Civilization and Interfaith Dialogue (CICID) on whole Muslim community," the Governor said. Monday, 8th January, 2024 hosted its 2nd International Conference with the theme Islam and Violence: Facts and Fallacies, aimed at creating awareness to disassociate the religion of Islam with violence

Declaring the conference open, the Governor of Kano State, Engineer Abba Kabir Yusuf, explained that enemies of Islam were deliberately distorting the facts thereby describing Islam as a religion of violence and terrorism.

The Governor, who was represented by his Deputy, Comrade Aminu Abdulsalam Gwarzo, said Islam is peace and it preaches peaceful coexistence amongst mankind.

He frowned at why some people were hell bent on distorting the facts as it affect Islam, saying no religion on earth that cherishes and promotes peace as Islam, pointing out that the only way to correct the negative narrative is through such conferences frequently.

The Governor, who commended the University and the Centre for organizing the conference now, said it was timely and would go a long way in putting the facts straight. "People need to know the truth about Islam and it for Islamic Civilization and Interfaith Dialogue (CICID),

In his address, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, said the theme of the conference was apt, as it came at a better time when Islam is being battered as a religion of violence.

The Vice Chancellor, said as part of the policy of the university, issues such as this would be brought forward for deliberations so that the facts could be unravelled from the fallacies, saying those castigating Islam with negative trends are doing so with an ulterior motive.

He emphasized the importance of such conference, saying Islam is a religion of peace, justice and compassion. He pointed out that misinformation about Islam is perpetrated by those who seek narrow and distorted narrative.

The Vice Chancellor noted that there were misconceptions which have often been misreported in the media particularly from the western axis. He charged scholars to leverage their intellectual capacity to illuminate the true essence of Islam, separating facts from fallacies.

Earlier in his welcome address, the Director of the Centre

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Dr. Muhammad Sani Umar Rijiyar Lemo, pointed that the Also in his paper presentation, the Deputy Secretary conference was organized to correct the negative and distorted perceptions surrounding Islam in relation to violence.

According to him Islam is a religion of peace and not violence and anybody who preaches violence is not in representing the Muslims and/or practicing the true religion of Islam.

Dr. Rijiyar Lemo pointed out that the Holy Prophet Muhammad SAW had never promoted violence in all His teachings, saying that the meaning of Islam is peace and therefore, it is distortion of fact for someone to link Islam with violence.

The conference, which was the 2nd in the series, brought together scholars, religious leaders and policy makers from around the world. Over 100 papers were presented by scholars of diverse origin. It ended with a good note, stressing Islam as a peaceful and well-encompassing religion.

Keynote speaker, Dr. Seydou Madibaba Sylla, the Rector of Sahel University, Mali, who is also the President of African Council of Ulama, said Islam simply means peace in which it guarantees the protection of lives and property, thus making it a religion of peace and tranquility.

He described it as a campaign of calumny for anyone to link Islam with violence as no religion that talked seriously against in justice and degradation of humanity like Islam.

General of the Supreme Council for Islamic Affairs and also the Vice Chancellor of Al-Istigama University, Sumaila, Professor Salisu Shehu, said statistics of all the act of terrorism had shown that none Muslim groups have contributed more than 90 percent of all the atrocities against peace in the world.

He noted that the worst act of terrorism was the occupation of Palestinian land and continued killings of children and women by the Isra'eli government with support from America and its allies, the KKK group and other militant Christian groups across the world, saying Islam was never and will never be a threat to peace.

In his paper, the Imam of Al-Furgan Mosque, Dr Bashir Aliyu Umar, described those associating Islam with violence as enemies of religion. Quoting from verses of the Holy Qur'an and the teaching of the Holy Prophet Muhammad SAW, he debunked all the insinuations linking the religion with violence.

During the event, certificates of award were presented to distinguished dignitaries including the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University Kano, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas, the Rector of Sahel University, Dr. Seydou Madibaba Sylla, the Executive Secretary of National Universities Commission, Prof. Abubakar A. Rasheed, the Executive Governor of Kano State, Engr. Abba Kabir Yusuf, the Executive Governor of Jigawa State, Dr. Umar Namadi among others.

