BUK's Registry ICT Centre Trains Deputy Registrars on Cybercrime, Artificial Intelligence

The Registry Information and Communication Technology Centre (ICT), Bayero University, Kano held a one-day training for Deputy Registrars with the theme **“Building a Secure and Intelligent University Workplace: The Role of Cyber Security and Artificial Intelligence”**

The Workshop took place on Monday 15th June, 2026 at the Registry ICT Centre, 4th Floor, Abubakar Rasheed, Senate Building, BUK New Campus. The training aimed at improving the efficiency and productivity of Deputy Registrars on digital system with particular approach to Troubleshooting, Cyber Security and Artificial Intelligence for proper management of sensitive information in the University system.

In his remarks, the Registrar, Malam Haruna Aliyu, who was represented by the Acting Director, Directorate of General Administration, Comrade Mustapha Aminu, noted that the theme of the workshop was apt and timely, considering the unprecedented changes in the digital world. He described the roles of DR in the University setting as very critical that required them to be digitally literate.

The outreach programme brought together University Management officials, students, Deans of Students Affairs from the three beneficiary institutions, government representatives and other stakeholders. It served as a platform for sensitizing students on key Federal Government initiatives designed to improve access to education, ease transportation difficulties and expand opportunities for young Nigerians.

In his remarks, the NPCO Coordinator, Dr. Shamsuddeen Ahmad explained that the programme was designed to demonstrate the practical benefits of democracy through initiatives that directly impact the lives of citizens. According to him, democracy became meaningful when governance translate into tangible benefits and improved living conditions for the people.

The Coordinator highlighted the achievements of the Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND), describing it as one of the Federal Government's most significant interventions in the education sector. He noted that the scheme had continued to provide financial assistance to students in public tertiary institutions, ensuring that financial constraints did not prevent qualified Nigerians from accessing higher education.

A representative of the Managing Director of NELFUND, Lami Suwaid, also enlightened students on the loan application process and encouraged eligible students to take advantage of the programme. She explained that the scheme provided support for tuition and student upkeep, thereby reducing the financial burden on students and their families.

He referred the training as a great milestone achieved within a short possible time. He congratulated the

participants for the opportunity to participate in the training. He also expressed happiness for their active participation and charged them to apply the knowledge acquired wisely in their respective jobs.

In his remarks, the Coordinator of the programme, Malam Abubakar Usman Kafin Soli, noted that technology drove almost every aspect of our personal and professional lives. He described the university system as an institution which depended largely on digital system for students' registration, staff records, research activities, financial transactions, communication and digital learning, among others.

He noted that these technologies had improved efficiency and productivity and made it possible for cyber-criminals to exploit its vulnerabilities and compromise sensitive information that the training intended to showcase.

Mal. Kafinsoli noted that the fifteen (15) participants on the rank of Deputy Registrars were deliberately selected across the departments and units of the University for their importance to participate in the training after they concluded training for Senior Assistant Registrars on general computer knowledge.

Earlier, the Head of Training Unit, Hajiya Aishatu Dahiru,

extended her warm appreciation to the Registrar for his continued support on training matters. She also thanked the facilitators for their invaluable contributions towards the success of the training and urged the participants to always feel free to contact the facilitators on areas that might need clarification or further guidance for the smooth conduct of their career activities.

The programme which commenced on Monday 18th May, 2026 was successfully concluded on Thursday 11th June, 2026.

Speaking at the closing ceremony, the training facilitator, Malam Abubakar Kafinsoli, said the training was initiated by the Registrar to support the digitization of Registry operations and equip staff with the skills required in the present technology driven university environment.

He explained that the program combined theoretical and practical sessions in the registry computer laboratory,

which contributed to its effectiveness. According to him, certificates would be issued to the participants who met attendance requirements.

Kafinsoli noted that the training covered office productivity skills, digital record management, financial transaction process, artificial intelligence applications and cyber security awareness aimed at protecting sensitive university and personal data. He said public speaking was also included to enhance the communication skills of staff members, most especially those representing the university at departmental and faculty meetings.

