The research is a collaborative project by CDA, University of Reading, U.K, the International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT) and Tazij Nigeria Limited, funded by the GCRF AgriFood Africa Innovation Awards Round 6.

Briefing journalists on the outcome of the research, the Director, Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin, said the research was aimed at promoting indigenous food as it relates to many of its impacts in the healthy living of individuals. He added that the nutrient-rich grain would promote food security in the country.

According to Professor Jibrin, "Sorghum is rich in vitamins, minerals, dietary fibre and anti-oxidant which helps in the natural cure of diabetes, lowering cholesterol, desist from consuming hybrid food, because it could result and boosting energy.

he Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) has "Sorghum also contains iron, magnesium and copper which help in blood circulation to prevent anaemia", he

The CDA Director said the research, funded by GCRF Agrifood Africa Innovation Awards Round 6, was initiated The new improved sorghum flour is good for diabetic to address grassroots challenges confronting sorghum cultivation as well as to reduce the importation of the grain.

> The lead Researcher, CDA, Dr Hakeem Ajeigbe, said the advocacy on sorghum production and consumption would increase economic prosperity and address challenges in food processing, distribution and storage.

> He said the research focused on ways to improve the availability and accessibility of safe, healthy, nutritious and sustainable local food.

> Earlier, the Head of Department, Food Science and Technology, BUK, Dr Hauwa Ladi-Yusuf, said composite sorghum flour with soya beans and small cassava, targets all age groups, especially diabetic patients.

Professor Galadanci promised to continue with the celebratory luncheon/award as a deliberate effort to instigate dedication, commitment and competition among staff of the center.

The NNOM Award

I. The Nigerian National Order of Merit (NNOM) is an i. "Order of Dignity" and distinct from the National Honours. It was instituted to accord proper and due ii. recognition for outstanding intellectual and academic attainments and contributions to the general development of Nigeria. The President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria is required by law (NNMA Act Section 8) to confer the NNOM Award annually, on the recipient(s), on the first Thursday in the month of December. The objective of the Award is to stimulate and reward excellence in Science, Engineering/Technology, Medicine, Humanities, Art

and Culture and other fields of human endeavor.

- - a. Use the designation Nigeria National Order of Merit (NNOM) after his/her name;
 - b. Receive a Cash Prize, a Certificate and a Medal;
 - c. Such other privileges as are enjoyed by recipients of high levels of national awards and honours.

ELIGIBILITY

- The Award is open to all citizens of Nigeria at home and abroad.
- Any Nigerian citizen of outstanding merit can be nominated by one or more Nigerian citizens. Any person may by himself/herself, where not sponsored by another person, apply to the Board for this purpose. Where two or more Nigerians are collaborating on any deserving undertaking, they can be similarly nominated for a joint Award.
