



285 Bag First Class as BUK Graduates 16,581

A total of 16,581 graduating students will be conferred with degrees and postgraduate degrees in Bayero University's combined 36th and 37th Convocation Ceremony scheduled to take place from Tuesday, 7th February 2023 to Saturday, 11th February, 2023.

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas who disclosed this on Thursday, 2nd February, 2023 at a Pre-Convocation Press Briefing held at the Council Chamber of the Abubakar Rasheed Senate Building.

He explained that during the combined Convocation, a total of 16,581 undergraduate students will be graduating out of which 285 students would be awarded with first class honours in various disciplines.

He further said 359 graduands would be conferred with PhDs while 5,936 will receive Master's Degree and 2,484 will receive Postgraduate Diploma, respectively.

The Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano, Prof Sagir Adamu Abbas, has expressed deep sorrow over the death of former Vice Chancellor of BUK, Prof Ibrahim H. Umar, who died on Monday, 30th January, 2023.

He described the late Prof. I. H. Umar as humble, simple and a complete gentleman, who served the university and his motherland diligently.

Speaking when he led management team to a condolence visit at the family house of the deceased, Prof Abbas said Nigeria had, indeed, lost another rare gem, whose contributions to national growth were enormous.

"He was an inspirational leader with the commitment and passion for national development and growth," the VC said.

He commiserated with members of his immediate family and members of the University community. He prayed Allah to grant him *Jannatul Firdaus* and the family to bear the irreparable loss.

During his tenure as Vice-Chancellor in BUK, the late Prof. I. H. Umar handled the second phase of the development of the new campus of the University.

The late Prof. Umar, who was the third Vice Chancellor of BUK, took over from Prof. JOC Ezeilo in 1979. During his tenure, he completed most of the initial buildings in the new campus, which included the administrative and academic buildings, students hostels, junior and senior staff quarters, access roads, among others. He completed

his tenure in 1986.

Prof. I. H Umar was so kind and committed to the development of the University in particular and the education sector in general.

He was a very humble, simple and God-fearing.

The Vice Chancellor prayed to Allah to grant Prof. Umar *Aljannatul Firdaus*.

The late Prof. Umar was born on 20th May, 1941. He was survived by one wife and four children.

In a similar condolence, the Executive Secretary of the National Universities Commission, Prof Abubakar Adamu Rasheed described the late Prof Ibrahim H Umar as one of the finest and incredible academics with the national interest at heart.

He said the late Prof Umar was among the founding fathers of Bayero University who laid the foundation of growth and development of the institution.

Also in his condolence message, the Registrar of JAMB Professor Is-haq Oloyede commiserated with the family of Prof I. H Umar, describing him as kind, God fearing and committed person.

ACEPHAP Introduces Breakfast Meeting with its Collaborative Faculty Staff

Africa Centre of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) has introduced what it called Breakfast Meeting with its collaborative Faculty staff where issues on research, training, conference attendance and other academic issues will be shared with a view to implementing the core mandates of the World Bank grants requirements.

Speaking at the maiden edition of the meeting which took place at ACEPHAP's head office located at the Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital (AKTH), the Director of the

Centre, Professor Hadiza Galadanci said the meeting was introduced to serve as an avenue where innovations by faculty staff would be shared and discussed with a view to getting collaboration with some of the centre's expertise for optimum execution.

Professor Galadanci explained that the breakfast meeting would be held quarterly, so that all the stakeholders in the centre's ACE project would have ample opportunities to share and discuss research and other academic innovations with a view to getting assistance in the implementation of their researches. 'We in the Centre are ready to offer

assistance. If you require any assistance in the successful conduct of your research, we are ready to support you,' she said.

She said for the purpose of today's meeting which was the maiden edition, the Centre would share with the faculty staff three important issues; the modest achievements of the centre since the commencement of the implementation of the World Bank ACE project in 2019, what the Centre did to the faculties and the opportunities available in the Centre for the faculty staff to exploit.

