# BUK Hosts Workshop on National Integration ...As Stakeholders Call for Change of Attitude Amongst Youth



meeting of stakeholders under the TETFund National Research Fund on inter-faith dialogue hosted by the Bayero University, Kano has called on the youth to imbibe the spirit of national integration and unity as a sure way of promoting peace and development in the country.

Speaking at the opening ceremony of the workshop, which took place at the conference hall of the Centre for Islamic Civilisation and Inter-faith Dialogue on Saturday, 4<sup>th</sup> February, 2023 the Principal Investigator in the program, Professor Muhammad Babangida Muhammad disclosed that the program was part of the initiative of the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) aimed at promoting national unity and cohesion for the overall development of the country.

Professor Babangida who is also the Director, BUK's Centre for Qur'anic Studies, said researchers from the universities in the six geo-political zones were drawn to coordinate the project with students from the two faiths of Part of the project would be to develop a curriculum on Islam and Christianity as target groups.

In Bayero University, 25 Muslim students and similar number from the Christian faith were selected as

participants of the workshop, urging them to promote peace, tolerance and understanding among themselves.

According to him, peace is the foundation of every development and this could only be achieved when there is tolerance and understanding. "In this case, I urge our teeming youth to develop nationalistic feelings in all your endeavours."

Professor Muhammad noted that regrettably, the youth who form the critical segment of the population of the country are not directly involved in inter-faith dialogue, a policy, which he said contributed in widening the lacuna in the quest for national integration and harmonious living.

Under the project, he further revealed, it was aimed at promoting as well as inculcating the importance of national integration among the students of tertiary institutions who would eventually be the leaders of tomorrow.

In his address, another co-investigator in the program, Professor Jacob Ayantayo of the Department of Religious Studies, University of Ibadan, explained that the workshop would reawaken the conscious of the students in the coloration between the different faiths so as to explore harmony and unity among the adherents of the two religion.

In addition, he said such a workshop would foster positive communication and promote intercultural learning among the teeming youths from diverse ethnicity and background.

As a human nature, we need one another and nobody can leave in isolation. We can leave interdependently. We discovered that some politicians and other ill-informed religious leaders use religion to divide us, we must put an end to this ugly development," said Ayantayo.

He submitted that for our country to grow and prosper in peace and harmony, the citizen must remove ignorance that has surrounded our religious practices and also, we must remove suspicion, mutual suspicion, fighting and bigotry.

In his presentation, titled *Religion, Ethnicity and National Integration* Dr. Sai'du Ahmad Dukawa the head of Department, Public Administration in Bayero University said the unity of the country is non-negotiable and the citizen must come together to work and live in harmony, trust and understanding in order for the country to grow.

According to him such workshop and dialogue would go a long way in putting the country in to the path of development and progress.

"The forum would raise awareness among the youths and educate them on inter-faith as well as intercultural dialogue in Nigeria," he also submitted.

> Statistics on global maternity deaths according to World Health Organisation (WHO), shows that Nigeria accounts for 20% of global maternal deaths. Despite some progress made during the last few years, maternal mortality rate in Nigeria is still as high as 821 per 100,000 live births while 1463 per

100,000 live birth is the case in Niger State.

Health and Education Status of Girls and Women in Niger State 2015 Assessment showed that in Niger State, 1 in every 95 women die during pregnancy and childbirth which translates to an annual estimate of 1,934 deaths from pregnancy-related complications.

It observed with concern that majority of these deaths occurred in rural areas which are in hard-to-reach communities due to the terrain of the state. There was evidenced low capacity among health care service providers at the primary health care level, especially in handling emergency cases as regards delivery.

It is against this background that Africa Center of Excellence for Population Health and Policy (ACEPHAP) Supported RAISE Foundation in building the capacity of health care service providers on Emergency Obstetric and Neonatal Care (EmONC) in Niger State.