The Registrar, Dr. Haruna Aliyu, who was represented by the Ag. Director, General Administration, Malam Mustapha Aminu, commended the resource person for his dedication and hard work throughout the program.

He described the training as part of the university's commitment for continuous staff development, emphasizing that it would contribute to the ongoing digitization efforts and support career progression opportunities for staff.

The Head of Training Unit, Hajiya Aisha Dahiru, expressed gratitude to the Registrar, Dr. Haruna Aliyu, for his continuous support and guidance and the facilitator for his patience and the participants for their commitment. She urged them to put to practice the knowledge they learnt to enhance performance.

Nigeria's Leadership Crisis can only be Reversed if the Nation's Youth Learn from the Experiences and Wisdom of Older Generations – Gidado Mukhtar

Insecurity, poverty, unemployment, declining educational standards and the erosion of moral values were identified as some of the key challenges hindering the progress of Northern Nigeria.

This observation was made by an erudite scholar, Dr. Akilu Sani Indabawa while delivering the keynote lecture to mark the 2026 Nigeria's Democracy Day with the topic: Nigeria at Crossroads: Charting Democratic Pathways to Transformation.

The lecture was organized by the Aminu Kano Center for Democratic Studies, Mambayya House in collaboration with the Society for Democratic Studies and Civic Awareness (SEDSAC) and the Northern Reform Organization (NRO) on Friday, June, 12th 2026. It was aimed at stimulating informed debate, generate actionable policy ideas and foster a collective vision for recovery and development in Northern Nigeria.

Dr. Indabawa, noted that while democracy had the potential to provide solutions to these challenges, many citizens still perceived it merely as a process of voting during elections rather than a system that required active participation, accountability and respect for the rule of law.

He described democracy as a culture and way of life that promotes dialogue, inclusiveness, protection of rights and citizen engagement in governance. He emphasized that meaningful transformation in Northern Nigeria would only be achieved when democratic principles were fully understood and practiced by both leaders and citizens.

While discussing the lecture, Dr. Aminu Isma'il Sagagi, of the Department of Islamic Studies, Bayero University Kano, argued that Northern Nigeria's challenges were fundamentally rooted in poor leadership. He maintained that the solutions to many of the region's problems had already been identified, but implementation remained the major obstacle. According to him, the North required competent and responsible leadership, either through the emergence of capable leaders or through positive reforms by those currently in positions of authority. He further questioned whether successive political transitions in Nigeria had truly delivered the progress and development citizens had anticipated.

Also contributing, Alhaji Hamisu Isa Sharifai, Chairman of the Hausa Education and Cultural Foundation (GIDAH), emphasized the importance of civic and democratic education in strengthening democratic governance. He urged citizens to understand their rights and actively engage with leaders on issues affecting their

communities. According to him, public silence in the face of poor governance contributes to persistent challenges, including insecurity and citizens must consistently make their voices heard on matters that affect their lives.

In his address, the Chairman of the occasion and Chairman of the Northern Reform Organization, Alhaji Gidado Mukhtar, urged young Nigerians to learn from the experiences and wisdom of older generations. He stressed the importance of reflecting on the significance of June 12 and evaluating the impact of democratic governance on the lives of Nigerians.

According to him, democracy should be continuously assessed to determine whether it was delivering the expected benefits and whether reforms were needed to strengthen governance and national development.

Earlier, in his welcome address, the Director of Mambayya House, Professor Habu Mohammed, said the gathering provided an opportunity to reflect on the condition of Northern Nigeria since the return to democratic governance. He noted that the annual programme, usually organized in collaboration with SEDSAC, was expanded this year to include the Northern Reform Organization in view of the challenges facing the region.

Professor Habu expressed appreciation to the Chairman of the occasion, Alhaji Gidado Mukhtar, and the keynote speaker, Dr. Akilu Sani Indabawa, for supporting efforts aimed at promoting dialogue and generating solutions to the North's developmental concerns.

The lecture attracted academics, policymakers, civil society organizations, students and community leaders who deliberated on strategies for leveraging democratic governance to address the region's challenges and accelerate development.

