

NCRRD Holds 4th National **Conference on Children's Books and the Teaching of** Early Grade Reading in Nigeria

Development (NCRRD), Bayero University, Kano organized its 4th national conference on Children's Books and the Teaching of Early Grade Reading in Nigeria.

Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who declared the conference open on Wednesday, 4th October, 2023 at Dangote Business School, said the successes recorded during the previous conferences were inspiring, with hundreds of participants attending from all parts of the country and beyond. He said this year's conference is equally encouraging despite current economic challenges globally and Nigeria in particular.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Management Services, Professor Mahmoud Umar Sani, stated that the establishment of the Centre was made possible by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) in 2017 through a collaboration with Learning Systems Institute (LIS), Florida State University, Tallahasee and Bayero University, Kano.

igeria Centre for Reading, Research and pleasing the significant progress made after the collaboration ended with the various activities of the Centre such as the introduction of courses for the advancement of teaching and reading in Nigeria, by collaborating with Faculty of Education to train teachers handling early grade reading at postgraduate level and the short-term certificate courses" he said.

> The Vice Chancellor acknowledged the support of USAID for always supporting the conferences and commended the Universal Basic Education Commission for being a supportive stakeholder and committed in improving early grade reading in Nigeria.

> In her remark, the Director of the Centre, Professor Talatu Musa Garba said as part of its mandate, the Centre had instituted the annual conference in 2019 to provide a platform for teachers and other educationists to share ideas on the best practices for the promotion of teaching reading in Nigeria.

> She said the Centre focuses its attention on supporting teachers to revive the reading culture amongst students, poster literacy and academic achievements through its postgraduate diploma programme, a collaboration with the Faculty of Education, BUK.

Prof Garba noted that as a research-based Centre, the NCRRD has a number of ongoing collaborative researches with other experts, adding that the constitution of the fellows of the centre includes language educators with backgrounds in English, Hausa and Arabic.

"Therefore, we welcome more partnerships and research collaborations, so that together we shall promote the teaching of early grade reading in Nigeria," she said.

Presenting a keynote address titled: The Earlier the Better, Literacy and Transformative Impacts of Pedagogical Innovations and Research, Professor Graceful Onovughe Ofodu from Ekiti State University, said much needs to be done in Nigeria in terms of promoting reading culture. She said the earlier this is done the better, calling for the policy makers to provide an enabling environment especially at early grade literacy.

According to her, research has shown that the literacy level of Finland is amongst the highest globally with 50% of children before school that can read and write and that the

country has 93% of enrolment.

She advocated the need for the embracement of digital tools that will aid reading and learning among the pupils. She noted that the use of multi-media instructional approaches such as the application of games in teaching and learning and use of interactive e-books would significantly help students better.

The Vice Chancellor of Kaduna State University, Professor Abdullahi Ibrahim Musa, who presented a lead paper on Rethinking Digital Tools in Nigeria: A Philosophical Inquiry on Reading, said one of the great problems in education system in Nigeria is one-sized fit education curriculum without taking into cognizance the individual differences. He said Nigeria must use individualized or active learning system to thrive.

He advocated the need for policy makers to enforce the use of technological tools in the design of education curricula to make life easier for teaching and learning in schools.

He said the competition had stages which include intraregional, inter-regional and quarter final which took place at the University of Calabar and Bayero University respectively.

The grand finale took place at Nile University, Abuja on Sunday, 1^{st} October, 2023 in which he beat his opponent from University of Ilorin.

Following his victory, he was given a N500, 000 cash in addition to a one week expenses paid trip to Kenya, a plaque in addition to other amazing prizes from the competition partners as well as crowned as "The Keeper of African History 2023."

The winner who is from Nasarawa Local Government in Kano State, is also the President of BUK Branch of the Law Students Association of Nigeria. He told the Vice Chancellor that his passion about history made him to participate in the competition despite being a Law student.

He charged his fellow students to widen their horizon so as to be multi-disciplinarian, saying knowledge has no boundry and limitation.

He thanked the Vice Chancellor and management of the university as well as all the staff and lecturers of the Faculty of Law and Deanary of Student Affairs for their support and encouragement, without which he could not achieve the feat.

The Faculty of Clinical Sciences has organised a revision course and placement examination for about 100 transfer students from Sudanese universities.
