The outcome of the ranking exercise christened *Young University Ranking* was contained in the *Times Higher Education* (THE) website.

The exercise was for younger Universities of between the ages of 50 and below. The Times Higher Education it was learnt used 13 matrics for the assessment of the participating universities which included; Core Mission, Teaching, Research, Knowledge transfer and outlook among others.

At the end of the transparent exercise, BUK was ranked 3rd best among universities in Nigeria and 401 to 500 globally.

It was not the first time Bayero University will excel in the United Kingdom based world academic assessor, *Times Higher Education* (THE) ranking exercise. In October 2022 the University was ranked as the best in Nigeria in terms of international outlook. Not only that, BUK was ranked as 4th best in Nigeria behind universities of Lagos, Ibadan and Covenant. This means, Bayero University remains the best university in the entire northern, south eastern and south-south geo-political zones.

10th CDA Industry Lecture: Dr. Soman Gives Recipes for Effective Academia-Industry Collaboration

Dryland Agriculture (CDA) which focused on the irrigation. industry-Academia Collaboration.

Dr Soman explained that both academia and industry need one another in that their collaboration is key to catalyze innovation and growth in technology and can yield accelerated development of new breakthroughs.

According to him while the industry often focuses on addressing solutions that are of near-term commercialization, the academia on the other hand focuses on building new technology through research and imparting education to students. He said industry partnerships are instrumental in advancing research and creating a skilled workforce, adding that industry gains

Dr Soman noted that industry gains work ready talent with specialist knowledge and practical training and the universities benefit by having opportunities to work on relevant technologies and challenging problems.

Using academia/industry engagement experience of JAIN Irrigation in India, the presenter said the Irrigation firm has a comprehensive collaboration with 27 universities in India citing many examples such as a partnership with IIT Mumbai and Chanakya Foundation in which they are working together to develop a soil moisture sensor enabling predictive irrigation with Jain Irrigation as a

University of Agric. Sciences, Umea Plant Science Centre, National Botanical research Institute, Lucknow, India and North Maharashtra University in the area of Crop Improvement.

One of the collaborative research projects, according to him is that Jain irrigation realized that the Indian onions are of low TSS (12% and less) and would not be useful for the large dehydration facility built at Jalgaon Headquarters, noting that buying seeds of high TSS from USA is not a viable option in the long term. As such, they decided to enter into onion breeding to enhance TSS and be competitive in that business.

He added that Jain recruited a team of scientists in India and worked intensively for 5 years the result which showed a high TSS (15%) variety of white onion and several high TSS breeding lines.

Dr Soman noted that the future of industry-academia collaboration would probably be more and more common place since major innovations are hardly ever done in isolation, not even by the largest companies.

He advised that collaborative learning capabilities would

be required more often from all the participating parties, saying that while academic institutions create knowledge, industries look for actionable knowledge items.

Speaking after the presentation, the Director CDA, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin said this is what is expected of the CDA Industry Lecture, to have an enriching lecture which would improve the capacity of PhD and MSc students and opened a vista of collaboration between CDA and Jain Irrigation. He said the two institutions would strengthen their collaboration on many other areas including sending PhD students for internship programme.

The CDA Coordinator Training, Dr Murtala Muhammad Badamasi, had earlier introduced the speaker, whom he said is a world renowned agricultural scientist with proficiency and expertise in micro-fertigation and precision farming.

Members of Bayero University's Anti-Corruption and Commission (ICPC) has established over 4855 ACTU Transparency Unit (ACTU) have been inaugurated and sworn-in to office by the officials of Independent Corrupt Practices and other related Commission (ICPC) with the mandate to prevent all forms of corrupt practices and educate members of the University community on transparency and accountability.

The Unit shall also ensure the elimination of corrupt practices in line with the provision of ICPC Act 2000 and apply the ethics and integrity compliance scorecard.

units across Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) in the country.

According to the head of SSR Unit of the ICPC, Shehu Dange, the ACTU shall operate as an autonomous outfit in the university with functional linkage to the office of the Vice Chancellor and their independence and protection shall be guaranteed.

The Head of SSR Unit said the ACTU members shall perform their duties from Section 6AF of the ICPC except prosecution, but can prevent the corrupt practices and enlighten the people on accountability and transparency.

He explained that members of ACTU are to be invaded into the university's statutory committees that include appointment, procurement and disciplinary to ensure transparency, accountability and due diligence in the discharge of official duties.

The members were told that they have the mandate to liaise with the Vice Chancellor to report all alleged corrupt cases to the ICPC.

In his remark, the Chairman of BUK ACTU, Dr. Nu'uman Habib said they were honoured to be selected to serve as members and that they would do their work diligently in line with the standing order.

The Vice Chancellor, who was delighted with the inauguration of the ACTU members in BUK, said the university has been operating in an open and transparent manner. He said a right-thinking person would welcome the idea of establishing ACTU to checkmate corrupt practices and other related matters.

He said in Bayero University, Kano, the Vice Chancellor does not take unilateral decisions, explaining that the University has Principal Officers and University Management Committee meetings in which decisions are unanimously taken and adopted.

"Call any member of Pos or UMC an ask him about university\s management decision, he will instantly tell you how a decision is taken. This is because everyone is carried along in this university," VC added.

The Vice Chancellor expressed the university's readiness and determination to give all the necessary support to the ACTU members to discharge their functions without any hitch or hindrance.

He said BUK is willing and ready to extend hands of fellowship to the Police by providing services and designing courses to specifically meet the needs of the Police.


Prof. Abbas also hinted the police Commissioner that the University is facing challenges from land speculators and encroachment.