ODORBN Commends BUK On Optometry Programme Improvements

The Optometrists and Dispensing Opticians Registration Board of Nigeria (ODORBN), has commended Bayero University Kano (BUK) for the significant progress made in addressing gaps identified during a previous accreditation exercise in its Optometry programme.

The commendation came during a courtesy visit by a delegation from the Board to the Vice-Chancellor of Bayero University Kano, Professor Haruna Musa, *FSI*, on Thursday, June 18, 2026. The visit followed a monitoring exercise conducted at the Department of Optometry on June 17 and provided an opportunity for the team to brief the University Management on its observations, findings and recommendations.

Speaking during the visit, the team leader, Dr. Daniel Wauma, who represented the Registrar and Chief Executive Officer of the Optometrists and Dispensing Opticians Registration Board of Nigeria, Dr. Obinna Edwin, commended Bayero University Kano for addressing the six gaps identified during the previous accreditation exercise.

Opticians Registration Board of Nigeria for formal documentation and follow-up actions.

Responding, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Haruna Musa, *FSI*, expressed appreciation to the Board for its continued support and guidance. He celebrated the achievements of graduates of the programme, noting that three graduates recently excelled in professional assessments, with one of them appointed as the zonal head of the Board in the North-East zone.

Professor Haruna also disclosed that the university recorded a 95 per cent success rate, attributing the achievement to the collective efforts of staff and students. He reaffirmed the institution's commitment to addressing all observations raised by the accreditation monitoring panel and ensuring that the remaining gaps were fully resolved.

The Vice-Chancellor further revealed that the university had already addressed four of the six gaps previously identified and was taking steps to process recommendations for the recruitment of additional

He highlighted key achievements to include the development of a robust student handbook, alignment of the programme with the National Universities Commission (NUC), Core Curriculum and Minimum Academic Standards (CCMAS) and the recruitment of six additional lecturers.

Dr. Wauma recommended the immediate equipping of the newly approved satellite clinic to make it fully functional for student training and practical sessions. He also advised the university to procure a departmental bus to facilitate the transportation of students to the satellite clinic.

The team leader further recommended the procurement of instruments and consumables for the department's specialty clinics, alongside the establishment of a sustainable system for replenishing consumables used by students. He added that the accreditation monitoring report would be presented to the Optometry and Dispensing

teaching staff for the Optometry programme. He added that efforts were underway to equip the satellite clinic to serve both as a training facility for students and a service centre for the wider community.

Professor Haruna disclosed that the university had recently disbursed N130 million to departments for the procurement of consumables and expressed readiness to repeat the intervention within the current academic session. He also indicated that the university would explore the use of internally generated revenue to procure critical instruments required by the programme.

The Vice-Chancellor extended the university's regards to the Registrar and Chief Executive Officer of the Board, Dr. Obinna Edwin and reaffirmed Bayero University's readiness to strengthen collaboration with the Board in advancing optometry education and professional practice in Nigeria.

METHOD OF APPLICATION

- Step 1: Login** - At the homepage of the Bayero University website www.buk.edu.ng click on 2026 UTME ONLINE SCREENING EXERCISE
- Step 2: Profile Update** - UTME candidates can login using UTME Registration Number as username and UTME aggregate score as password to login. You should then fill-in the provided form noting that the photograph uploaded from JAMB will be the only valid ID for all admitted candidates throughout their stay in Bayero University, Kano.
- Step 3: Generation of BUK PPI** – Generate and download your Personalised Payment Invoice (PPI). The invoice will come with Remita Retrieval Reference (RRR) for the sum of ₦2,000.00 being cost of screening. Applicants have an option of paying online using Credit/Debit Card, Internet Banking, or printing the invoice and using it to pay at any Commercial Bank nationwide. Note that after successful online payment, acknowledgement slip can instantly be generated and printed. In case of bank payment, the payment has to be processed by the candidate using the provided “check your payment” button on the site, before acknowledgement card can be printed.

Candidates are advised to visit any JAMB Office or Accredited CBT Centre nearest to them to upload their ‘O’ Level result(s) (WAEC, NECO, NABTEB, NBAIS or equivalent) on JAMB Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS).
