CDA Collaborates with ICRISAT to Unveil Blueprint for Regional Innovation and Entrepreneurship Hub (RITEH) at BUK

In a significant effort at bolstering agricultural innovation and entrepreneurship in Nigeria, the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Bayero University, Kano in collaboration with the International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT), successfully hosted a 5-day write-shop from October 16th to 20th, 2023.

The main objective of this initiative was to establish a Regional Innovation, Teaching, and Entrepreneurship Hub (RITEH) at CDA, designed to provide comprehensive training in processing technologies, product development techniques, infrastructure facilities and entrepreneurial skills to a diverse range of stakeholders, including students, aspiring entrepreneurs, rural youth and women across Nigeria.

The write-shop, which brought together an eclectic group of participants, featured experts from ICRISAT, researchers, academicians, government officials, bank

staff, students, NGOs, and startups. The event was inaugurated by Professor Sanusi Gaya Mohammed, the CDA Deputy Director, who emphasized the pivotal role this initiative plays in advancing agricultural innovation and sustainable practices in Nigeria.

Dr. Murtala Muhammad Badamasi, Coordinator Training of CDA, warmly welcomed the experts and participants and provided an overarching overview of the write-shop's purpose.

Dr. Victor Afari-Sefa, Director of Enabling Systems for Transformation at ICRISAT India, reiterated the significance of establishing RITEH and presented an overview of the progress made by CDA. He outlined the future plans for establishing this innovation hub in Kano region of Nigeria.

Throughout the write-shop, various sessions were conducted to enhance agricultural value chain interventions, promote gender-sensitive and nutrisensitive food systems, explore processing technologies and showcase case studies of successful innovation hubs and startup training programs. Notably, startups from India presented a range of innovative solutions in digital agriculture, precision agriculture and drone-based agricultural solutions that have the potential to revolutionize the agricultural landscape in Nigeria through RITEH.

The write-shop also included site visits to existing innovation hubs in Kano, where experts had the opportunity to interact with students and startups. An ideation workshop was organized to encourage participants to nurture their entrepreneurial aspirations.

Prof. Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin, Director of CDA, South collaboration. expressed CDA's unwavering commitment to establish RITEH for the benefit of the Nigerian farming community and extended gratitude to ICRISAT for its invaluable support and guidance in setting up this hub.

To further garner support for the establishment of innovation, entrepreneurship and sustainable RITEH in Kano, a delegation consisting Bayero University staff and ICRISAT team members visited the High Commissioner office of India in Abuja. They briefed Indian officials about the significance of RITEH and requested support under the umbrella of South-

Centre for Qur'anic Studies Organizes Workshop for *Qur'anic*, *Islamiyya* Teachers

he Center for Qur'anic Studies has organized capacity building workshop for Qur'anic and Islamiyya teachers as part of efforts to integrate modern techniques in the study of Qur'an right from the grass root level.

The workshop that took place on Friday, 20th and Saturday 21st October, 2023 at Abubakar Rasheed Board Room, Faculty of Physical Sciences were aimed at improving the quality of the teaching method as well as injecting the best practices in the memorization of the Qur'an by the *Islamiyya* pupils.

Speaking at the opening ceremony, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, commended the Center for Our'anic Studies for organizing such an all important workshop which he said would go a long way improved the operations of the Islamiyya schools.

Represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Management Services, Professor Mahmoud Umar Sani, the Vice Chancellor noted that the Center had justified its establishment which was primarily to improve the study of Qur'an in the country and Africa in general.

Earlier, in his welcome address, the Director of the Center for Qur'anic Studies, Professor Ahmad Murtala, said the workshop was specifically organized for Qur'anic and Tahfeez teachers from within and outside Kano State with a view to improving their operations.

He said the Centre in collaboration with Ameer and Mihtafir Khair organization decided to come up with the programme which is expected to identifying challenges they are facing and ways to address them.

According to him, in addition to making them more organized, the schools could also be trained on modern teaching methods of the Qur'an as well as inculcate the good teaching content of the Holy book, saying that for a person to memorize Qur'an and know its meaning he will have the advantage of becoming more productive and beneficial to the society.

He said new teaching methods were introduced in the teaching of Qur'an. The new method will go a long way in inculcating discipline and good character in students which will have the positive effect in good morality and improvement in societal armament.

Presenting a paper titled "Model Islamic Schools and Memorization of the Qur'an: Reality, Challenges and Prospects," Engineer Bashir Adamu Aliyu, emphasized the need to integrate teaching of Qur'an by rebuilding Muslim education paradigm with a stress to vital elements of spiritual and moral excellence. This, he said is urgently needed for the regeneration of Muslim life and culture.

Dr Aliyu noted that education, particularly Qur'anic

Studies should cater for the growth of man in all its aspect; spiritual, intellectual, imaginative, physical, scientific, linguistic both individually and collectively and motivate all these aspects towards goodness and the attainment of perfection.

He regretted however that the existing conditions in present day educational institutions in most Muslim countries do not truly reflect the Islamic ideal, these institutions do not play their rightful role in the education of the younger generation in Islamic faith, thought and

As a way forward, he suggested to have a clear entry level assessment process, well defined qira'ah methodology, effective Tajweed/Tilawa programme, effective training on Hifz, revision and linking strategies and minimum graduation standard as well as assessing both memory and understanding.

