family members of the NEPU founding members and everyone that honoured their invitation.