Professor Galadanci told the meeting that the Centre won a World Bank grant of six million Dollars to implement the ACE projects. She added that funds from the World Bank were not released to the Centre until late 2021. She said though the lack of funds did not stop the centre as support from the University Management ensured that implementation of the ACE project started almost immediately.

Professor Galadanci disclosed that as a first step the Centre introduced five postgraduate training programmes; M. Sc in Public Health Nutrition and Policy, M. Sc Global Health and Policy, M. Sc Maternal and Child Health and Policy, M. Sc Public Mental Health and Policy and M. Sc Public Health Nursing and Policy. She said at the moment the Centre has 110 MSc regional and national students. The regional students are from 10 African countries such as Kenya, Cameroun, Niger, Senegal etc.

In the area of research, the Centre is implementing different research project grants from donor agencies. Such Donor agencies include: Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, Nigeria's Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFUND) and World Health Organization. For example, the Centre had won E-MOTIVE Research Project Grants from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to conduct E-MOTIVE Trial in collaboration with University

of Birmingham, United Kingdom. It is being implemented in five countries of Nigeria, Kenya, Tanzania, South Africa, and Pakistan. She also mentioned IVON trial grant also from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation in collaboration with Lagos University Teaching Hospital, Nigeria, and the COGENOME Study obtained from 54Gene Corporation.

She listed the Sudden Cardiac Arrest Grant obtained through collaborative efforts with 5 other Universities in Nigeria as well as the IVON Postpartum trial project grant which she said was aimed at contributing to the reduction of the significant burden of maternal morbidity and mortality associated with anaemia in postpartum period. The Director revealed that the Centre had achieved 145 publications.

On collaborations, Professor Galadanci mentioned the centre's collaborations with seven Universities in Kenya, Jigawa State Government on maternal health and nutrition,

University Hospital Coventry, United Kingdom, Sheffield University, UK among other international and national collaborations.

On training, Professor Galadanci stated that the Centre had trained 1200 health workers and 364 people participated in its short courses. The Centre has also carried out training in Ghana and Kenya.

On the opportunities available at the Centre, the Deputy Director, Research, Professor Taiwo Amole spoke of two important grants being offered by the Centre to support faculty staff. She mentioned Travel grant and Seed grant. Travel grant is the support given to faculty for staff conference attendance and Seed grant is for research work. There was also capacity building training sponsorship. She advised faculty staff to take advantage of these grants.

Professor Amole also disclosed that the Centre was planning to move to digital education for all its Masters Degree programmes.

VC Inaugurates Reconstituted CDA International Scientific Advisory Board

He said CDA was recognized as one of the top performing centres in Africa and singled out the Director, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin as a gift to the centre and the university whom he described as an incredible leader. He also commended the vibrant team members who have been working round the clock to assist him.

The Chairman lauded other members of the board for accepting to serve and said that together they would work assiduously to accomplish the tasks and goals set aside.

In his remarks, the Director of the Centre, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin, briefed the board about CDA's evolution and how it got the World Bank grants and renewal of its ACE project as a result of excellent performances. He also told them about the international accreditation of CDA programmes, research projects, international, regional and local collaborations, as well as regional students admitted from 15 countries.

He said in the current ACE for Impact Project, World Bank made a mid-term evaluation in June last year and CDA scored 59% which was good and because of that the centre was penciled down for additional funds. He said the centre has done much more than that now because in the recent progress report towards impact assessment, the centre scored 5/5 and for its plans for entrepreneurship, the centre scored 30/30.

It is in the light of the above that we suggest that the University Senate should inform members of staff of the following:

1. All Deans of faculties should nominate one representative to the University ranking committee who will serve as facilitators for the member's visibility in the faculty.
2. Staff should open account with Google scholar and upload their publication
3. Staff member should adhere to best practice in teaching
4. Staff should be aggressive in craftsmanship sourcing through writing good proposals and effective management of existing grants.
5. Staff to publish their research in high impact journals and encourage postgraduate students to do same
6. All staff should cite relevant works from the University at the same time students should cite relevant works of their supervisors in all their publications.
7. All research centres and academic units should pursue the commercialization of their intellectual properties.