BUK Student Wins Global Gets \$14,000 Research Grant By Nura Garba

A PhD student of Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), the Climate, Food and Farming Global Research Alliance Rehema Mrutu has won a global award for contributing to Development (CLIFF-GRADS) award announced at the a sustainable future and will receive \$14,000 research COP28 in Dubai. grant.

Rehema Mrutu is a Tanzanian national pursuing a PhD in Natural Resource Management and Climate Change at the Centre of Dryland Agriculture at Bayero University Kano, Nigeria with research placement at Worcester Polytechnic Institute in United States of America (USA).

She was competitively selected as a winning candidate at



CLIFF-GRADS is a joint initiative of the Mitigate+: Research for Low Emissions Food Systems of the CGIAR and the Global Research Alliance on Agricultural Greenhouse Gases (GRA).

The award aims to advance one of the research objectives on developing cheap and efficient means to divert the key substrate "hydrogen" in methane production to acetic acid. These data are urgently needed for researchers to decide on which microorganisms in the rumen needs manipulation to both develop long term methane mitigations measures and ensure food security.

The award comes with a grant of USD 14,000 for a 6 months research stay at The University of Connecticut, Department of Molecular and Cell Biology in USA.

Rehema's research focus at the CDA is to help cows emit less greenhouse gases, (methane) while increasing meat and milk production. She is currently developing a CRISPR engineered strain of methane producing organism (methanogen) that subverts methane production for acetic acid generation, which is a by-product that can be used by the cow to improve meat and milk production.

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how many species of methanogens actually reside within the rumen. This is extremely useful in designing microbial based animal breeding mitigation strategies.

Rehema Mrutu seeks to achieve at the global arena with regard to climate sustainability and hopes to develop the spirit of collegiality and collaborations with scientist across disciplines.

Part of her research work is also to understand what and Last year, Rehema was nominated by the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA, Nigeria) to participate at a high-level meeting of African Centre of Excellence (ACE) at the World Bank headquarters, USA.

(IIIBF), Bayero University, Kano organized a three day programe on Professional Certificate in Islamic Banking and Finance from Thursday 11th January - 13th January at the Institute's Conference Room.

The participants were drawn from the Banking and Financial institutions including the Central Bank of Nigeria, Jaiz Bank, NEXIM and some other financial regulatory organizations.

The Director of the Institute, Prof. Usman Muhammad Shu'aib, in his opening remarks, welcomed all the participants and commended the University Management for its support.

He said the program was a professional one because it would run a module packaged to deal on Islamic Banking and Finance.

According to him alternative banking is a global trend now because the world had recently experienced economic down-turn as a result of interest based economic system and subscribers thought of the need to have alternative banking system such as Islamic Banking.

According to Professor Usman Shu'aib, Islamic Banking is based on non-interest because interest which is otherwise known as riba, which is detested by shari'a and that the Qur'an said that whoever eats interest is like declaring war against Allah SWT.

He pointed out that Islamic finance has components such as Islamic Investment Vehicles where subscribers will have rejuvenated activities that will generate profit. He said another aspect is takaful which is also known as Islamic insurance which will enable people to come together to help each other in the act of piety and righteousness.

Prof. Usman further explained that Sukuk is another aspect which is an Islamic Capital market run on bonds, Treasury bills and other bonds of the Federal Government where people will collectively subscribe to a fund which will be incorporated as special purpose vehicle, in which properties either from the Federal Government, State Government or even private individuals will be taken over and subscribers will purchase the property for certain period of time and the owner will be given rent which will be leased back to the owner.

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas in his address welcomed participants and congratulated the

International Institute of Islamic Banking and Finance Institute as one of the best of its kind in the whole of West Africa.

> The University Librarian, Dr. Kabiru Dahiru Abbas, who represented the Vice Chancellor, said Islamic finance has become a global trend which is timely and its importance cannot be over emphasized and as a result a lot of people are participating actively in Islamic Banking practices.


