BUK Launches Campus Shuttle Service

Bayero University, Kano (BUK), has officially launched commuting within the university. The initiative aligns with its own campus shuttle service, featuring tricycles the university's commitment to creating a secure and (popularly known as Keke Napep) to enhance transportation within it's campuses.

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas who inaugurated the service in a brief ceremony on Wednesday, 2nd April, 2025, emphasizing the university's commitment to improving security and efficiency in campus mobility.

The newly introduced shuttle service will operate strictly within BUK campuses, running daily from 7:00 AM to 9:00 PM. The fare structure remains unchanged, ensuring affordability for students and staff.

Prof. Abbas highlighted the need for a university-managed transportation system, citing security concerns and the need for a more organized and efficient service. He assured the university community that the initiative would expand progressively.

He further urged the tricycle operators to adhere to safety regulations, avoid overloading, and handle the vehicles with care to ensure durability and smooth operations.

The introduction of the BUK Campus Shuttle is expected to particularly benefit "female staff and students", providing them with a safer and more reliable means of

inclusive learning environment.

The launch of the tricycle transportation system marks a significant step towards enhancing mobility within the university, offering students and staff a safer, structured, and efficient mode of transport.

Renowned sports administrator and scholar, Professor Lawal Yazid Ibrahim, has emphasized the role of sports in promoting longevity and wellbeing.

Delivering the 54th Professorial Inaugural Lecture titled "Sport is War; War is Sport: Ethical and Integrity Concerns" on March 27, 2025, at the Convocation Arena, New Campus, Professor Yazid traced the evolution of sports from a simple physical activity to a structured exercise that enhances fitness and overall health.

He classified sports based on aggression levels, differentiating between naturally aggressive sports like boxing and karate and behaviorally aggressive sports such as rugby and American football.

Professor Yazid also explored the etymology of the word "war," drawing connections between sportsmanship and military strategy.

The Vice-Chancellor, represented by Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academics) Professor Haruna Musa, fsi, commended the lecturer and encouraged other academic staff to engage in inaugural lectures as a testament to their research contributions.

Applications for 2024/2025 session admission into Remedial Science Program is now open

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants with SSCE O-level result or its equivalent are eligible to apply when they have: a) minimum of FIVE O-level credits in relevant science subjects including English and Mathematics in not more than two sittings.

b) minimum of THREE O-level credits but must remedy the deficient credits before absorption into a degree program.

ABSORPTION REQUIREMENTS

Admitted candidates who passed the remedial program, possess FIVE O-level credits including Mathematics and English and obtain the BUK minimum UTME points shall be absorbed into a degree program. Candidates who passed the remedial program but missed the minimum UTME score could also be absorbed subject to waiver from JAMB.

VALIDITY OF THE RESULT

The result of the Remedial Program shall be valid for two admission sessions for candidates who successfully passed the program but could not satisfy the O-level credits or university's UTME requirements. NATURE OF THE REMEDIAL PROGRAM

The program is for one academic session only and will be free of any interruption.

COMMENCEMENT

The program is to commence in 2024/2025 session (May, 2025) and successful candidates who satisfied all the requirements will be eligible for admission into a degree program in the following (2025/2026) session.

FEES

Application:Five thousand naira only $(\mathbb{H}^5,000.00)$ for accessing the online application.

Acceptance: Two thousand naira only (H2,000.00) for admitted applicants.

Registration: Sixty thousand naira only (N60,000.00) for Nigerians.