Other papers were presented by Dr. Tijjani Zubairu Rabi'u on Strategic Planning for Tahfizul Qur'an; Al-Mahir Bil Qur'an Project by Dr Nura Abdullahi and Concrete Our anic Memorization: Techniques and Work Plan by Dr. Shuaibu Mukhtar Shuaibu.

Many participants expressed delight for the workshop which they said was timely.

CGS in Collaboration with CIPP, Mercy Corps Organizes Dialogue on Impact of Conflicts on Vulnerable People

Centre for Gender Studies in collaboration with maximum support to make life easier for them. Community Initiative to Promote Peace (CIPP) and Mercy Corps has organized a one-day dialogue on the impact of conflict and criminality on women and people with disability (PWD), The dialogue took place on Monday 25th September 2023 at the CGS Conference Room.

The Director of the Center, Dr. Suwaiba Ahmad Sa'id, in her remarks, said research has shown that women and people with disabilities are more vulnerable because they are not strong like men who have the ability and strength to defend themselves.

She said the dialogue had become a necessity so as to see how women could tackle insecurity through strategy that could mitigate crime and criminality in the society.

The Director said BUK is sensitive to students with special needs because the University has special facilities and special needs section in the library to make life easier for people with disability. She said BUK is open for collaboration that would improve their lives.

Professor Maikano Madaki spoke on actions that should be taken to support PWD to mitigate the problems they encounter, saying that society should accord them special waiver and think of a way to help and support them.

He said individuals should go back to their communities, identify people with special needs and give them

Prof. Madaki said Kano State had signed disability bills into law which would enable people with disability to assess free education, automatic employment among others, but it is yet to be implemented. He, therefore, advised vulnerable people to seek support, participate in decision making and speak with to voice.

Some of the participants who were asked to share their experiences said stigmatization and rejection are some of the challenges they face in the society even from family members in some cases.


While expressing his gratitude to the Faculty, Department, and his team for their massive support, he reassured the students that many more interesting and educating programmes were underway.

The Dean of the Faculty of Clinical Sciences, Dr. Idris Meanwhile, participants have observed with dismay that of test results from clinical laboratories in Nigeria.

> Equally, it noticed the inadequate and uncoordinated regulation and oversight of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine practice in Nigeria.

> A communique issued also frowned at poor funding for Clinical Chemistry and Clinical Laboratory services in Nigeria, resulting in poor quality laboratory results.

> There is thus an urgent need to prioritize the funding and improvement of Clinical Chemistry and Clinical Laboratory services in Nigeria in order to achieve minimum international standards for improved healthcare delivery in the country.

> > It called for mentorship of young Pathologists and Laboratory Scientists for improvement of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine practice in Nigeria.

> > The communique equally call for an urgent need to streamline legislation for the regulation, control and oversight of Clinical Chemistry and Clinical Laboratory services in Nigeria.

> > There is urgent need for legislation to prescribe minimum standards for the setting up, running and licensing of Clinical Laboratories in Nigeria, including the necessity for compulsory periodic participation in local and international Accreditation and External Quality Assessment programmes to improve the quality of laboratory

results in Nigeria for improved healthcare delivery in the country.

Other measures suggested include the urgent need to review the training priorities and curriculum for Pathologists and Laboratory Scientists of the future, including the addition of more clinical training components, considering the rapidly evolving world of novel technological techniques in medical diagnostics, molecular and genetic techniques and artificial intelligence (AI).

The association requested that the government should increase the budgetary allocation to the health sector to at least the minimum African Union benchmark (Abuja Declaration) of 15% for improved funding of Clinical Laboratories in order to improve Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine practice in Nigeria and discourage brain drain of highly trained laboratory professionals.

According to him, the work of a level coordinator and examination officer is a service to humanity without expecting reward even when at times students and even parent rained insults at them without knowing the efforts they put in the discharge of their duties.

He, therefore, urged them to be up to date so as to understand the business more and try not to be found wanting in whatever form.

presentation titled: "Schedules and Duties of Level Coordinators, Departmental Exam Officers and Faculty Exam Officers," said a level coordinator is a person who coordinates and steers the activities of students under his coordination.

He said a level coordinator is an academic adviser who is saddled with the responsibilities of registering and opening students' files; providing courses for students to register and guiding them through among other responsibilities.

According to him, Departmental Exam Officer collects exam question papers and marking scheme from course lecturers and also liaises with the departmental quality assurance committee to vet the questions and marking

Dr. A A. Aliko in his presentation on "Examination Preparation," said exam officer should be familiar with the exam policies such as schedules, absence from exam, misconduct and penalties. He said it is important that synergy is formed between the faculty exam officer and departmental exam officer.

He said level coordinators should ensure that they generate list per department and level to know the actual number of students, while departmental exam officer should ensure venue is well equipped and arranged.

Dr. Muhammed N. Danjuma in his presentation titled " Handling of Misconduct Cases," said the University has a zero tolerance for possession of electronic devices which include mobile phone, Ipod, MP3 players and any form of smart watch that is either switched on or off during exam.

Others who made presentations at the workshop were Dr. Musa Alkali and Dr. Abdulaziz Umar Raji, who spoke on examination administration and result processing respectively.

practitioners.


