Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) has announced a grant of one billion naira to Bayero University's Centre for Renewable Energy in its 2023 intervention project.

This was disclosed by the TETFund's Director of Research and Development, Dr. Salihu Girei, during a courtesy call Wednesday, 18th May, 2023.

He said the team was in Bayero University, Kano to see for itself the activities going on in the Centre with a view to identifying areas of challenges and proffer possible solutions to them.

On how to access the funds, Dr. Girei said he had a useful discussion with the leadership of the Centre and assured that there would not be any hurdle on its way to accessing the funds. He also promised additional funds to support the Centre in order to make it self-reliant as well as create jobs.

Dr. Girei also disclosed that TETFund would further support BUK with additional N500 million to enable it establish an innovation hub where researches could be transformed into products and services as many good researches ended up on the shelves.

## **ACEPHAP Records Major Milestone in the Fight Against Postpartum Haemorrhage**

Africa Centre of Excellence for Population Health and childbirth globally.' Bill Gates is a well-known Policy (ACEPHAP) in collaboration with University of Birmingham, World Health Organization (WHO) and E-MOTIVE Research Teams from Tanzania, Kenya and South Africa have recorded a major breakthrough in the fight against postpartum haemorrhage (PPH), a potentially life-threatening complication of childbirth.

The exciting news was revealed on Tuesday May 9th, 2023, by E-Motive Researchers including the Director of the Centre, Professor Hadiza Galadanci, who p resented the result on behalf of all the Emotive Research Teams to the World at the International Maternal Newborn Health Conference (IMNHC2023) in Cape Town, South Africa.

According to their presentation, postpartum haemorrhage is a serious complication that affects millions of women worldwide, particularly in low- and middle-income countries where access to emergency obstetric care is limited. PPH causes significant maternal morbidity and mortality, making it a major public health concern.

They painted a pathetic picture of the effect of PPH statistics on humanity. Every year, there are some 24 million women who experienced postpartum haemorrhage in the world, resulting in over 74,000 maternal deaths; i.e., a death in every 7 minutes. The vast majority of these deaths are preventable.

They Stated that E-MOTIVE intervention overcomed three challenges faced by facilities when addressing Postpartum Haemorrhage; the delay in the diagnosis of Postpartum Haemorrhage, the delay in the delivery of effective first-response treatment, and the delay in escalation for continued bleeding.

Professor Galadanci declared that E-motive intervention improved the diagnosis and bundled treatment resulting in an immense 60% (relative) reduction in severe PPH, defined as blood loss of  $\geq 1$  oomls. This means a reduction in the number of women having severe PPH from around 43/1000 women to about 16/1000 women.

Shedding more light on the efficacy of the discovery, the ACEPHAP Director explained that the intervention also showed a 29% (relative) reduction in blood transfusion for postpartum bleeding. This means a reduction in the number of women needing blood transfusion for postpartum bleeding from 19/1000 women to about 12/1000 women. In addition, there was also a reduction of deaths and PPH related deaths with E-Motive Intervention.

Professor Galadanci added that the significance of this new treatment had been acknowledged by several notable figures, including Bill Gates, who tweeted about it on May 9, 2023. He said; 'I'm very encourage by the E-Motive Trial results released today at IMNHC2023 to treat postpartum haemorrhage. This new approach led by University of Birmingham and World Health Organization (WHO) could drastically improve women's chances of surviving

philanthropist and has been a leading advocate for global health initiatives. The WHO Executive Director, Dr. Tedros Adhanom has also posted about the breakthrough on their website, recognising the importance of this development in the field of maternal health.

The ACEPHAP Director said this new intervention was a testament of the power of global collaboration and the importance of investing in research and innovation. It is a major step in the fight against PPH and is expected to save many lives in the years to come. She is of the view that this life-saving solution was a significant milestone in the ongoing fight against reducing maternal deaths due to



PPH. It highlighted the importance of investing in research and innovation to improve global health outcomes. "With continued collaboration and investment, we can look forward to a brighter future for women and their families around the world,' she concluded.

It could be recalled that ACEPHAP had won a grant of \$1,928,504.59 from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to conduct E-MOTIVE Trial in collaboration with University of Birmingham, United Kingdom.

The E-MOTIVE trial which stands for "Early detection of postpartum haemorrhage and treatment using the World Health Organization MOTIVE First response bundle: a cluster randomised trial with health economic analysis and mixed methods evaluation, is aimed at preventing maternal deaths by implementing the World Health Organization (WHO) prevention and treatment guideline for Postpartum Haemorrhage. It was implemented in four countries of Nigeria, Kenya, Tanzania and South Africa, with World Health Organization and University of Birmingham as coordinators. The result of the E-motive trial has been published in one of the highest impact journal ; New England Journal of Medicine (https://www.nejm.org/doi/full/10.1056/NEJMoa230396

#### **GUIDELINES FOR 2023 JUNIOR STAFF PROMOTION**

This is to request you to submit to the Junior Staff Unit, your recommendations for the 2023 annual promotions of Junior Staff in your Faculty, Departments/Sections/Units.

- 1. The candidate(s) being presented for promotion should be confirmed staff and must be qualified academically and professionally. Such staff must have demonstrated exceptional performance meriting promotion.
- 2 (a) He/she must have served the University for at least 3 years after his/her last promotion.
  - (b) For the newly appointed he/she must be confirmed and spent atleast three years by 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2023.
- 3 (a) Candidate(s) for promotion to ranks on CONTISS 03 and 04 must have atleast three (3) credits in SSCE/GCE or its equivalent, except **Motor Driver**.
  - (b) Candidate(s) for promotion to CONTISS 05 must have same as (a) above plus a relevant certificate, except **Driver/Mechanics**, **Artisans**, **Medical Records Assistant**, **Medical Technicians**, **Messenger/Cleaner**, **Gardner and Groundsmen**.
  - (c) Candidate for promotion to CONTISS 6 must have any of the following qualifications:
    - a. Two year Diploma in relevant fields;
    - b. Certificate in Public Administration/ plus three O/level credits;
    - c. Professional Diploma in Computer Studies/ plus three O/level credits;
    - d. Clerical Officer Certificate/plus three O/level credits;
    - e. Assistant Library Officer Certificate/ plus three O/level credits;
    - f. Certificate in Science Laboratory Technology/ plus three O/level credits in science subjects;
    - g. Military Police Special Investigation Course II/ plus three O/level credits;
    - h. Except Driver/Mechanics.
- 4 Staff on study fellowship or who has been granted study fellowship **can be** presented for promotion once.

- 5 Staff with a warning letter in the last 6 months should not be presented for promotion.
- 6 All re-designation cases (upgrading, change of cadre and conversion) should not be presented to the Junior Staff A & PC, instead it should be directed to the Registrar.
- 7 Departments should not re-submit cases for promotion which were earlier rejected without acquiring the needed relevant qualification.
- 8 Staff posted to a new dept/unit must spend atleast six months before the new unit can assess him/her for promotion. Staff affected by the recent redeployment should therefore, be assessed by their former head of department.
- 9 Only November/December O/level is acceptable for promotion after appointment.
- 10 Two (2) copies of the attached forms should be completed and submitted in both hard and soft copy in respect of each candidate.
- 11 All submissions and recommendations are to be submitted to the Junior Staff Office on or before 31st May, 2023 late submission would not be entertained.
- **NB**: Officers presenting candidates for promotion shall be required to come and defend their submissions before the Junior Staff A & PC with their departmental files and photocopies of relevant credentials on the scheduled date.
