- 5. Go to the portal and Add or Drop your second semester course(s).

The Deanery of Student Affairs, Bayero University, Kano organized a sensitization lecture for Students Union Government's Election on Wednesday, 7th February, 2024.

The Dean of Student Affairs, Professor Shamsuddeen Umar, said as the tradition of the Deanery, whenever Students' Union Government's election approaches, the deanery invites the Caretaker Committee and other aspirants contesting for different positions to educate and advise them on the do's and don'ts regarding the election process.



Prof. Umar explained that the University prohibited pasting of banners on the walls of its buildings. He advised them to shun propaganda and desist from bringing external influence into the campuses.

He cautioned the contestants that at one time the University had suspended aspirants for associating themselves with external forces.

He defined 'external forces' as politicians outside the University.

The Dean called the attention of the aspirants to use the notice boards in pasting their posters.

He added that the University had no any influence on any candidate. He prayed for a free, fair and credible election.

Also speaking, the Deputy Dean (female), Dr. Maryam Liman informed the aspirants that election is not a do or die affair. She said election would pass and life would continue even after the university.

She charged the students to be responsible and cautioned the aspirants who aimed to use their position after election to embezzle students' funds that the Deanery of Student Affairs would not tolerate any misappropriation.

She said "the Dean has an eagle eye" that he scrutinises all the budgets that pass his table from the union.

In her remark, the Deputy Registrar and Administrative Secretary of the Deanery, Hajiya Halima O. Zubair, wished the aspirants all the best in the conduct of the election.

In remar, the Principal Assistant Registrar, Hajiya Habiba O. Salihu called the attention of the aspirants to be united, maintain good rapport with one another and take their studies seriously.

Also speaking, the Chairman, Bayero University, Kano Independent Electoral Committee (BUKIEKO), Comrade Farouq Muhammad Saleh, informed the gathering that all arrangements had been concluded regarding the SUG election.

Responding to some questions raised by aspirants, the Returning Officer of the BUKIEKO, Comrade Mubarak Adam Saleh, explained that the election would be conducted through e-voting and the Deanery of Student Affairs had already updated website for the election. He added that One Time Passwords (OTP's) would be sent through voters' phone numbers, e-mail or whatsApp.

He said committees were set up to go round and check for authenticity and possible forgery regarding certificates, CGPA, and other election credentials forwarded by the contestants.

He assured that free, fair and credible election would be conducted by BUKIECO.

Education, the guidelines for accessing the TETFund Scholarship for Academic Staff intervention have been reviewed and the following category of staff and disciplines have been included.



 - 3. There will be an upward review of the upkeep and other allowances for foreign scholars in line with the current economic realities effective from January 2024.


Submission of Unserviceable Equipment. Waste Papers and other Unserviceable Items


